

SAME OLD STRATEGY

Russia's decision to annul its world war bracks of friendship and alliance with Britair and France should occasion neither surprise for alarm in the western world.

For all practical purposes the Soviet union anoeled these treaties almost at the war's end. From that time forward, the Kremlin has been operating-as if the packs did not exist. If it could have managed it, Russia would today be ruling France through the medium of the French Communist party. And a communist-dominated Europe would not have found Britain in a very enviable posi-

The only reason the Soviet union has not een able in the years since World war II to wipe out all that Britain and France stand or is that they, in company with the United inters and others, have banged together to revent it.

The NATO-pact was the keystone of this pseventive effort. Coming on the heels of the Marshall plan, which had helped bring economic recovery to Western Europe, NATO drove home to the Soylets the realization that these countries could no longer be taken

without a missing element in NATO was the industrial and armed might of Germany. The Parls pacts, nearing final approval of all the affected nations, remedy that deficiency by endorsing German rearmament and entry

The Russians now say these agreements are directed against." them. The truth, which they well understand, is that they are "protective against." the Soviet union. What amonys the Kremlin so thoroughly is that putting Germany into the western orbit is the mast—the irretrievable step in blocking Russials way to an easy conquest of Western Europe.

No amoke-screen propaganda about the sebitth of German militarism can-cloak the fact that for-nearly 10-years the menace to freedom has not been Germany but Russia. No one but the most guillible neutralists will be impressed by the argument the Kremlin now advances for breaking off "friendship" with Brittain and France.

PROPAGANDA FORUM

The communist axis counts upon scoring a major propaganda victory at the 29-nationatro-asian-conference at Bandung, Indoncela. But an alert West, working through its friends at the council table, may do much to reverse the result.

The task will not be easy Red China's Premier Chou En-lai may well play the leading role. Though largely sponsored by India's Premier Nehru, professed neutral, the meeting's roster significantly leaves out South Korea Nationalist China and Israel.

Korea, Nationalist China and Israel. But despite the evident effort on some-body's part to load the roster against the West, the lineup has its favorable aspect only two of the participants have outright communist regimes. Six are neutral, eight can be classed as and 12 as

can be classed as anti-Soviet, and 12 as positively pro-West.
It is from this latter group that important support can be expected for western policies in Asia and Africa. Particularly, two Manila Pact powers, Pakistan and the Philippines.

Meanwhile the reds will be strutting in their usual phony beace pose, bearing the dove high aloft to distract attention from the building weapons, beneath their tunics. And we will get the old refrain from Kremlin alley about the wondrous healing effects of communism on pass payers.
