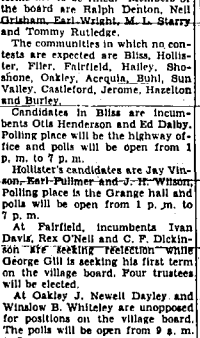

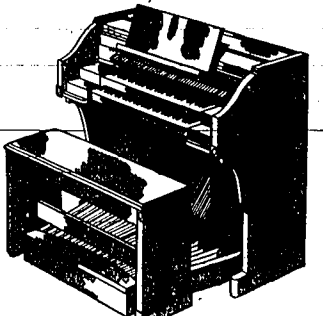
### Schedule Change Is Set by Airline

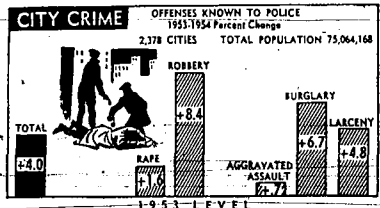

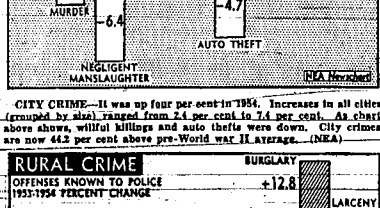
Crime Is up Again



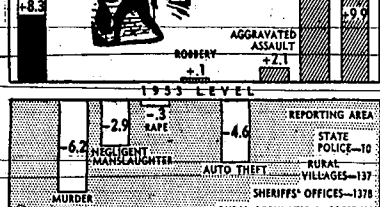

Editors must take some of the blame for discouraging funnies paper readers, Hills said. "At a time when everything is going wide-screen and big-screen, we've been cramping and queering and reducing the size of comics."

Go Back to 5 Columns

### Southwest Lashed by Winds, Tornadoes, Hail, Dust Cloud

DALLAS, Tex., April 22 (AP)—Tornadoes, hail, severe thunderstorms and dust hit the southwest in furious protest last night and early today, causing heavy damage.

Four tornadoes were reported in Missouri, two in Oklahoma, two in Texas and one in Arkansas, but no fatalities were reported.

Tornadoes were reported at Blodgett and Bertrand, Mo., and strong winds hit the southeastern Missouri area.

In Oklahoma, a farmer near Yukon reported seeing a funnel, and the Oklahoma Gas and Electric company said an observer saw an eight-one-half-mile south of Sulphur.

At Duncan, Okla., high winds whipped the roof off radio station KRRD, knocking the station off the air.

Flouring thunderstorms moved across the northern part of Texas last night and early today. Heavy hail storms were reported at Loring and Graham, Tex., but no one was reported injured. Hailstones at Graham were about the size of golf balls, and damage to rooftops and crops was reported heavy in the area.

Hail and high winds at Comanche and Duncan, Okla., broke windows and utility lines.

The Fort Worth weather bureau said huge thunderstorms built up over the northern Texas area, where a warning of possible tornadoes had been issued. One thunderstorm sighted by radar early today lowered up to 60,000 feet and stayed light high for the Fort Worth area.

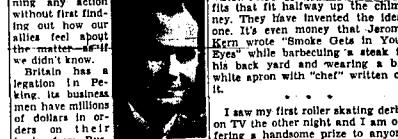
### Thoughts of Columnist Pose Questions on Many Affairs

### Red Premier Says Meeting May Be Held

MOSCOW, April 22 (AP)—Premier Nikolai Bulganin said tonight he favors a "parley at the summit" but the date depends on President Eisenhower and British Prime Minister Eden.

Bulganin told this to western correspondents at a news reception given by Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov at the Sverdlovsk palace for a Polish government delegation. The Poles are in Moscow to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Soviet-Polish mutual aid treaty.

Bulganin was questioned by western correspondents around a buffet table.

He was asked if the Soviet proposal on a big four foreign ministers conference to sign the Austrian state treaty might be followed by a meeting of the four heads of government.

"Ask Eisenhower and Stalin about the date," Bulganin replied. "I have made my position clear."

Do you mean by my statement that you are of a positive attitude toward a big four meeting? a correspondent asked.

Bulganin nodded.

This was taken by western correspondents to mean that Bulganin is ready to meet with the three western heads of government when the date is set.

The Bricker amendment, besides declaring any treaty in conflict with the U. S. Constitution of no force or effect, would prevent any treaty or executive agreement from becoming effective as domestic law except by the enactment of separate legislation.

### Lattimore Has Tour Slated if Visa Renewed

WASHINGTON, April 23.—(AP)—Far east specialist Owen Lattimore said today he has completed plans for an extensive European lecture tour, contingent upon the state department granting him permission to leave the country.

Lattimore, Johns Hopkins university professor and former state department adviser, has been under indictment for alleged perjury since 1952 following his appearance before the late Sen. Pat McCarran's senate internal security subcommittee.

He is accused of lying by stating he was not a follower of the communist line and a promoter of red infiltration.

Lattimore has been allowed to lecture at Johns Hopkins since the original indictment was returned although he still is on the university's pay roll.

However, nine European educational centers have asked him to speak on Asia and other topics this summer and fall and Lattimore said he has accepted all the invitations.

The department was quoted early this month as saying it saw no reason why Lattimore should not make a "scholarly" European tour.

However, his passport number had been "misquoted" and insisted the issue still was "pending."

Lattimore has passport number 333333 which does not expire until Dec. 16, 1955. But under state department rules he cannot go abroad until this has been renewed for at least one year.

Lattimore said he applied for the extension March 16. He has had no reply. Nonetheless, he said he has booked air passage to England for himself and his wife for early May.

Lattimore's itinerary as described it would include: four lectures at Oxford, one in the spring and three in the fall.

He also would give three lectures in Asia and three in the United States "generally about land, and sea frontiers in Asia."

### Official Warns Home Owners

Veterans dissatisfied with construction of homes purchased with veterans administration guarantee or insured loan must file notice of substantial non-conformance with plans and specifications within one year from the date the veteran takes title. The notice must be filed with the seller.

Arnold Helwege, Twin Falls veterans administrator, said a seller's one-year warranty for all houses on which the VA has issued a certificate of reasonable value after Oct. 1, 1945, is mandatory under the housing act of 1945.

Helwege said the warranty does not apply to existing homes which have been occupied for more than one year.

Helwege emphasized that the one-year warranty is in addition to any other rights and privileges a purchaser of owner may have under any other law or instrument. If construction features in the purchased house are considered sub-standard, he said, it is the veteran's responsibility to enforce his rights under the warranty.

### Einstein Brain Renews Battle About 'Genius'

NEW YORK, April 23 (AP)—Referring to the brain of Einstein, which now is the "genius" of the scientific study, an eminent neurologist was reminded of the student days.

He was in a mental institution, according to the man in charge. This world-famous, most learned doctor was engaged in a game of checkers with a inmate who was making measurements except one, an idiot.

He played a mean game of checkers with the inmate who had the great brain, bewildered, and frustrated. All these things were reflected on the great brain's face.

Question Asked

But the inmate brain's facial mirror was bright with mastery, and a very odd question popped into the young doctor's mind. The question was: "Which is the idiot?"

The neurologist was pointing out that despite the vast accumulation of knowledge about the human brain, science knows very little about it. That's not contradictory. Science knows its anatomy in minute detail. Yet anatomically science usually can't tell the difference between the brain of a genius and the brain of an idiot.

Scientifically the neurologist belongs to the school which argues that genius has no physical cause. Its opposite school argues that everything must have a physical cause. Therefore the physical cause of Einstein's genius must be in his brain, since the human body has no other intellectual organ. It just has to be there, and if it isn't found it means only that science doesn't yet know how to look.

Offers to Help

The neurologist offered to be \$10,000 to \$1 that no physical cause would be found in Einstein's brain, no matter how closely it is studied. Other scientists, even physical-cause ones, said these odds weren't enough because science has measured, weighed and dissected brains for some 200 years without finding a single genius characteristic.

The interplay of these "forces" the shifting of power from one to another, the subjugation of one by another, the balance achieved among them—all these really subtle and intricate relations, can make for genius and can also make for stupidity, these scientists say.

### Uranium Scramble Fever Hits Idaho; Hunters Arrive, Stake Claims, Wait

BOISE, April 23 (AP)—The great scramble for uranium—the raw material of atomic energy—is surging north from Utah and Colorado into Idaho, where miners for almost a century have been finding pay dirt in deposits of gold and silver, copper, lead and zinc.

More than 2,000 claims have been staked in recent weeks in one small area alone—in the valley of the Salmon river, which winds through the trackless mountains of Idaho's "primitive area."

Since early April the state has leased almost 150,000 acres of public lands to uranium prospectors, and other applications are piling up by the score.

Letters from folk who want to cash in on the boom used to reach the state mine inspector's office at the rate of seven to 10 a week. Now they arrive in batches of 20 or 30 a day.

Sales of graper counters, "scintillators," and "anopars" are soaring in Boise and other towns across the state. Hotel rooms are at a premium in towns like Salmon, Challis and Hazelton.

All this—and not a single deposit of proven commercial value has yet been dug in the state.

staked some of my land even though there, sunk a 100-foot shaft, applied for a government loan and sent in samples to be assayed by the atomic energy commission.

The laws give a prospector first claim to a newly discovered deposit when he posts a location notice on the land—saying "I have found 'X' here" at "Y" feet "Z" high and four inches wide above the lot. Often the notice is tucked into a tobacco can to keep off the rain.

After that, the prospector must plant his career posts, remove enough dirt to show evidence of mineral to the claim, and pay a \$2 filing fee to the county recorder.

But the boom began this spring with the news of finds in the primitive area and north Idaho's panhandle. Activity is expected to increase as the new harvest from the upper valley.

McDowell sends a 25-cent copy of the state's mining laws to prospectors who ask for details on how to cash in on the bonanza.

"Big uranium rush around our state," and vicinity, wrote one farmer, "and some prospectors have end until July 1, 1951."

Although shooting stopped Nov. 11, 1945, World War I did not officially end until July 2, 1946.

But the government will pay handsomely for the best grade: \$1,694.50 for a ton of ore which contains 10 per cent uranium oxide.

A final tip from McDowell: Don't be disheartened by what the AEC says: Just over the next hill there may be a fortune in gold or silver, copper, lead or zinc.

"But make no mistake," says Harry T. March, secretary of the Idaho Mining Association, "who will make an account of itself in the end as a big uranium producer."

Says Mine Inspector George McDowell: "If we are ever going to find it in Idaho, now is the time."

The most promising find, according to McDowell, is a deposit at the head of Rock creek near Sun Valley in the towering Sawtooth mountains.

## "A Challenge for the Church"

We hear so much these days by way of criticism of the church. When one comes to sum up what is wrong with the church, why it seems so ineffective, why it is still poorly attended even though there is a "renewance of religion" at the moment, why despite some few who speak out bravely and command a general respect it exhibits so little of potential leadership, why the church can hardly be credited with understanding by the rank and file of those who call themselves Christians, why Christians are too content to regard the church as a respectable, but decorative institution, which is entirely compatible with that of the self-corrupted humanity. That was God's purpose in creating the church and sustaining it; that is not what the church has been doing through the centuries; that is not the record of the church as we find it recorded in the Bible, especially the New Testament.



The church is the inner company of those who, under the leadership of Christ, and empowered by Him, insist on living, and if necessary dying, rather than surrender to the selfish, hateful folly of a perishing race of men. The church is the company of those who love without demand of love, love without pay or thanks, because it is so decreed by Heaven, because it is the God's demand on man who is so little of a being and yet so different from them.

Christ is not defeated, nor His church, but Christians now an orthodoxy must rediscover their Master, must repent, must be so restored as "sons" that God can minister in and through them to bring about His will. There always will be strife, warfare, bloodshed running rampant in the church, until the church rises up to the task of healing in the name of the Risen Saviour. This is the church's high hour, but it can be claimed only

as it remains a humble and penitent "fellowship of believers."

"And after the reading of the law and the prophets the rulers of the synagogue sent unto them saying—Ye men and brethren, if ye have any word of exhortation for the people, say on."

"The church is called upon to speak for God! Let us say on..."

## Separation of Joined Twins Is Successful

CHICAGO, April 23 (AP)—Doctors gave the 6-month-old Andrews Sismore twins an excellent chance to recover from a dramatic, unplanned separation of their joined bodies.

The operation on the twins, joined at the head, at Mercy hospital Thursday night was the third Sismore separation in 24 months.

Msgr. John W. Barrett, director of hospitals for the Catholic archdiocese of Chicago, said "we started out with the idea of an exploratory operation, but things went so well we continued until it was over."

The operation was termed "100 per cent successful."

Fourteen surgeons and specialists participated in the four hour and 40 minute operation.

If the girls—Deborah Marie and Christine Mary—survive, they will be the first head-jointed twins to do so.

The famed Brodie twins—Roger Lee and Rodney Dee—were also joined at the top of the skull.

But Roger Lee died 34 days after an operation on Dec. 17, 1949—Rodney Dee, now 3 1/2 years old, is thriving.

Three weeks ago, a set of 22-month-old girls from Thailand (formerly Siam) were successfully separated. They were joined at the chest.

Hopes for successful separation were aroused shortly after the birth of the Andrews sisters Oct. 1, 1949, when doctors noticed one twin could sleep when the other cried.

The world's largest and oldest infirmary is located in Lorain county, Ohio.
