

Welcome Rain Aids Drought Choked Areas

The organized prayers of drought-stricken Texas and Oklahomans were answered today with million-dollar rains. The downpours were laced with winds and storms which were blamed for at least six deaths in Texas alone. But they seemed like an answer from heaven to drought-plagued farmers.

Meanwhile a May cold wave threatened the northern midwest with frost and moved in on 90-degree temperatures in the southeast.

The townspeople of Lampaesa, Tex., and Hobart, Okla., had organized "prayers for rain" and mass demonstrations of faith that rains would come in hopes of ending weeks of crop-choking drought.

Their prayers were answered. "The rains came to Lampaesa yesterday after radio station KCVL organized its "prayers for rain" day. All regular commercial programs had been canceled while ministers and laymen took turns praying.

Answers came in the form of rain at noon. In Lampaesa there was .55 of an inch by late last night. As much as an inch and a half pelted the surrounding country and 2.25 inches swelled the near-by Colorado river.

Prayers of thanks were broadcast over the radio station.

At Hobart, plagued by a three-year drought, upwards of 7,000 people were seen holding umbrellas under cloudless skies last Saturday to demonstrate their faith that it would rain.

A steady rain began falling at Saturday night. Hobart has since had an inch and a half of rain.

The rains which began in Texas Sunday, have been worth literally millions of dollars. Wide areas in the state's central, north and western sections received thorough dousings.

Death Claims Pioneer Buhl Woman at 71

BUHL, May 10—Mrs. Emma Pemberton, 71, a Buhl resident since 1906, died at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday at St. Joseph's hospital.

Mrs. Pemberton was born April 2, 1884, at Alma, Wis. She was married to E. H. Pemberton Jan. 21, 1903, at Chicago, Ill. They came to Buhl in 1906 from Gilmanston among the early pioneers. They homesteaded four and one-half miles south of Buhl and have since had a large farm.

Mrs. Pemberton was a member of the First Presbyterian church, First Orange, Kensington club, Buhl Rebekah lodge and the Modern Women's club of America. Two sons and one daughter preceded her in death.

Surviving are her husband; two daughters, Mrs. James Riedel, Moscow, and Mrs. Edith Stange, Tacoma, Wash.; two sons, Herbert Pemberton, Buhl, and a keynote on active participation in community problems when they return to their homes.

Experts Warn Not to Be Careless of Polio; Rules and Suggestions Given

NEW YORK, May 11 (AP)—Polio specialists are afraid the mere existence of the Salk anti-polio vaccine may make some people careless about polio, which would be too bad because polio is not something to toy with.

When someone is about to come down with polio, there usually is a fever. The fever may be accompanied by headache, lassitude, sweating, nausea, vomiting, constipation, diarrhea.

During the summer polio season, fever in combination with any of the others is justification enough for calling a doctor. If there also is sore throat or stiff neck or back, walk fast when you walk to the phone.

When it comes to deciding whether a slight illness is the beginning of a polio case, doctors divide the possibilities into three categories—abortive, non-paralytic, and paralytic.

There isn't much doubt about the full-blown paralytic case for very long. These cases proceed quickly to paralysis which may be temporary. But there may be much doubt about abortive and non-paralytic cases.

The truth is that the first signs may be almost anything. The ill person just doesn't feel well. The symptoms are vague, a doctor can't say positively what it is which produces fever and "general malaise." The patient seems to get well. But four to seven days later, he is ill again and this second time the central nervous system may be involved with the danger of permanent paralysis.

Usually this does not happen in abortive or non-paralytic cases, but it can. This is why any vague illness during the polio season should be looked at and watched by a skilled and knowing person.

The chances are that polio is not the danger. But when there are quite a few polio cases in the community, these chances are lessened. The summer polio season has already started in the deep south and is moving northward.

Polio specialists estimate that from 50 per cent of all polio illnesses are abortive. Indeed, the signs are so feeble that many people do not even know they are ill. But abortive cases produce a "mild" form of polio which is being passed by healthy "carriers" of polio viruses.

They excrete viruses which in another human body may cause paralysis or even death. Therefore, the rules of personal hygiene and ordinary sanitation should be observed most rigidly during polio seasons.

Sudden chilling is bad. So is violent exercise by persons unaccustomed to it or anything which brings about inordinate fatigue. These things have been known to make latent viruses active.

But people should be calm and live their accustomed lives, polio specialists say. They warn against "Polio-phobia" as well as against a person who is so afraid of polio, that he fears, alone makes him ill. In extreme cases, there may even be paralytic symptoms, along with fever and other symptoms. It's amazing what the "fear" that is being passed by the carrier can do to the body.

Aerial Battle Hurts Hopes For Meeting

TOKYO, May 11 (AP)—Diplomatic sources today expressed concern that the battle between U. S. and Chinese Communist planes yesterday may have jeopardized chances for early Washington-Peking talks and release of American airmen imprisoned in Red China.

The U. S. air force said that two and possibly three Communist F-26s were shot down by American F-80 Sabrejets in the clash off North Korea yesterday. The announcement said a flight of 12 to 15 MiGs attacked a flight of eight Sabrejets "over international waters" and that the Americans returned the fire.

But Communist China had a different version. It claimed the American planes violated Chinese territory and that the Red planes shot down one U. S. plane and damaged two others.

It was the third aerial clash between Americans and Communists in the same general area in the past 18 months. But it was the first in which Red China admitted its planes were involved.

The diplomatic source feared that the latest incidents will have far greater international impact than any of the others. It was pointed out that it came when tensions appeared to be lessening in the Far East.

Indian diplomat V. K. Krishna Menon arrived in Red China yesterday at the invitation of Chinese Communist Premier Chou En-lai. It was believed that Menon would try to arrange for talks between the United States and Red China on the Formosa issue and for the freeing of American airmen held as captives in Red Chinese jails.

Menon was scheduled to meet with Chou in Peking today. It was feared yesterday's incident would make his task even more difficult. Chinese Communist claims to victory in the air battle were quickly knocked down by the air force. A spokesman said that all of the eight F-80 Sabrejets involved returned safely to their bases.

The Reds made no mention of any Communist losses.

Organized Effort Being Made to Gain Help of Clergy in Road Safety Chore

NEW YORK, May 11—The first organized effort to enlist support of clergymen and religious groups in the traffic safety movement is gaining "enthusiastic" acceptance across the nation by leaders of all faiths, Thomas N. Bowie, accident prevention department manager of the Association of Casualty and Surety Companies, said here today.

The new program, launched less than a month ago, is keyed to the belief that safe driving is a moral responsibility. Its aim is to influence the nation's religious groups, which are the foundation of man's religious experience to attitudes and actions behind the wheel.

The clergy in nearly 20 states have already endorsed this goal. As part of the program, the association has prepared a special address which highlights the moral and ethical aspects of the highway accident problem. It is intended for use as a potential sermon, church school lesson or group discussion topic.

Some 10,000 copies have been distributed through the National Council of Churches and numerous safety organizations with church affiliations. In commenting on the new project, many religious leaders have urged the association to establish a "safety-Sunday." Such a day, planned, Bowie said, but on a local basis, should be held annually to select the date it considers most suitable. That the overall program has struck a responsive chord is indicated by the many favorable letters that have come into the accident prevention department. The following are a few typical statements:

"If we could only be constantly concerned about our neighbors, including those we meet on highways and crossings, we would have few accidents." Lieut.-Gen. John C. H. "Duke" A. A. Webb, vice-president of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew.

"I shall plan to preach a sermon on the subject."

Memoir Medals of War Eyed; Columnist Proffers Candidate

BY HIAL ROYCE
NEW YORK, May 11 — I suppose that now, 20 years after the war ended, it is fair to start passing out the memoir medals.
Lieut.-Col. Jay Vessels of the U. S. Air Force is the first candidate. He never piloted a plane. But a dozen years ago he ruled the skies over Tunisia with his typewriter just as the British navy before had bossed the Mediterranean with a couple of cruties, a few destroyers and an agile battery of mine-sweeping machines.
Ordinarily a newspaperman goes for financial reasons, such as the desire to earn enough money to send his sons through college.
Jay was an exception. He left his secure newspaper post in Minneapolis to join the army because he was a tip-toeing patriot.
He had been an enlisted infantryman in the first world war, and they made him an officer in the second world war. He rose from lieutenant to lieutenant colonel but never lost his fear of sergeants.

Everything he did was unorthodox. To keep his gray press camp rolling from Tunisia through Sicily, Italy and France he had, sweated, brewed and stole supplies. But although this skinny, black-eyed little former doughboy was frightened by any sergeant he would go in and hand out any general to get what he felt was needed to do his job. And the man knew what his job was. It was to tell the combat story of the close-up combat airmen. If they ever give a medal for more than three stars.

He was a guerrilla operator and he operated a guerrilla press camp. As a public relations officer, he ran certainly the most unorthodox press camp of the war.
Jay lost his heart at the start to the P40 pilots, guys who fought the better equipped German fighters to a draw with a slower, low-altitude but heavier armed plane.
His heroes at that time were Col.

Warning Goes To Farmer on Treating Seed

Wheat treated for seed purposes must not be mixed with wheat under purchase agreement and commodity credit corporation loan, according to Lloyd S. Jones, chairman of the Twin Falls county agricultural stabilization and conservation committee.

"Mixture of chemically treated seed wheat with other non-treated wheat makes the wheat ineligible for delivery to CCC to satisfy a loan or for delivery under a CCC purchase agreement," Jones states. "Each year some wheat is condemned for food use by health authorities because it contains seed-treatment chemicals."

Jones says the grower should keep letter over treated seed separate from other wheat. "Mixing such treated seed with 'market' wheat merely means destroying the value of the entire lot for food purpose and as security for a loan," he asserts.

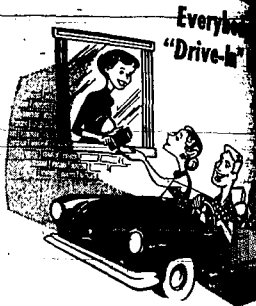

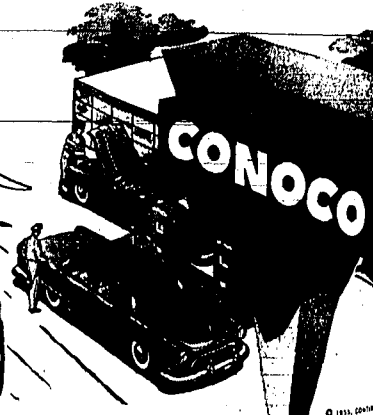

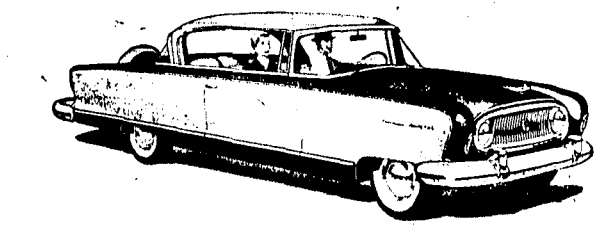

WASHINGTON, May 11 (AP) Sen Margaret Chase Smith said today she thinks President Eisenhower "prefers to retire" after 1956.

House Republican leader Joseph W. Martin, Jr., R-Mass., and Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson both reassured the Republican women on the administration's "long-range steady plan of dealing with those who seek to disturb the peace."

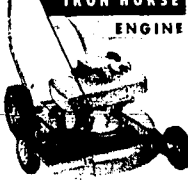

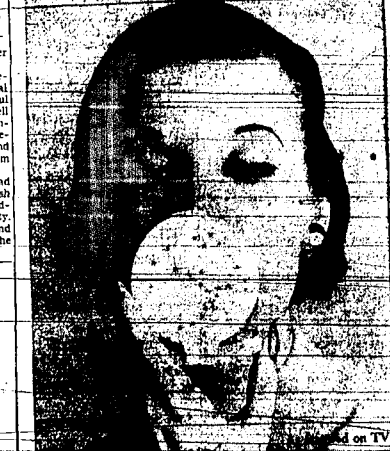

Threats to children are wasted breath. They live in the moment and are usually unable to carry the consequences of an action as much as an adult can. They cannot, as adults can, keep in mind the consequences of an action and be guided by the thought. They cannot do that until they are far more mature by experience.

Soviets Proffer Peace Plan; Disarmament Is Major Item

MOSCOW, May 11.—The Soviet Union published today a mammoth peace proposal including a world disarmament plan it said could "end the cold war."

Publication coincided with reports in diplomatic circles Soviet Premier Marshal Nikolai Bulganin would agree in principle to an invitation by the west to attend a big four meeting "at the summit."

Bulganin was in Warsaw where the Soviet and seven east European nations were expected to set up today an "eastern NATO" to counter the rearming of West Germany.

The Soviet proposal called for withdrawal of occupation forces from East and West Germany, the setting up of international controls to prevent war preparations and the banning of atomic warfare. It would decrease the international tension

and end the cold war."

The declaration, to be presented to the United Nations for adoption, would limit the Soviet, Communist Chinese and U. S. armies to 1,500,000 men each and the armies of Britain and France to 850,000 each. Basic foreign soil would be dismantled.

It called for settlement of all outstanding world problems including those in the far east through negotiation and the admission of Red China to the U. N. security council. It said adoption of the proposals should be taken immediately to decrease the international tension

officials expressed annoyance at Moscow's leak of the proposals—the third major Soviet breach of a secrecy pledge surrounding the London talks.
