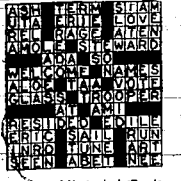

### Presidential Aides Maintain Two Cruisers for Use of Ike

WASHINGTON, April 1.—Two sleek cabin cruisers the navy keeps in constant readiness for President Eisenhower's use are maintained primarily at the White House and yesterday, for any emergency requiring relocation of the government.

James O. Hagerly, presidential press secretary, said that he has not further in talking about what the terms of the main reason the boats are at Eisenhower's disposal.

"Any details as to their specific role in any emergency could defeat the whole purpose as to why they are kept available at all times," Hagerly said.

Actually, the White House feels there is only a remote chance the cruisers would have to be called into service in any "relocation of the government." But presidential aides responsible for such planning are determined to be as fully prepared as possible.

All hands conceded that Eisenhower is much more likely to use the boats for pleasure cruises if he uses them at all. The chief executive is a dry land general who so far has "displayed little interest" in the cruisers. He used one of them last Aug. 9 to take his three grandchildren for a boat ride near either boat since.

Except for two or three trial runs the boats likewise haven't been used by anyone else, the White House says, but "their engines are kept tuned and ready."

Shortly after his took office Eisenhower ordered the big presidential yacht "Williamsburg" which was used quite a bit by Harry S. Truman, decommissioned as a symbol of what the White House called "unnecessary luxury."

A bit later Eisenhower aides began looking around for a couple of smaller craft which would be available for emergency use, and pleased with the results they came up with a pair of cabin cruisers which the president's private owners at the start of World War II, and which the owners chose not to buy back after the war.

The boats now have been named for the president's granddaughters. One is called "The Susie B." the other "The Barbara Anne."

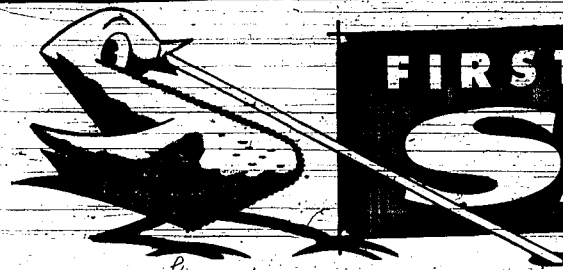

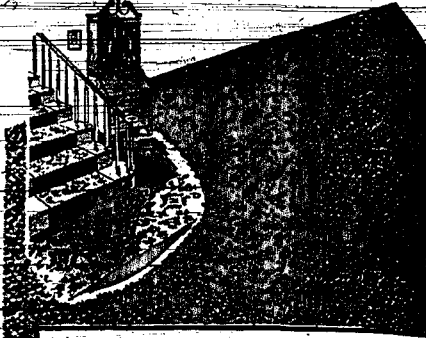

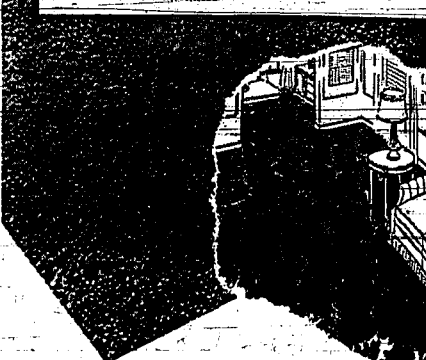
