Red China Is In Bad Shape To Start War

HONG KONG, April 5.—Red China is in bad shape to fight a war, according to a report from London. But there is no assurance that the Peking government will not start one.

The answer to that contradictory statement is found up in the internal situation in China today.

Communists in China, with nearly 600 million people, 40 percent of food floods, drought and insects have allowed both agriculture and industrial progress.

The red army needs a thorough overhaul. It has perhaps as many as four million men in uniform, but not all have weapons.

Evidence exists, and even appears in official communist publications, that the countryside is being conducted by anti-red agents and Chinese Nationalist sympathizers.

Why, then, is there such anxiety to express the belief that the communists are seriously thinking about going to war over Formosa.

Maintains Threat The answer is that the national stronghold of Formosa represents not only a military but a political threat to red control of the mainland.

The feeling among experts here is that the time must come when the communists will have to consider Formosa as a political liability.

They do not, they risk the loss of popular faith on the mainland in the strength of the regime.

The argument is that while Communist China is not immediately ready for war, the outbreak of hostilities might whip up a patriotic fervor that production would soar and the people would turn to the government.

It has not been passionately pro-communist.

Spring Shows Fangs, Rends Vast Area of Nation in Fury

By United Press A phenomenal record—hunting April blizzards and over Wyoming and Montana for the third straight day today.

At least 20 persons were dead, seven were missing in the wilderness, and scores of motorists were marooned by drifts which sometimes covered their cars. Many towns were isolated.

In North Carolina the worst forest fire in state history swept through the western Coast guard, troops and marines were called out to help fight it.

The irresistible fire has charred 250,000 acres of timber. An observer said it is spreading through the region.

In the Midwest a tornado swooped down on two farms near Mt. Auburn, destroying six buildings and sending a farm family scurrying to shelter in a cave.

Another storm dumped three inches of snow on Duluth, Minn., and in northeastern Vermont, blizzards that two days of high winds and land-sliding snow were over.

Many of these disturbances could be traced to a freak cyclonic mass that rotated over a vast area of the northern great plains with its whipping winds.

In the east, meanwhile, April was relentless. Daily warming temperatures melted up to two feet of snow which melted southern New England with its worst spring snow storm in 100 years.

The girls, now 19 to 24 years old, were trapped in a public school by the first atomic attack on Aug. 9, 1945.

They will be flown here together by the United States Air Force and receive free care from the month for plastic surgery and medical treatment which may return them to normal life.

No date for the girls' arrival has been set, but it is expected they will arrive sometime after May 1.

Minimum Pay Law Is Ruled As Not Legal

WASHINGTON, April 5.—Federal Judge Alexander Holmoff ruled yesterday that the government has no right to set nationwide minimum wages in industries doing contract work for the government.

It was the first decision of its kind. It marked a victory for the nation's textile mills which have been fighting the practice for years.

Holmoff declared that under the public contract law the secretary of labor can set minimum wages on a local basis on government contracts.

Holmoff said that an order by the secretary of labor which set a minimum wage of \$1 an hour for the nation's textile mills was "invalid and a contravention of the statute."

He granted a motion by the textile mills to declare the minimum wage order invalid.

The labor department intends to carry its fight to the supreme court if necessary.

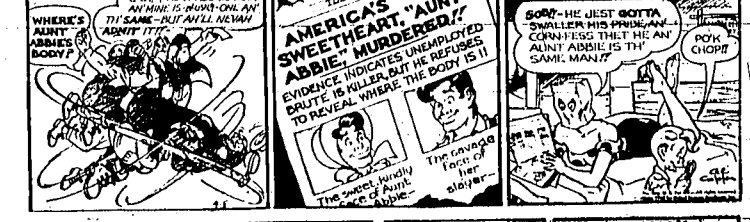
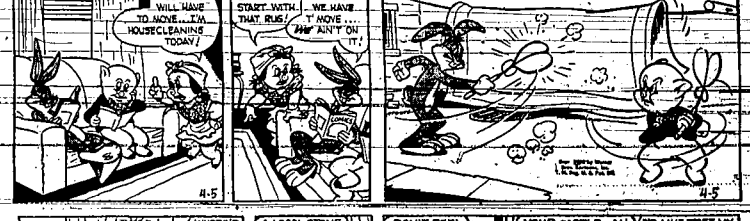
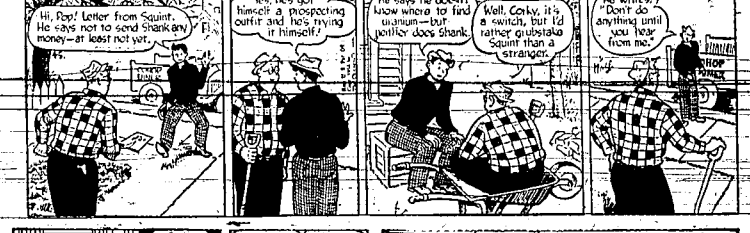

Defense Pact Alters Views In Asia Area

By United Press
The new alliance between Turkey and Iraq started to change the political and military alignment of the entire area, extending from Egypt to Pakistan.
It promises to strengthen immensely the western defense against communist aggression, and to keep on the "neutralist" campaign of Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru of India.

Turkey Britain joined the Baghdad pact yesterday. A few hours later, Turkey and Iraq invited Pakistan to join. Pakistan's acceptance is certain.
Iran invited
The next move may be to seek the inclusion of Iran. If Iran decides to join, and it is coming closer to full cooperation with the west, roars of outraged protest may be expected from Moscow.

The United States may join the alliance later.
President Cehal Bayar and Prime Minister Adnan Menderes of Turkey are the main chiefly responsible for the changing picture in the middle east.

Cooperation is Splendid
When it is remembered that Turkey remained neutral up to the closing phase of World War II, it is remarkable how that country has developed its cooperation with the western allies.
Turkey joined the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in February, 1952.

Treaties with Greece and Yugoslavia one year later.
Has New Alliance
Next, it entered an alliance with Greece and Yugoslavia in April, 1954.

That alliance brought Pakistan's Prime Minister Mohammed Ali into the middle eastern defense picture, and in May, 1954, Pakistan signed a military aid agreement with the United States.
Mohammed Ali is proving as enthusiastic as Bayar and Menderes in strengthening the free world against communism.

But there was every indication the party ranks, as announced by the Communist New China news agency, meant the party high command had solidified its control, strongly backed by the army.

The communists announced that Kao Kang, one-time boss of industrial rich Manchuria, and Jao Shu-shih, director of the Communist party's organizational bureau, were purged for conspiring to setle control of the party and government.

Seating Policy Is Tried by Officials

WASHINGTON, April 5—The supreme court is trying out a "three minutes only" seating policy to test its many tourists and attendants, as possible as the nation's highest court in action.
The new rule, in effect since last Monday, covers only one row in the back of the courtroom, where frequent ups and downs won't disturb the court.

Captain in Navy Given Top Craft

WASHINGTON, April 5—Capt. Roy L. Johnson, a veteran of naval air fighting in the Pacific, yesterday landed the choice job of commanding the supercarrier USS Forrestal.

As the Forrestal's skipper, Johnson will run the mightiest aircraft carrier in the world with a crew of more than 3,800 officers and men. The 80,000-ton Forrestal carries the biggest U. S. aircraft carrier now afloat—the 44,000-ton Coral Sea, and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Built at a cost of 218 million dollars, the Forrestal is to be commissioned this summer, and is ready for sea trials next year. It is the first of five supercarriers authorized by congress.
