### Concrete and Earth Shelters Withstand Nuclear Weapons' Furies

Another shredded house was unaffected. The commander of task force said the tank group which rode out the blast in 55 tanks at 2,100 yards, said they might have been twice as close without danger.

Moreover, scores of test dogs, rats, rabbits, guinea pigs and mice survived the blast in shelters, both surface and underground, from 1,050 to 2,750 feet. R. L. Corbie, director of civil effects tests for the atomic energy commission, said 24 hours later, "I doubt that any were killed."

Civil defense heads were encouraged by the fact that two concrete block type houses withstood the blast at the seven-eighth mile point, only their windows and doors failed to hold.

Some of the weapons the military uses may prove useful in helping civilians survive. Army tank experts have suggested that tanks and the other big, track-laying vehicles like armored personnel carriers, would be valuable to helping remove civilians from a bombed city.

Very clear was the need for protection in homes from flying glass and other debris. Even in homes that withstood the awful blast, mannequins, draperies and walls were riddled or pitted by shivers of glass, and floors were covered with a carpet of glass pebbles.

While a shelter may stand up under the hammering fist of an atomic blast, this is no assurance that humans would come through unharmed from the physical effects of blast or pressure to which they were subjected. The experiment with animals ranging from mice to dogs were designed to obtain vital information on this point of the biological effects of blast within shelters. It will take some months for these studies to be completed.

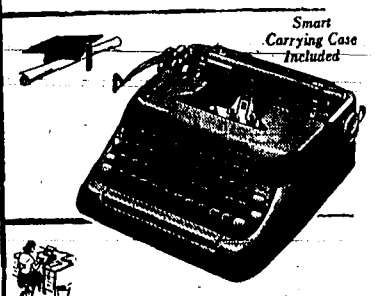

WHOSE RESPONSIBILITY? Busy diplomats of several nations are setting out to promote the Formosan negotiations between Red China and the United States which both countries say they are willing to conduct.

This activity began in earnest after President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles reversed America's earlier stand and stripped away the stiff sanctions first attached as a prelude to negotiations.

In this effort, in this more receptive attitude toward talks which might lead to a cease-fire in the Formosa strait, the President appears to have the support of a majority in congress. He even has the declared backing of 12 senators of his own party, who signed a statement to that effect.

But, while these views are being made evident and while foreign diplomats try to bring the prospective negotiators together, a small bloc of American lawmakers are endeavoring to prevent any negotiations at all from taking place.

Their leader, of course, is Senator Knowland, officially listed as the GOP senate minority leader but in fact merely the chief of the faction that gives Mr. Eisenhower his toughest foreign policy opposition.

Terribly sincere, Knowland apparently believes that even to sit down with the communists is to "appease" them. He seems to feel that we have no talent for standing our ground.

The logical thought following from this viewpoint is that negotiations with communists are barred. Senator Jenner of Indiana recently came close to that proposition when he offered a resolution to ban any conference—or even steps leading to a conference—that might result in the transfer of any territory to a communist power.

If there are to be no negotiations, then tense international situations either cannot be resolved or can only be settled by war. The communists do not wish all the political battles. Circumstances change sometimes in favor of the free nations. And when they do, negotiations may offer solutions that earlier seemed impossible.

These are possibilities we must be ever alert to capture. We can never shut the door on negotiation so long as there is any sensible hope at all they might prove productive. Senator Knowland and his small but vocal band of followers are trying by their steady shouting to freeze this government in rigid, inflexible positions. They are trying to impose a veto in foreign-policy fields where they have no proper right to exercise it.

They are in fact blocking the management of this nation's diplomacy, which the Constitution places in the hands of the President. Fortunately, most of their lawmaking colleagues seem to feel that management should remain where it belongs, and that this country should be free to negotiate when negotiation may be to its advantage—free to "waive peace" as well as war.

NO SADNESS HERE Democratic planners shaping the outlines of next year's presidential convention at Chicago have something in the works that all television viewers will be delighted to hear. They're cooking up a plan to allow other convention business to proceed while individual state delegations are being polled at the request of particular delegates.

OVERWHELMING GOP FIGHT FOR A WHILE there was a division within Republican ranks over questions related to communism, as during the McCarthy hearings. ### Farmers Get Short End in Time Change

ST. PAUL, Minn., May 7 (AP)—Bossy gets along fine on daylight saving time, a professor said today. It's the farmer who gets the short end of the deal.

Prof. J. B. Fitch of the University of Minnesota's dairy department said there seems to be some confusion about it.

"Some people must think the farmer fights against daylight time because it will throw his cows off schedule," he said. "That's not it. It's the farmer himself who is thrown for a loop. For the cows it would be fine."

**Intervals Constant**

A farmer can milk his cows at intervals of 12 hours, or 10 and 14 hours or even eight and 16 hours. Most cows don't mind at all. They keep right on turning out the same milk in the same old pails. The fat, protein and lactose content all turn out about the same.

But here's what happens to the farmer—his family and his herd—when the farmer has to work on a sun-time—regardless of how city folks set their clocks.

**Sun Decides**

He can't go into the fields until the dew is off the ground—and the sun decides that, not the clock.

He can't finish until the usual sun time—no matter what the clock says.

When the light, hard day is done, the farmer and his family and herd men freshen up and go into town for the highlight of the day—perhaps a little shopping and some entertainment.

There's the rub.

The farmer figures there must have been some mistake.

**Stores Closed**

"There's no one around"—Fitch said. "They find the stores closed an hour earlier. These things have already started."

"The farmer discovers he's out of step with the rest of the world. And he can't do anything about it. He can't set the sun up an hour like the city folks juggle their clocks."

"Don't worry about the cows," Fitch said. "The farmer is the guy who pays."

### Idaho County School Bonds Are Approved

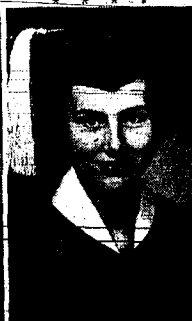

### Year Is Seen Besting Mark In Prosperity

HOT SPRINGS, Va., May 7 (AP)—Business leaders heard today that the production and income boom is well on its way to make 1955 the most prosperous year in American history.

The appraisal was presented amid unusual anxiety at the spring meeting here of the business advisory council of the commerce department.

The council's membership includes the head of some 100 of the largest corporations and high government officials.

3. No "soft spots" were visible in the industrial economy, participants said, though some experts on-hand looked apprehensively at automobiles and housing. "Just because," one member said, "they are so far in front of the parade."
4. Some let-up in the production race may occur in the second half of the year, but the consensus was that this will be slight. The slack period of the auto industry, during the model changeover this fall will be "the shortest on record," it was predicted.

# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

A feeling of accomplishment, excitement and a little sadness will be experienced by HEYBURN high school students on the evening of May 19, 1955. When the senior class will receive diplomas from the high school next fall pupils of the four high school grades will register at the new county central high school northeast of Heyburn.

The first Heyburn school was organized in 1905. Six years ago, when the project was settled, the first school building was located on Fanny Williams hill near the railroad tracks.

The school was a small, two-room building and housed 40 pupils from the first to eighth grades. A cloth curtain separated the two rooms and an oil stove furnished the heat. There were few roads in those days and the children traveled to school on foot, through sand and sagebrush. A few rode horses, sometimes as many as three or four children on a horse. Willis E. Durham and Ada Hall were the first teachers.

More families with children were arriving to homestead on the project and in 1906 the school was moved to a three-room building the children called the "Sheep Shed." The school was located a little south and east of the present grade school. Ninth grades had classes there. Z. V. Robb, E. C. Blyden and Lillian Fisher were the instructors.

As the school attendance grew, classes were held in other buildings in the village including the old Presbyterian church.

Four rooms of the present grade school were completed in 1909 and were used as a combined grade and high school. Bixler was superintendent. A few years later three more rooms and a gymnasium were added to the building. J. B. Fridley was superintendent from 1916 to 1925. It was during the first part of his nine years as head of the school that first modern rest rooms were installed.

A few years before the high school was built the grade school attendance had increased to such an extent that three separate one-room buildings were built to accommodate the increased attendance. The buildings were located on the ground where the high school now stands.

The high school was completed for classes in 1938 while J. M. Whiting was superintendent. The Heyburn art exhibit was inaugurated during his superintendency. Heyburn's permanent collection of 44 oil paintings is the largest privately owned collection in the state. The pictures are exhibited in the hall at the high school.

It still is undecided what will happen to the collection now that the high school is being discontinued but the general consensus is that the paintings will stay where they are and will become a community project.

## U. S. Business Moves Against Labor May Bar Peaceful Era

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—Business interests across the nation today are seeking to lighten federal and state controls on labor unions and further curb the power of organized labor. These moves point to no "peace" between labor and management.

The National Association of Manufacturers is encouraging local business groups to press for "right-to-work" laws in the 20 states which do not have such legislation. These laws would ban the union shop. In which a worker must join a union after accepting a job. The Taft-Hartley law already forbids the closed shop, in which only union members can be hired by an employer.

The U. S. Chamber of Commerce has lined up with the NAM in supporting action "to guarantee the five 4-H projects in his five years of membership."
