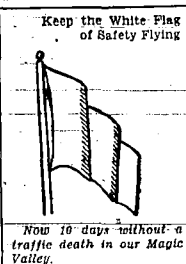

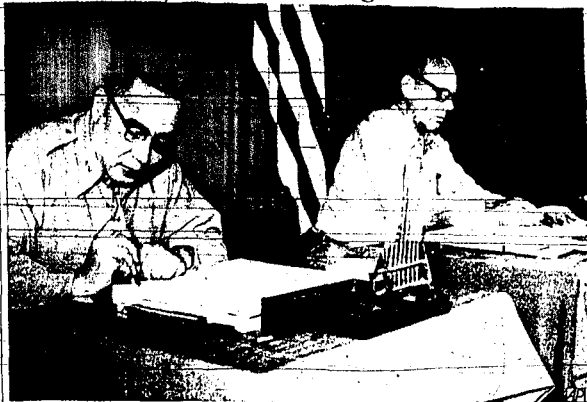

Coast Guard Rescues 5 in Battered Raft

MONTEREY, Calif., May 2 (AP)—A coast guard cutter plucked the five men in the raft Lehi II from their floundering craft in pre-dawn darkness early today. All passengers rescued from "raft" Lehi II, including Skipper Baker, the rescue craft "Oetive" reported by radio. The rescue occurred 44 miles off the California coast in stormy seas. One of the raft's crewmen was reported "so weak from hunger he could hardly move." None of the raft's occupants had eaten since they set out from San Francisco Friday with plans to drift across 2,500 miles of open ocean to the Hawaiian Islands. When they were pulled aboard the coast guard rescue vessel they were wet, cold, hungry and weak. The raft was left to flounder in the heavy swells of the Pacific ocean. The coast guard rescue ship reached the battered raft early today. It reported on arrival at the scene that a raft would have to be launched to save Devere Baker, the 39-year-old captain of the Lehi, and his four crewmen. "The difficult problem will be the removal of one passenger from the raft," this Active radioed coast guard headquarters in Monterey. "He is in so weak a condition from not having eaten for three days that it will be difficult to move." Baker asked to be allowed to remain aboard the raft until dawn. He also sought a low into port. Presumably he did not want the raft and its equipment to become subject to the maritime salvage law of "finders keepers." The Active spoke to the scene in answer to a distress call from the raft last night. A coast guard patrol vessel and a search plane also went to the Lehi's aid.

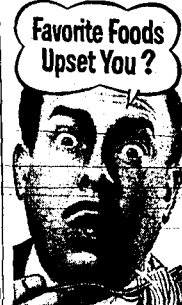
AEC Reports 3 Suits Filed Over 'Fallout'

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—The atomic energy commission has advised congress three suits have been filed against the government claiming "personal injury caused by radioactive fallout" from the atomic tests in Nevada. The commission made the statement in a summary supplied to the joint senate-house atomic energy subcommittee. It said the commission's medical experts deny the damage claims. "The government is denying liability and the suits are being defended by the department of justice," the commission said. Two of the suits are for \$100,000 each—plus medical and hospital expenses. The third is for \$75,000 and expenses. All three were filed before the current series of tests. The commission did not say where the suits were filed. It did not identify the individuals who claim to have been injured or describe the nature of their medical claims. It was believed to be the first AEC summary of such suits, although the individual suits presumably would have been public knowledge when filed. The AEC data was supplied to

LEWISTON, May 2 (AP)—Buildings appear to be in "very acceptable shape" at Northern Idaho College of Education and it will open its Lewis-Clark Normal school Sept. 26, Dr. D. R. Theophilus, president of the University of Idaho, announces. Theophilus inspected the campus with Dr. H. W. Steffens, executive dean of the university, who will be administrator for Lewis-Clark. Church announced Sunday night the boy has mumps.

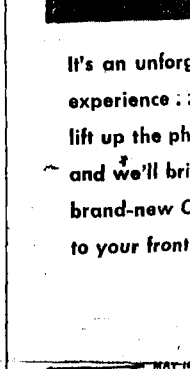

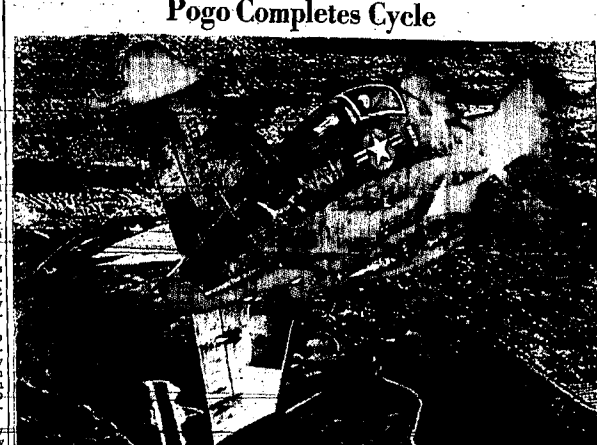

French Fail to Glimpse Hope For End of Asia's Colonialism

By JAMES MARLOW
WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—The French have become a symbol of the inability of the French to face reality in the 20th century. The determination of the people of Asia to shake off colonialism for independence.

Ngô Đình Diem, a Moscow-trained, began war on the French with the Vietnamese, made up of Vietnamese communists and nationalists. The French were too weak to crush the rebels.

They did not train Vietnamese armies and officer corps capable of crushing Ho Chi Minh. Such an army, of course, one day might have turned on the French and driven them out.

Nor did they build up any Vietnamese leader who could have been a real head of state and rally point for his people against communism.

Instead they picked Bao Dai, former emperor of the province of Annam, as chief of state. He was a French puppet. Since his appointment in 1949, he has been nothing more than a puppet.

Last year Ho Chi Minh forced the French, in spite of the American aid they got, to let him have the north half of Viet Nam. They moved Bao Dai to the south. Bao Dai is not quite.

Bao Dai, in France, remained chief of state. The United States now bears most of the cost of trying to build up South Viet Nam to keep it from communism, pushed

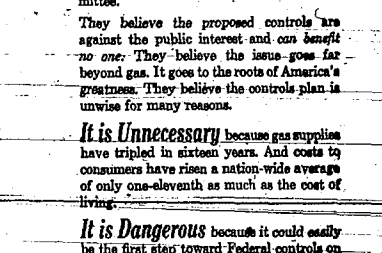

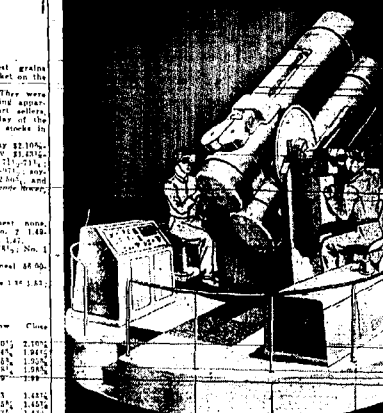

Solon Probes Short Creek, Gets Senate Fund Reports Note

LAS VEGAS, Nev., May 2 (AP)—A personal investigation of morals and possible juvenile delinquency in the Solon community of Short Creek on the Utah-Arizona border, was reportedly being made today by Sen. William Langer, R-N.D.

Langer, during a hearing last Friday in Phoenix, Ariz., was asked for federal aid by Mohave County Attorney Bernard T. Crane. Mr. Crane said the situation was completely out of control of county authorities.

As was reported last Friday, Langer was in Las Vegas last night, drove to Short Creek in extreme southwest Utah and then headed at dawn toward the rutted, dirt road to Short Creek to interview the community's few hundred residents.

U. S. Food Giveaway Program Is Heaviest Since Depression

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—Uncle Sam is giving away more food than any time since the days of heavy unemployment in this country before World War II.

A survey indicates federal food donations during the fiscal year ending June 30 may total 11 billion pounds. Such gifts reached a record of slightly more than 3 billion pounds of food in 1946, the first year, when more than 11 million jobless Americans were in relief rolls.

In that pre-war period, virtually all the food was given to Americans. This year more than two-thirds is being donated for relief and related uses in friendly areas abroad.

This year's donations probably will cost the federal treasury more than a half billion dollars, which would be a record in terms of dollars.

The bulk of the food is taken from surplus stocks acquired by the agriculture department under its farm price support program. Much of it is of a perishable character. If it were not put to use there might be heavy losses through spoilage and deterioration.

Federal agencies which participate in the food program include the agriculture department, foreign operations administration and defense department.

Activities of FOA and the defense department are confined to gifts abroad. The agriculture department is supplying available food in this country and overseas.

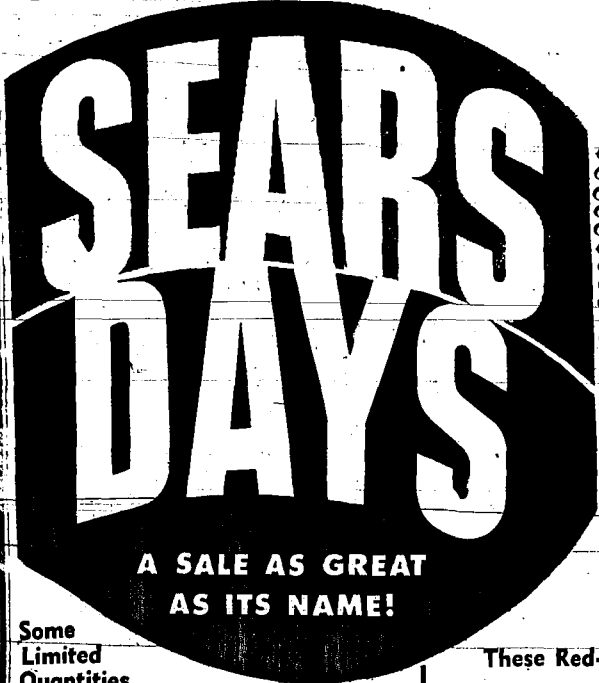
