U. S. Farmer Plight Placed Upon Benson

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Rep. James L. Whitten, D. Miss., said today farmers are in a "plight" because Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson has failed to unload farm surpluses abroad. Republicans replied that Whitten and other Democrats are being unjustly to blame Benson for farm surpluses piled up under the old Democratic farm program. The farm exchanges came as the house prepared to debate a \$278,025,331 bill to finance the agriculture department in the year starting July 1. The bill carries only 17 million dollars less than the administration requested.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WINTERIG POT SHOTS

WASHINGTON—Why did FDR grant so many treaty concessions to Russia? Why did he allow the secret military advisers that Russian reinforcement was not needed to defeat an already shattered Japan?

Why did Harry Truman order atomic bombing of Japan, when the American government had already intercepted Tokyo's frantic pleas for peace on any terms except "unconditional surrender"?

EXPLANATIONS?—These are the most important questions raised by publication of the Yalta papers, and the closing acts of the World War II drama. It is probable that they will give us never answered satisfactorily, although there have been capital hill suggestions that they require detailed investigation.

Several explanations may be offered. Franklin D. Roosevelt may never have seen the report that Japan could have been conquered by an atomic attack without actual invasion of the islands. Or he may have placed greater faith in Gen. George C. Marshall's judgment than in that of his other top advisers, who were closer to the scenes of battle.

RUSSIAN INTERVENTION—Marshall, and Dean Acheson, the architect of the Yalta pact, were high-level aides who insisted that Russia's entry into the Japanese war was necessary. Otherwise, they envisaged another month of fighting, with American troops in a position more favorable to the group which thought that naval and aerial bombardment and strangulation were sufficient for the job. Acheson, William C. Leahy, then White House chief of staff, Adm. Ernest J. King, then chief of naval operations; Gen. Douglas MacArthur, then in command of the Pacific fleet, and Chester W. Nimitz, commander of the Pacific fleet, in post-war books and public statements, they have testified that they were not in favor of Russian intervention, and without causing the eventual loss of China, North Korea and part of Indochina to the communists.

DROPPING OF FIRST A-BOMB—As for Truman's inauguration of atomic warfare at a time when the Russian Revolution was still in its infancy, details are revealed for the first time in a book entitled, "Japan's Decision to Surrender." It was written by Robert C. Gilpin, a former member of the Roosevelt administration, a leading center of historical study.

The earlier version had been that Japan's leaders asked Stalin to begin peace negotiations with us in the Pacific. He refused, and then, on August 8, 1945, he helped against the Japanese, it has been charged that the Russian dictator withheld this information from the American government. It is now clear that he could collect on his China bargain. Russia attacked only five days before Japan's collapse and surrender.

INTERPRETED JAP PLEA—However, according to Washington Bureau research, the code breakers at Washington first listened to the Japanese messages to Moscow. He says that early in July, a month before the first A-bomb was dropped, the American government interpreted the dispatch from the Japanese minister at Tokyo to the Japanese ambassador at Moscow.

Ed note: Conveying the message to the American government was not a matter of official record. It is the good fortune of peace. Endeavor to obtain the good offices of the Soviet union in ending the war short of unconditional Japanese surrender.

Some Types of Atomic Fallout Can Kill
But Most of It Is Completely Harmless

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—A businesswoman complained that fallout from atomic weapons tests in Nevada was making her sick. A taxi driver said his tires were getting sticky from radioactivity. Moscow blamed "brughta" in Russia on atomic fallout from America.

Fallout didn't do any of these things. But such complaints are an indication of how the menace of fallout—a deadly by-product of nuclear explosions—is concerning people here and abroad.

There's no secret about what atomic fallout is, and there is a certain amount of information available about what it does.

Atomic fallout might be compared with soot from a hot furnace being drawn up a chimney. Somewhere the soot has to come down.

By the time soot settles to earth it has cooled off so much that about the only damage it can do is smudge or wash drying on the fire.

But if a heavy clinder is sucked up through a chimney it can cause real trouble. It may fall back to earth while it is still hot—and start a fire.

It is about the same with fallout. Dust which is sucked into an atomic explosion gets "hot"—or

New House Can Be Assembled in Six Hours

Construction Cost Saving Is Noted in Prefabricated Home

Magic Valley residents who are toying with the idea of buying their own home, will be introduced this week to an idea in the construction industry guaranteeing them a minimum of \$500 off the price for a conventional three-bedroom, 1,000-square-foot house.

The prefabricated house, which actually is a panel truss type of structure and in many ways different from the well-known prefabricated type of home, is being brought to Magic Valley by Volvo Cinder Products company, Twin Falls and Jerome.

Victor Camozzi, general manager of the company's Jerome plant, stresses that the firm's goal is to cut the cost of building homes. "Labor cost and the price of materials are more or less stationary items and they cannot be cut," he points out. "We feel we can construct a less expensive home, however, through a more alert coordination between the use of necessary materials and the labor that goes into the erection of a home. This new type of home is constructed with a negligible loss of materials which in the conventional home is one of the major sources of waste," Camozzi says.

To prove its point, the company put up one of its houses a pilot model, for public inspection in Jerome. "This house not only will attract interested residents an opportunity to see what we have to offer but it gives us a basis upon which we can determine cost and time of construction," Camozzi explains.

Actually, the house has become quite a point of attraction in Jerome. One day last week motorists driving to work down Main street saw an empty lot across the street from the Volvo plant. When they returned home in the late afternoon there was a completed house.

Explaining the speed with which the three-bedroom house was erected, Camozzi says two men working at a normal pace completed the job, which included erection of walls and roofing and laying floors, in six hours.

Although tabulations of final cost for the structure still are being worked out, Camozzi estimated the house which features 1,000 square feet of floor space, will cost approximately \$7,500. "This should mean a saving of \$500 or 60 cents per foot over the conventional type home," he states.

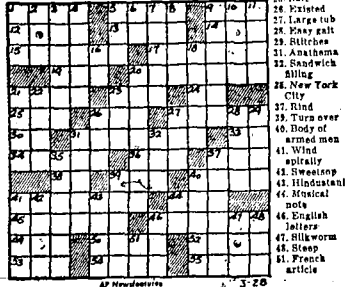

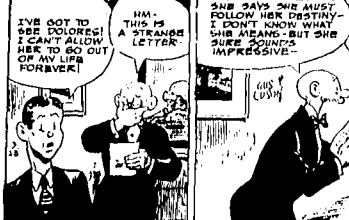

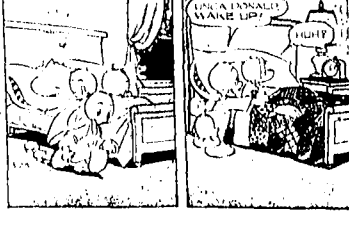

Anti-Ike GOPs Begin Drive To Regain Control of Party

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Anti-Eisenhower Republicans served notice today that they will attempt to return control of the GOP to the conservatives.

At the same time, Leonard W. Hall, GOP national chairman, who said he assumes Mr. Eisenhower will be the 1956 Republican presidential candidate, released the names of key "we like Ike" convention committee appointments last night.

The drive to capture control of the 1956 convention by the Republican right wing was announced last night from the headquarters of the Abraham Lincoln club in Chicago.

Edgar C. Bundy, president of the club, said he is counting on the support of Sen. William F. Knowland, R., Calif., Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy, R., Wis., Styles Bridges, R., N. H., John W. Bricker, R., O., William F. Jenner, R., Ind., and Herman Welker, R., Ida.

Knowland said on a television program that the Republicans could win in 1956 without President Eisenhower. Bridges on another program said he thinks Mr. Eisenhower will seek reelection but also agreed the Republicans could win without him.

Knowland, considered a possible "dark horse" contender for the presidential nomination, dodged an answer on that subject. He said that was what the late President Roosevelt used to call "a very iffy" question.

"As the President himself has pointed out," Knowland said, "what Republicans maintained during 20 years of the Roosevelt administration, there is no indispensable man, and I don't believe in the doctrine of the indispensable man."
