Albert Einstein, 76, Dies Quietly Today

PRINCETON, N. J., April 18 (UP)—Dr. Albert Einstein, 76, one of the greatest physicists of all time, died today at Princeton hospital. The frail little cosmic genius, whose theory of relativity unlocked the door to the atomic age, died quietly at 1:15 a.m. A private nurse was on duty at his bedside.

The cause of death, was listed as a ruptured aorta, the main artery of the body. Einstein entered the hospital secretly last Saturday with gall bladder inflammation. News of his death was withheld for nearly seven hours. Miss M. Hall, director of nurses at Princeton hospital, said Einstein's family "held up the announcement."

Einstein's death set the world of science and education into deep mourning. Einstein rose from obscurity as a German physicist's son and a childhood marked by a slowness to learn, and attained the 20th century with his genius.

His mathematical genius changed the course of scientific thinking. His theory of relativity—showing time was relative to height, length and breadth—first brought him popularity.

He labored for 40 years to find the master key that might explain the physical makeup and operation of the universe. He believed the universe was one continuous field, like an endless stream, and governed by unchangeable laws.

He never would have won a "best dressed" award. His favorite outfit consisted of a sweater, an overcoat, a pair of slippers and a pair of slippers.

On a visit to Paris some years ago he was invited to live at the Hotel de Ville. He declined, saying Einstein brought only one pair of shoes with him—and kept complaining when they "disappeared."

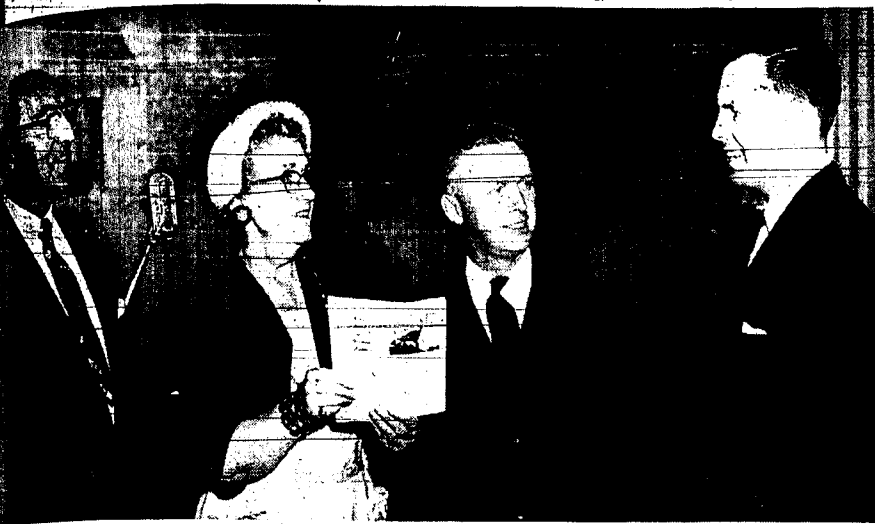

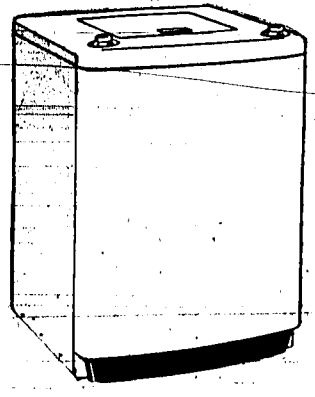

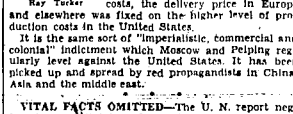

RAY TUCKER: It is the same sort of "imperialistic, commercial and colonial" indictment which Moscow and Peking regularly level against the United States. It has been picked up and spread and promulgated in China, Asia and the middle east.

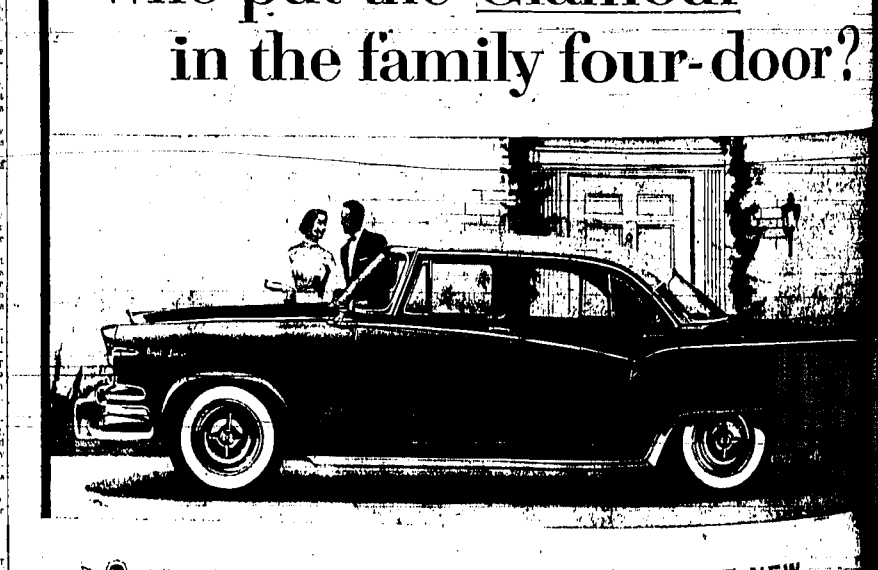

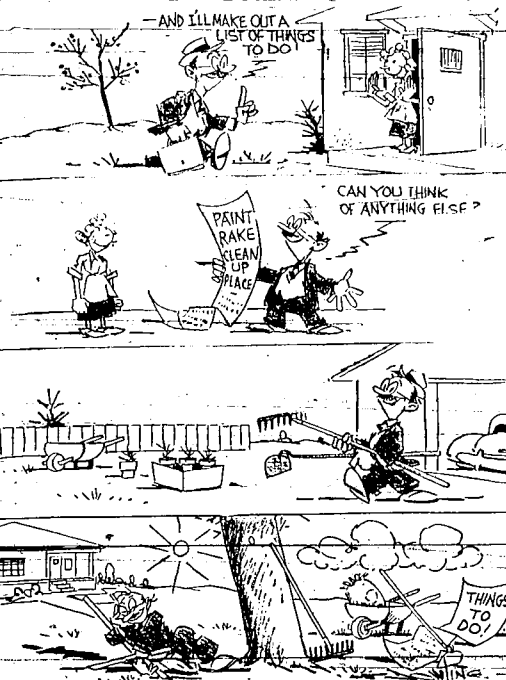

Truman Talk Is Lashed by GOP Solons

WASHINGTON, April 18 (AP)—Former President Truman's accusation that the Eisenhower administration is guilty of political trickery with serious foreign and domestic issues, heated retorts yesterday from GOP ranks.

Neither vicious personal attacks on the President nor the rhetorical efforts to undermine his outstanding record in office will succeed, Chairman Leonard W. Hall of the Republican national committee said.

Truman did not mention Eisenhower by name, but delivered a blistering attack on his administration Saturday night at a big Democratic dinner honoring house speaker Sam Rayburn.

In a speech reminiscent of his 1948 "give 'em hell" campaign efforts, he charged the Eisenhower administration with bad management, blunders and with trying "political tricks with the grave and serious issues of both foreign and domestic policies."

Representative Judd R. Minn, accused Truman of speaking "with the facts concealed behind his own misstatements." Representative Keatin, R. N. Y., called the speech a

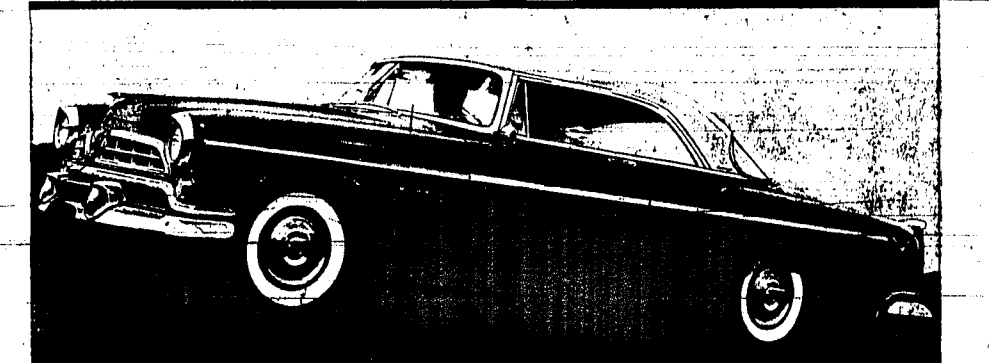

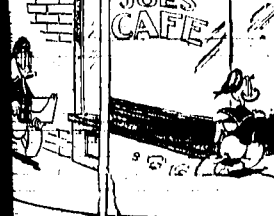

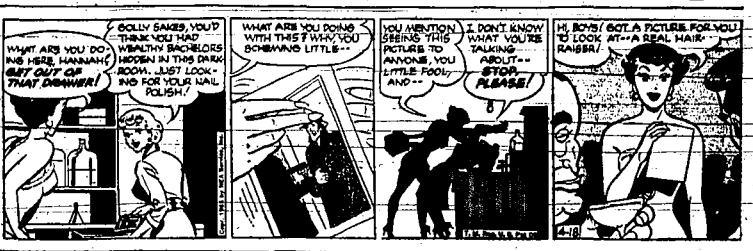

Sky Watchers Now Scan for Tornadoes too

BOSTON, April 18 (AP)—A bit of thrifty Yankee ingenuity has become a standard operating procedure throughout the nation's weather country, it was disclosed today. Last year, New England's weathermen initiated the use of the air force ground observer corps to watch for tornadoes as well as enemy aircraft during the May to September tornado season.

Adopted System
Dr. Oscar Tenenbaum, meteorologist in charge of the Boston weather bureau, said the air force has adopted the system of dual responsibility as "standard operating procedure" throughout the country.

In addition, Tenenbaum said, the nation is better equipped than ever to spot possible tornadoes by radar. An air force radar unit installed on Blue Hill in Milton, a few miles south of Boston, a weather bureau radar unit at East Boston and another at Kansas City, Mo., are scanning the atmosphere for "squall lines" as well as hostile aircraft.

Bulletins Planned
"With all this added warning equipment, we plan to put out more frequent weather bulletins when tornado conditions exist," Tenenbaum said.

He said tornadoes, such as the one that took more than 100 lives in Worcester and central Massachusetts in June 1953 and last year's Connecticut twister, come when cold upper air masses in over warm lower air creates "turbulence."

The ace weather forecaster said New England would have the same general warning system as last year—some 400 observation posts and 1,000 observers. These include ground observers, state police, forest fire wardens, weather observers and the New England Power company.

Warnings Go Out
Tenenbaum said weather warnings this year would go not only to newspapers, radio stations and wire services but also to Red Cross and civil defense which have "linked" the weather bureau's teletype system.

The course of a fast-moving tornado would be instantly flashed to all these units to insure prompt relief measures.

Tenenbaum said the "odds against a New England tornado still are against it. The records show the region gets a severe tornado only once in about 20 years.

World Genius, Albert Einstein Dies at Age 76

Franklin D. Roosevelt that experimentation based on that formula had proceeded to such a stage that an atomic bomb might be possible. He said the Germans were working toward it.

On July 18, 1953, mass and the speed of light fused a bit of New Mexico desert into green glass when the first atomic bomb exploded.

Einstein charismatically announced since that date berated the foolishness of man on both sides in the atomic race for failure to bring under control the violent force that resulted from his discovery.

Einstein toward the end of his life said he'd rather be a plumber or a peddler than put up with the intellectual and governmental problems of a scientist today.

He became a champion of Zionism and later denounced Hitler's expansion of fellow Jews. He was offered the presidency of Israel upon the death of his friend and fellow scientist, Chaim Weizmann.

Einstein declined, saying he was more familiar with scientific problems than with problems in handling human beings in a political arena.

Action Asked To End Fear Of Shortages

WASHINGTON, April 18.—Sen. Lister Hill, D. Ala., called on President Eisenhower today to take emergency action to remove public fears of a black market in the Salk polio vaccine.

Hill asked the president to call on manufacturers to keep the new discovery out of the normal commercial channels for one week so a system of priorities will be set up. Shipments for the school inoculation program and for emergency cases would not be affected.

Hill, chairman of the senate labor and welfare committee, also suggested the White House conference on the vaccine, beginning Friday, continue in session until a plan had worked out a voluntary system of priorities and controls.

Wants Fund Available
In addition, he said he would be happy to receive any recommendations for providing federal funds "to make certain that every child needing the vaccine will get it." He apparently referred to a recent statement by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis that it will be able to provide free only the first two of the three necessary inoculations.

Hill made the recommendations in a letter to Mr. Eisenhower.

The Alabama Democrat also suggested that Mr. Eisenhower enlarge the White House conference to include Dr. Jonas E. Salk, Dr. Thomas Francis, Jr. and Dr. Alan Gregg, scientists who developed and tested the vaccine.

Suggests Panel
He said he believes it also might be worthwhile to have a public relations committee—perhaps three eminent clergymen—to help inform the public that any distribution plan would be fair and equitable.

Meanwhile, the "public health service said it was doing a speedy job of procuring the vaccine. Testing done by the laboratories on each batch of vaccine they manufacture. The service must approve these reports before the vaccine can be shipped.

A public health spokesman said this double-checking had not slowed down most shipments more than 24 hours. However, he added, in a few instances it has been necessary to request additional data before giving approval.

LOS ANGELES, April 18.—Leonard Hordijk, his wife and five children arrived here Saturday from Holland to begin a new life in the United States through the help of a wealthy Los Angeles businessman.

Hordijk, 50, and his family were brought here by Allen H. Rubin, owner of a factory producing drug-pink dyes. Rubin met Hordijk in Mookkendam, Holland, in 1951, when he learned how Hordijk and his family had risked their lives to hide five Jewish women from the Nazis during World War II.

Hordijk told Rubin of his dream of living in the United States. Rubin went to work with immigration authorities and helped cut the red tape to bring the family here.

Rubin gave jobs to Hordijk and his eldest son, Peter, 18, in his factory. The manufacturer also has given Rubin the choice of five completely furnished homes.

Children Get First Shot of Salk Vaccine

Hundreds of thousands of youngsters received their first inoculations of Salk anti-polio vaccine today as the biggest mass vaccine on disease in history got under way.

The first and second graders from Tallahassee, Fla., to Los Angeles, Calif., trooped to distribution centers to begin the nationwide mass inoculation program.

Some Postponed
But delayed shipments of the vaccine forced other states and cities to cancel plans to start giving their children protection against infantile paralysis this week.

Health department officials explained that many areas, particularly in the north, would have to wait because first priority was being given to children in the southeast and southwest, where polio strikes earlier in the year.

Most officials received the news of delay without complaint.

Beats Season
The giant vaccination program was ordered by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis in order to provide the children whose polio with protection before summer weather ushers in the infantile paralysis season.

Under the program, the first and second grade children will receive two shots of the cherry-red vaccine without charge, providing their parents consent. A booster shot will follow about seven months later.
