Jack said just before they hit the dust he noticed a car by the side of the road, headed south as if waiting to put onto the highway, which was Eddy's car. When he pulled off into the safe brush stopping a short time, then drove on to Mallett without going back to the scene of the accident.

The seven who survived the ordeal are: Charles L. Harrison, Jack Kennedy, Gerald Miller, Clarence Gidowski, Victor Camozzi, Ralph Peters and Gene Hill.

A year ago the 14 members agreed to quit 25 cents a day in a fund, the money to be given to the member or members who finished out the year without smoking again.

The jackpot, that was split, after being divided seven ways, amounted to a little more than \$400 each.

In addition to the cash prize, those who abstained for the year claimed they had recovered their own health. Several, though, blamed their ulcers on the struggle to stay away from smoking.

Funion has it that there is no verification, that Dellinger, on the last day of the year, asked up until seven minutes to see how late he could pull. Since then he has been smoking the king size 'jobs' with a vengeance.

To celebrate the end of the year, the seven remaining members and their wives held a party at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Harrison. Mrs. Harrison presided over the occasion.

During the course of the evening, the members of the organization smoked, just as they did in the past. Harrison had 20 brands, including "roll your own" and "hand for the event."

Six of the seven members said the smokes tasted terrible and couldn't understand why they were smoking. They maintained they wouldn't start smoking again but none made any such promise like they did a year ago when they started Nicotine Anonymous.

For late decorations at the party, Mrs. Harrison featured matches, cigarettes and a man made from pipe cleaners. Her cake resembled a package of cigarettes.

While the dinner was delicious, three of the members couldn't permit anything but milk and soft foods. Three of the wives also had been struck down by ulcers during the year-the club was in existence and they, too, limited their fare to soft food.

The purpose of the club having been served, Nicotine Anonymous disbanded but members are considering starting a "Vetters" club. With the money they raised by not smoking they are thinking of investing it in an uranium mine.

### Salk Vaccine Report on Tuesday May Be 'Beginning of End' for Polio Cases

Providing that the new Salk polio vaccine is approved and licensed Tuesday by the national institutes of health, U. S. public health service, vaccinations with the new serum may wipe out poliomyelitis as a serious childhood disease, according to Dr. Cecil B. Reinstein, medical director of the southern California public health department.

In a statement explaining the development of the new vaccine, Dr. Reinstein said that in 1948 research workers at four universities began a study to determine how many types of virus cause polio and how they differed.

Before the study was made, Dr. Reinstein said, research workers had been puzzled by the fact that monkeys, which had been experimentally infected with polio and recovered, related a second infection to the same virus specimen, but occasionally contracted polio when exposed to a different virus specimen.

Upon completion of the university studies, it was demonstrated that three major types of polio virus existed. These major types are: Brunhilde, type one; Lansing, type two; and Leon, type three.

Dr. Reinstein says each of the three types will produce polio with identical symptoms. However, infection by one will produce immunity to another. The problem with which the researchers were confronted was the production of a vaccine giving immunity to all three types of virus.

Up to 1952 the popularly-held theory by some doctors was that if a child traveled only by way of the nervous system, the 1952 discovery that the virus could be identified in the blood stream after infection indicated that polio was vulnerable to vaccines.

According to Dr. Reinstein, vaccines had been obtained from poliomyelitis brains and spinal cords of monkeys and chimpanzees. This vaccine was given to a small number of children within a few weeks.

The vaccine employed on the children was of a type considered unacceptable as a practical agent for human use. Dr. Reinstein said, "Subsequently, an acceptable vaccine was developed by Dr. Jonas Salk and his associates at the University of Pittsburgh."

Prepared from tissue-grown virus and inactivated with formaldehyde, the Salk vaccine has already been administered to more than 650,000 children Idaho was one of 31 states and the District of Columbia where children received the experimental vaccinations. The vaccine was given to 100,000 children in these states and the effects of the vaccination were compared with the polio history of non-vaccinated first and third graders.

Dr. Reinstein said the polio vaccine developed by Dr. Salk consists of a mixture of three types of polio virus, treated with a formaldehyde solution. The vaccine is red in color. To make the vaccine, the three types of polio virus are grown on small bits of monkey tissue. Under extremely exacting conditions of sterility, the virus multiplies and is harvested after four or five days. The fluid is then poured into containers and filtered.

A solution of formaldehyde is added to the fluid containing the virus. The formaldehyde is neutralized with sodium bisulfite. The formaldehyde eliminates the possibility of the vaccine causing the virus multiplies and is harvested after four or five days. The fluid is then poured into containers and filtered.

### 4 Men Killed, 7 Are Hurt in Plane Smash

NOFOLK, Va., April 10.—Four enlisted men were killed and three enlisted men and four officers were injured early today when a twin-engine P-51 Mustang patrol plane crashed into a hangar at the naval air station here.

Witnesses said the plane veered to its left and struck the four-foot wall as it took off in an area used by seaplanes on Chesapeake Bay. The anti-submarine warfare plane hit the top of the wall, striking off part of its undercarriage and tail section.

Those killed were in the rear of the plane on the lower deck. Other members of the crew on the flight deck behind the pilots compartment in the forward section received only minor injuries. They were treated at the base infirmary and released.

The plane was attached to patrol squadron 56 under administrative control of Com Fleet Air Wing, Atlantic fleet, under the command of air force U. S. Atlantic fleet.
