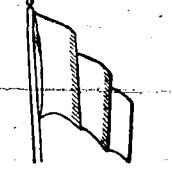

Safety Lane to Start Here Saturday, Continue Every Week-End for Month

By local mechanics that all drivers will take the time (it requires only a couple of minutes) to get that sticker on their windshields. The 10-point safety check includes the following items: Brakes. Should stop a moving car in 30 feet at 20 miles-per-hour. Should take hold evenly on all wheels. Hand brake should hold car under any conditions. Brake fluid should be kept clean and at proper level. With a brake check block, one inch is the minimum allowable floor clearance before brake take hold. Headlights. Lights should give maximum light for road, minimum light for glare. Upper and lower beams should be in good working order. Lenses should be clean and reflectors bright at all times. Rear and stop lights. All bulbs should be checked.

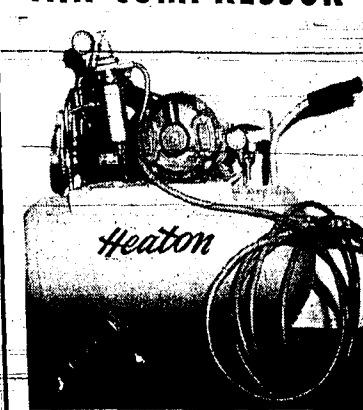

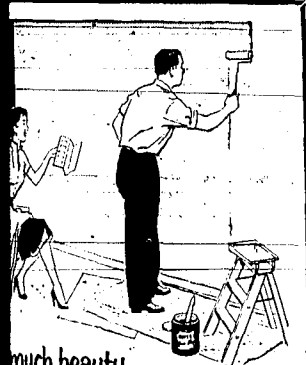

TEN YEARS AFTER

Ten years have gone by since the end of World War II, and the free world has not gained the golden peace men believed they were fighting for.

The supreme objective of World War II was to crush Hitler, the noisy tyrant who had good stories nearly the whole of Europe.

Across the world in Asia, Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalist regime, torn by strife and corroded by corruption, buckled and collapsed before the onslaughts of a Chinese red army.

America and its western friends banded together in unprecedented peacetime alliance to form NATO and thus erect a defensive barrier to check the westward flow of Russian communism.

Ten years to the dot, the once-hated Germans have been freed of the conqueror's yoke and drawn into the new combat on the free world's side.

They forget that a Hitler unchallenged would have dominated Europe, its vast resources of men and resources, its colossal possessions.

Today China is gone again, and so is part of Europe. But at least the west is still free and some of Asia is awake to the peril.

UN-MILITARY IKE. When President Eisenhower was running for his present office in 1952, some critics charged that he was a "military man in the White House."

The answer, from those who knew him best, was that he was a very "un-military" general, in the sense that he had a deep dedication to peace and a broad, open-minded attitude.

Now here he is, proving it, combatting his own top military men on the matter of appropriations, seeking to temper the more militant views of some.

REUNION. The biggest kick of all for Harry Truman during his recent Washington visit was a secret session carrying the code name "Incognito."

It was held at the home of his former speech writer, Clark Clifford. It included a couple of senators, Lex Hiffe, former secretary of the senate, and George Allen, the former RFG chairman.

General Harry Vaughan, Truman's army and military aide, was conspicuous by his absence at the session, however.

BUILDING BOOM. Norman P. Mason, commissioner of the federal housing administration, sees no need to be alarmed by the so-called "building boom."

"I don't want to be like the young mother who, when things are going well, asks her husband to get up and see why the baby's not crying," he told the Southwestern Savings and Loan conference at New Orleans, La.

Officials Vote To Fire Ruler For Viet Nam

SAIGON, South Viet Nam, May 6 (AP)—A feet-stamping, shouting 4,000-man national congress declared by acclamation yesterday the end of ex-empire Bao Dai's rule over South Viet Nam.

At the same time another congress, made up of 700 local and provincial councilors and tribal chiefs, demanded that Bao Dai's powers be given now to American-supported Premier Ngo Dinh Diem, leaving it to an elected national assembly to depose Bao Dai.

Both congresses called for general elections within four to six months to choose the national assembly and set up a workable government. They urged Diem in the meantime to use his national troops to crush the Binh Xuyen rebels who rule in South Viet Nam's week-old civil war.

The executive committees of the congress split over whether to give Diem full power to organize the elections. The national congress wanted the premier to form a provisional government which would prepare for the voting, but another group favored giving Diem himself full power to make these preparations.

When all details of their formal resolutions have been finally settled, Diem will forward them to Bao Dai with a request that he choose among them. Bao Dai, once emperor of the small Indochinese state of Annam, means establishing a stable government in the country.

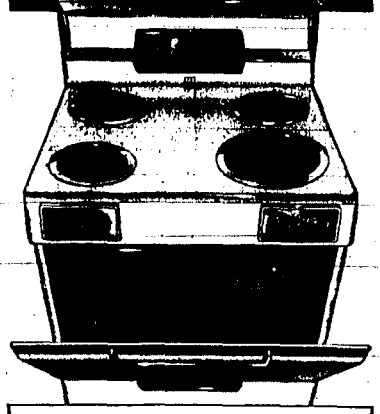

Windsor, 44 On Airplane Escape Hurt

PARIS, May 6 (AP)—The Duke of Windsor and 44 other passengers aboard a British airplane escaped injury today when the undercarriage of the plane collapsed after landing on a flight from London. The twin-engine Elizabethan airliner of British European Airways toppled over onto its right wing tip and crunched the propeller when a wheel buckled. The plane had landed safely at Le Bourget field and was turning off the rain-slicked runway at the end of the landing run when the undercarriage collapsed. The American-born duchess of Windsor, for whose love the duke abdicated the British throne, was not aboard the plane. An airline spokesman said the pilot already had braked the plane to normal taxiing speed and was turning off the runway when the right main wheel of the tricycle landing gear collapsed. The accident amounted only to a bump for the passengers as the plane settled over slowly onto its right wing tip, the spokesman said.

Job With City Linger for Legal Official

COEUR D'ALENE, May 6 (AP)—When William B. McFarland accepted appointment as Coeur d'Alene city attorney in January, 1921, he thought he had taken on a job which would be over in three months. But instead he has held the position ever since and is now headed for at least another two years in office following his reappointment by the city's new mayor, P. A. Christianson.

"I really had no idea I would be city attorney all this time," McFarland commented recently when city officials honored him on his 68th birthday. He has held the position for half of his lifetime.

"I guess one reason I have stayed on with the work is because I really like municipal law," he added.

And city officials, both present and past, are ready to add to this that his long tenure is a continuing tribute to a job well done.

The now-graying city attorney received his first appointment from H. P. Glindemann, one of seven former Coeur d'Alene mayors still living.

"The appointment came when R. V. Leeper resigned to move to Lewiston with three months of Glindemann's term yet to run. But when Glindemann was succeeded in May, 1921, by the late Dr. J. G. Dwyer, McFarland was reappointed and has been every two years since.

He has served under 14 mayors, including Christianson, whose terms have ranged from four months to nearly five years.

During that time, McFarland has drawn up approximately half of the 1022 city ordinances enacted by city councils through the years.

LAS VEGAS, Nev., May 6 (AP)—Two rubber-suited frogmen swam into the upper end of Lake Mead last night thus completing a 26-day, 270-mile swim down the Colorado river through the Grand Canyon.

William K. Bear, 26, and John Daggett, 27, both Los Angeles, arrived in good condition. They said "it was very cold in the water" but the hazardous trip "was uneventful."

Bear and Daggett entered the Colorado river at Lee's Ferry at the southern entrance to the Grand Canyon on Easter Sunday. They spent from five to six hours a day in the water, averaging about 15 miles a day.

They carried provisions wrapped in waterproof packs and camped on the banks of the turbulent river at night.

Employment Has 3-State Increase

SAN FRANCISCO, May 6 (AP)—Non-farm employment of wage and salary workers in California, Oregon and Washington rose in mid-March to 5,025,000, up 100,000 over March, 1924, according to figures released today by the department of labor.

The department's bureau of labor statistics said the 48,220 increase in February was slightly in excess of normal seasonal expectations and was spread generally over most industries.

California wage and salary employment reached 3,875,000 in mid-March, 37,000 more than in February and nearly 90,000 more than last March. Oregon gained 3,000 for a total of 440,000 while Washington totaled 710,000 up 8,000 from February.
