New Extortion Threat Linked To Store Job

OAKLAND, Calif., April 18—Oakland police have linked an east bay extortion threat to a similar case that resulted in a department store bombing in Portland, Ore.

"We have a particular suspect in mind," said Captain of Inspectors Anthony Bolger, after conferring with Portland's Captain of Inspectors William E. Brown. "There are similarities in the two cases."

The east bay threat involved Walter Boyesen, a wealthy paint manufacturer. A note left in his office door on March 14 demanded \$75,000. It warned that failure to pay would mean "the death of you, your wife, or one of your little girls."

Watch Kept

Sheriff's deputies were keeping a 24-hour-a-day watch on the Boyesen home in Orinda.

In Portland last Friday, a note demanding \$100 appeared on the desk of Aaron Frank, president of the Meier and Frank department store. It warned of an impending bomb blast.

A few moments after Frank read the note, a bomb exploded in a washroom on the third floor of the store. Two persons were slightly injured.

Reward Offered

Frank offered a \$25,000 reward for capture and conviction of the extortionist.

Bolger said he and Brown found similarities in the two notes and in the methods used in both extortion attempts. He also pointed out that Boyesen and Frank are close friends and that both recently returned from trips to Honolulu.

Bolger said both notes were typewritten, contained the same misspellings and made frequent use of the phrase, "to wit."

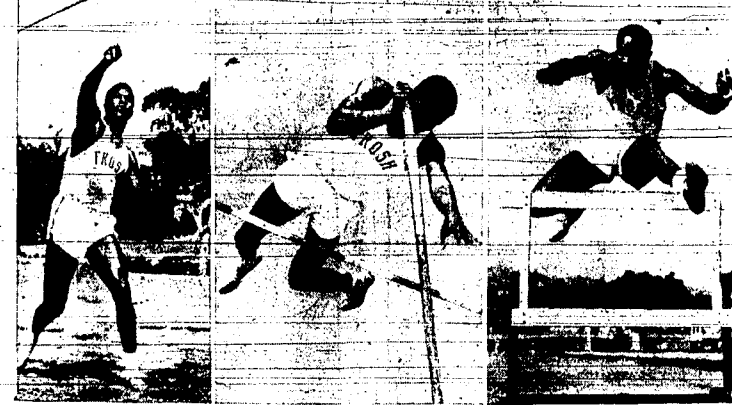

Russia Slave Labor Strike Attempt Told

MAIZURU, Japan, April 18 (AP)—A strike by more than 150,000 slave laborers paralyzed mining and industrial operations in parts of Siberia for a month last spring, Japanese newspapers reported yesterday.

Russians machine guns finally were turned on the rebels, 200 were reported slain in one camp, and the prisoners went back to work.

Three Down Tools

"The workers threw down their tools, raised black flags to protest brutal treatment by Russian guards, and refused to work," said Minoru Okada, 43. He was in one compound in the huge Nalinak forced labor camp in north central Siberia.

The wave of rebellion swept to other slave labor camps at Karaganda, he said. That was in May and the strike lasted for about a month.

"Then the Russians restored order, but only after machine-gunning many of the protesting laborers," he said.

200 Prisoners Slain

Kyodo News service reported 200 slave laborers were killed and 180 injured at Karaganda. Okada did not say how many were Nalinak.

"It became so serious that Russian officials came from Moscow and ordered better treatment for the prisoners," Okada said.

Most of the strikers were Russians and Europeans from countries now behind the iron curtain, reports said.

Mud Bath Covers West Utah Region

SALT LAKE CITY, April 18 (AP)—Residents of western Utah got a mud bath yesterday when a dust storm was followed by rain and snow.

Winds of 35 to 45 miles an hour kicked up the dust, lowering visibility to 10 feet and a quarter-mile in some places.

Then it started to rain and the dust particles clung to the raindrops. The resulting mud mixture coated windshields during the peak traffic hour in Salt Lake City. Police reported a number of mishaps.

Home windows also were closed. To the despair of housewives who had started their spring cleaning in the sunny weather of a few days ago.
