WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—President Eisenhower believes Red China is prepared to cause any major trouble in the weeks just ahead. The president said today that a Red Chinese attack would not start until the Nationalist-held islands of Quemoy and Matsu are taken. He has rejected this estimate made by some military sources, reported from during the week-end. Information reaching the president indicates Red China is preparing to pull out of the islands and support an amphibious landing on the mainland. Two Atomic Bombs Tear Nevada's Sky In AEC's Testings

LAS VEGAS, Nev., March 29 (AP)—Two atomic bombs were exploded in a single day today for the first time in Nevada test history—one a whopper so powerful it split a ceiling 75 miles away, the other a "baby" air-burst of an undisclosed secret weapon in America's expanding nuclear arsenal. The first atomic energy commission triggered in the pre-dawn darkness the mightiest blast of the 1955 testing, estimated at 15 megatons. The fiftieth of 25,000 tons of TNT, the kick of the bombs that leveled Hiroshima and Nagasaki. It was noticeably felt over a 150-mile radius in the western states, as the AEC reported.

Mock H-Bomb Attack Planned for 50 Cities

WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—A mock hydrogen bomb attack on 50 U. S. cities will cost thousands, including the President, seeking shelter in a nationwide civil defense test June 15-16. During the test 15,000 federal employees will be evacuated from the nation's capital. They will be evacuated from secret headquarters in a half dozen states from 35 to 200 miles from Washington. The White House said the test would be a complete success.

Death Claims Valley Settler At Age of 82

RUPERT, March 29—William W. Pettinger, 82, the seventh homesteader to settle in the area, died today at 5 a. m. Tuesday at the Rupert general hospital following a long illness. Mr. Pettinger was born July 7, 1872, at Minneapolis, Minn., and prior to moving to Idaho in 1890 he lived in Tennessee, Missouri and Iowa. When he first came to Idaho he worked as an overseer on a cattle ranch near Pocatello. He was a member of the Paul school board.

Youth Caught By Science In Theft Mystery

SHOSHONE, March 29—Science trapped a 17-year-old youth here following a preliminary hearing Monday before Justice of the Peace Charles E. Peterson. The youth is being held for district court action on a charge of burglary. The youth was caught while attempting to steal a television set from a home in town. The police were alerted by a neighbor who saw the youth running away with the television set.

Prison Revolt Continues for Hungry Men

LINCOLN, Neb., March 29 (AP)—A prisoner revolt at Nebraska's state penitentiary went into its third day today with pressure mounting on the inmates to surrender themselves and two captives guards. More than 40 hours had passed since the inmates rebelled at their last meal. The revolt is being led by a group of prisoners who are demanding better food and living conditions. The prison authorities are trying to negotiate with the prisoners.

Runaway C-46 Smacks Craft, Kills Teacher

GREENVILLE, Miss., March 29 (AP)—A C-46 transport plane smashed a jet trainer in place today, killing a flight instructor, then crashing in flames into a snack building at a jet trainer base here. The accident occurred at 10:30 p.m. on Monday. The C-46 was flying low over the base when it struck the jet trainer. The jet trainer was a new model and was being used for training pilots. The instructor was killed instantly.

Smylie May Attend Hearing on Plan to Cut Air Service to T. F.

BOISE, March 29 (AP)—Alyce Smylie, Twin Falls resident, is expected to attend a hearing on the proposed plan to cut air service to Twin Falls. The hearing will be held in Boise on April 1. The plan is to discontinue the air service to Twin Falls because of the high cost of maintaining the route. The airline company is arguing that the route is not profitable.

Bull Man Faces Charge in Court

BOISE, March 29 (AP)—The state advertising commission postponed a decision yesterday on whether to pass a new rule that would require Idaho potato growers and handlers to stamp their sacks and packages with "Grown and Packed in Idaho."

The so-called "branding" regulation has been proposed by some as a means of stimulating sales of Idaho spuds in the national market.

State Agriculture Commissioner Harold West said commission members would hold meetings in various growing areas to gather sentiment about the matter.

It will be taken up again at the commission's next meeting in Boise April 18.

Advantages of Armed Forces Nursing Posts Outlined for Local Clubwomen

Private bedroom, living room and bath, maid service, high salaries and the chance to meet droves of men are some of the advantages of joining the nurse corps of the armed forces. These and many other advantages assigned to appeal to every feminine heart belong to the young women volunteering for the army, navy or air force nurse corps. Three attractive registered nurses told members of the Republican Women's club Monday.

Major Rosenberger also described a new atom-powered X-ray machine weighing 48 pounds which the army has designed for battlefield use. Plans can be developed in five minutes. Lieutenant Gilmore said in her talks that four per cent of navy nurses in active duty are taking post-graduate training. Among the nursing courses for which they are eligible are psychiatry, administration, operating room procedure, pediatrics and obstetrics. 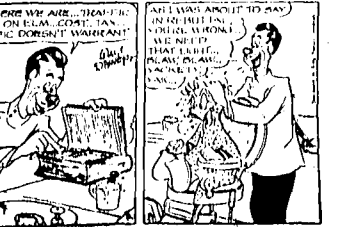

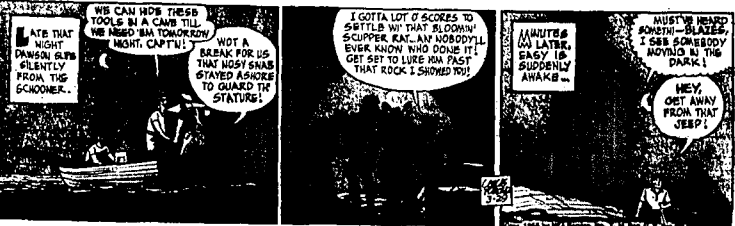
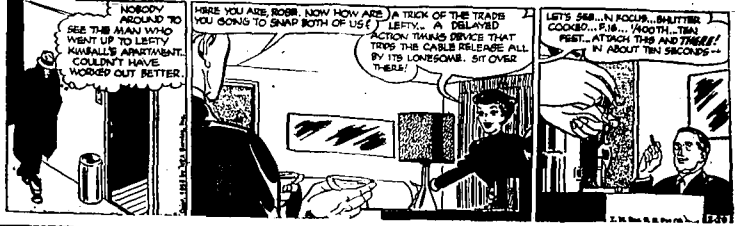

Czechs Detest Reds but State Regime Solid

BRNO, Czechoslovakia, March 27 (Delayed)—Hated of communism smolders openly here behind the iron curtain. But there is little evidence that the red dictatorship is loosening its grip.

Brno pronounced Brno is Czechoslovakia's second largest city. For the first time since the communists seized the country in 1948, a group of western reporters was allowed to come here this week-end. Officially they came to report on a soccer game between Austria and Czechoslovakia, but they were able to roam the streets and talk freely to Czechs—in restaurants and stores, in state-run "nightclubs," on street-cars, on the teeming sidewalks around the red-starred Hotel Grand.

Reporters Tally

A comparison of notebooks shows the westerners agreed on these impressions:

"The average Czech resents living under communism—and many speak with a bitter frankness that is startling—but does not believe the regime is in imminent danger of economic collapse or revolt."

"There is plenty of food in state-run grocery stores and restaurants, including meat, eggs and even chocolate Easter eggs. Sidewalk vendors do a brisk business in staling cabbage, cotton candy and chocolate-coated ice cream."

Wants Entertainment

The population is tired of entertainment. Queues start forming at dusk outside the "Bolero," "Roxey" and half a dozen "Bohemia" nightclubs, but they pass as nightclubs.

Religion is alive. Every seat was taken this morning in two downtown Roman Catholic churches, St. Thomas and St. Jacobus, the other worshippers stood at the back and sang in the aisles.

The Czechs are better clothed and shod than their Hungarian neighbors. Women wear makeup, but their hair styles look drab and old-fashioned.

Automobiles are such a rarity that a row of mud-spattered cars driven by western newsmen drew thousands of Czechs to the curbs forming the Grand hotel. Brno streets are almost bare of traffic and you can cross the country highways to yourself except for an occasional army truck.

Propaganda Evident

Propaganda takes the place of western advertising. While "peace" doves and communist slogans decorate the Brno football stadium and every public building, powerful olive drab loudspeakers are rigged at city corners and in villages to drum the spoken message into every ear.

Times faces peer down at you from the walls of public rooms—Nikolai Lenin, Josef Stalin and Czech president Antonin Zapotek.

At the communist center station of Mikulov, Czech police emptied westerners' luggage and probed suspiciously through the engines, upholstery, flooring and undercarriage of automobiles. From the United Press car they confiscated only one objectionable item—a copy of the American servicemen's newspaper, Stars and Stripes.

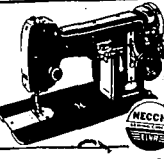

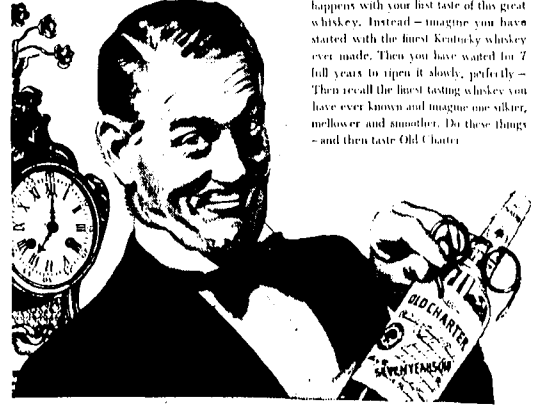
