Medical Records Important at Hospital

"Conscience of Hospital" Exhibit Set For Open House Planned Here Sunday

The medical records department may well be described as the "conscience of the hospital," says Dr. Morton Cutler, president of the medical staff of Magic Valley Memorial hospital, in preparation for the opening of the department for public inspection during open house Sunday.

Medical records probably are the most important single factor showing evidence of the quality of patient care rendered at any hospital, he points out.

"Primarily the responsibility of the attending physician, adequate medical records are used extensively by the medical staff in reviewing and analyzing the work of the clinical departments.

"The responsibility for examining medical records of all patients at the local hospital rests with the medical records committee which consists of seven physicians who meet for a period of from two to three hours at least once a month.

Dr. Vern Anderson, chairman of the committee, points out that no personal interests enter into the reviewing process by committee members. The results of the review are educational, constructive, objective and unbiased.

He says all medical records must be completed promptly or they will lose their value rapidly because of the impossibility for any physician to remember all the facts related to a specific patient. Medical records are maintained by each doctor day by day to insure accuracy and completeness.

The medical records department is under the supervision of Mary Ann Nelson, registered medical records librarian. Her duties not only include the routine work of making reports concerning admissions, births and discharges, but she also briefs and transcribes case histories and supervises the entering and coding of diagnoses.

Dr. Cutler points out that working with the medical records committee are the consultation and tissue committees. The consultation committee has the responsibility of reviewing all records where consultation has been requested by the attending physician.

The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals states that a minimum of 15 per cent of all patients treated in a hospital can benefit from consultation. The consultation rate at the hospital here is 12.8 per cent and well above the nationally accepted average.

The tissue committee is charged with the responsibility of reviewing medical records where the pre-operative and post-operative diagnosis do not agree with the pathologist's diagnosis. It also reviews all deaths and reports on autopsy percentages.

The accreditation commission states that a net death rate in a hospital above four per cent should be investigated. The death rate at the local hospital for adults is 4.5 per cent and for newborn babies 11.7 per cent.

Dr. Cutler emphasizes the amount of time given by members of the medical staff to the evaluation of the medical records and points out that on these three committees alone.

In conclusion, Dr. Cutler refers to the value of the medical record to the patient. Every illness involves a more or less extensive study with an accumulation of a large amount of detailed information. Physicians see many patients every day and the written record is needed for reference as it is impossible for them to remember the details of each case.

The patient of today may become ill some time in the future with the same or another illness with perhaps a change of physicians and hospitals. The record of previous hospitalization, if complete, will save repetitions of tests and expensive examinations.

To the hospital the medical record is a book of facts which contains information relative to the competency of the medical staff. The hospital is responsible to know the exact result produced and the reasons.

To the physician the medical record is a recognized factor in continuing his education. When members of the staff are analyzing the work of the hospital they are studying in detail its successes and failures. They are comparing their own results with those achieved elsewhere.

Having a medical records department under the supervision of a qualified librarian and having a medical staff that is interested in "meeting more than the minimum requirements" are another big reason why Magic Valley Memorial hospital was fully accredited by the accreditation commission, Dr. Cutler says.

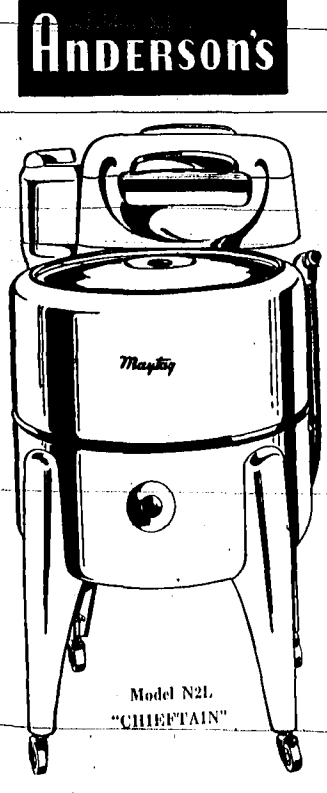



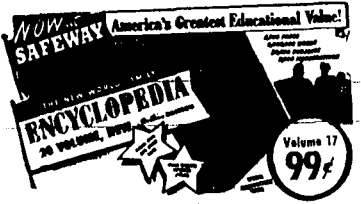

Mamie Whips Flu, Eases on Social Affairs

WASHINGTON, May 12 (AP)—Mrs. Mamie Eisenhower is completely recovered from her spring bout with the flu but she still is taking it easy in her social activities.

Gen. Howard M. Snyder, White House physician, said today her condition is "about her usual state of health."

She and the President and her mother, Mrs. Eisenhower, are planning to observe Mrs. Eisenhower's 77th birthday Friday night at their Gettysburg, Pa., farm.

The White House said they probably will drive up when Mr. Eisenhower gets through with his cabinet meeting tomorrow, about noon. They probably will return to Washington Sunday evening.

Meanwhile, the President is continuing to fill some of his wife's social engagements. Today's calendar included the congressional club cocktail, a group of children of members of congress who originally were scheduled to meet Mrs. Eisenhower. Dr. Snyder said Mrs. Eisenhower overcame the flu with no after-effects. He said there were no side reactions from any drugs, so some of the "temporary inconveniences."

Politics Enter Fray

The principal after effect seems to have been the political storm which boiled up shortly after her flu attack early in March. Some politicians "took the opinion—Mrs. Eisenhower wouldn't run for re-election in 1956 because of Mrs. Eisenhower's health."

The President later said his wife's health is generally as good as ever. But he didn't say how that might influence his decision on whether to run again next year.

Calamity Howlers With Us Always



U. S. Files Big Antitrust Suit Against Advertising Groups

WASHINGTON, May 12 (AP)—Attorney General Herbert Brownell, Jr., announced the filing of an antitrust suit today against the American Newspaper Publishers Association, the American Association of Advertising Agencies and four other publishing groups.

The suit charged the defendants with conspiring to restrain trade and fix prices and with operating a "recognition system." It was filed in the southern district of New York.

Besides the ANPA and the Advertising Agencies and four other publishing groups, the suit named the Publishers Association of New York City; Associated Business Publications, Inc., of New York City; the Periodical Publishers Association of America and the Agricultural Publishers Association of Chicago, Ill.

Basically, the suit attacked the commission system used by the advertising agency group.

It alleged, first, that the agency association and its members conspired in fix advertising commissions at 15 per cent of the gross newspaper

used to discuss the case unless the ANPA first agreed to a consent order.

(Under a consent order a defendant agrees to stop a practice without admitting that he has violated the law.)

Brownell denied Stocum's charges and accused the ANPA of a "complete misrepresentation of our views."

"The new attack by Stocum indicates he does not desire further discussion," Brownell said.

The Justice department's complaint against the publishers and the Advertising Agency association was drafted several months ago. It first was announced—publicly—some two weeks ago during the ANPA convention in New York by Eliza Hansen, counsel for the publishing organization.

Stocum said in Chicago that the government was trying to "saddle the press with a continuing injunction."

The ANPA also has charged that one of the effects of the government's action would be to put the entire business of gathering and disseminating information by advertising in a straitjacket of judicial control.

Victory for West Seen by General

LONDON, May 12 (AP)—Supreme allied commander Gen. Alfred M. Gruenther said definitively yesterday that Russia would be defeated in war right now because of the long-range bombers.

"I feel that within the next three or four years we are going to be able to continue our advantage in this long range air capability," Gruenther said, referring to American and British bombing aircraft.

This was the first time the allied commander has said directly that Russia would be beaten in any war starting now. Other allied leaders have said the Soviet bloc has no answer right now for the west's long-range air power.

Four Young Boys Perish in Flames

LOS ANGELES, May 12 (AP)—Four brothers, the oldest aged 4, were burned to death last night when their 10-year-old half sister accidentally set fire to some rags while searching for a diaper with a lighted candle.

Parents of the victims, Mr. and Mrs. Leroy Franklin, were at a movie when the tragedy occurred at the garage apartment in the Watts area.

The 10-year-old girl, Marjorie, was pulled to safety by neighbors who were unable to save the tots, Leroy, Jr., 4, Billy Ray 3, Lewis 3, and Michael, 4 months.

The grief-stricken Negro parents explained they lacked money to pay the electric bill and that for the first time in months they had some out of the house to a movie.

They claim Beedy was working for Lewis Construction company, Great Falls, and that firm had a contract with WWPP when a wind truck came in contact with a 13,000-volt line and he was killed.

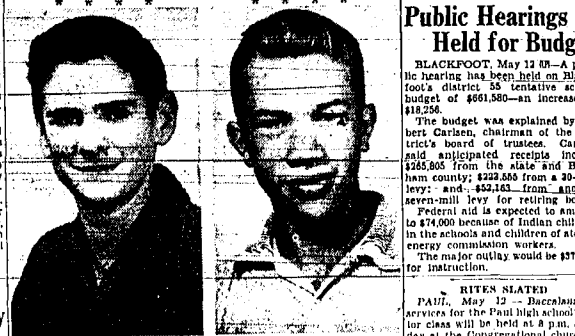

Egg Producer Gets Order to Hire Employee

SAN FRANCISCO, May 12 (AP)—A national labor relations board trial examiner today gave the Idaho Egg Producers office in Pocatello 30 days in which to reinstate "without prejudice" an employee fired last November.

In his findings and recommendations, Trial Examiner Maurice M. Miller told the firm it must compensate the discharged employee, Mrs. Ferna Herzinger, for lost wages.

Action Promised
If this is not done or the firm does not pledge to do it within 30 days, then Miller asked the board to issue an order to require the company to comply under provisions of the national labor relations act.

Miller's recommendations came after testimony by both sides. He found the company's business placed it under provisions of the NLR act and that it had violated these provisions "by its discriminatory failure to attempt to reemploy" Mrs. Herzinger from July 12, 1954, to Aug. 2, 1954, and by her discharge on Nov. 22, 1954.

Miller found that the company proposed to "unfair labor practices within the meaning of the act."

Other Order
He ordered it to "cease and desist from" interfering with employees' efforts to organize in labor unions, the Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehousemen and Helpers union, Local No. 483, AFL, in Pocatello.

Mrs. Herzinger was a seasonal employee of the company. Testimony showed she attempted to help set up a union organization among its employees and once testified against the company in a complaint filed before the board. She was discharged according to Miller's findings the company later, "failed or refused" to rehire her during a seasonal employment increase, then hired her but treated her "unfairly" and finally dismissed her.

Pocatello Cited In Child Support

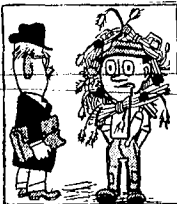
BOISE, May 12 (AP)—A Pocatello man who stopped child support payment to his former wife because she refused him custody of his son was held in contempt of court yesterday by the Idaho supreme court.

Lyle Wright, the father, had contended he was the mother who was in contempt for failing to deliver the son to him in accordance with a divorce decree modification issued in 1947.

Fifth district court ruled that the mother was never served with the modification, had no knowledge of it, and it was therefore void. This ruling was confirmed by the high court.

WASHINGTON, May 12 (AP)—You can drive a truck through the holes in the new Russian disarmament proposal.

1. This country has established a ring of military bases around Russia with the permission of friendly countries. From those bases American planes could make instant retaliation on the Russians if they began an attack.

2. The United States can't afford to appear to turn a cold shoulder on the Russian suggestion without considering them in detail.

But the very proposals raise a question: Why did the Russians make them at this particular time? American officials here don't pretend to know. All they can do is what anyone else can do: Gues.

The big western powers—the United States, Britain, France—got some word of good will this week by proposing that Russia sit down with them in peace talks. The Russians haven't yet accepted, but seem likely to.

In the meantime they came out with their disarmament offer, perhaps in an effort to offset the good reaction the allies got from their peace talk offer.

It is always possible the Russians have good intentions. But they'll have to do some proving in that regard.

For those two reasons the Russian proposals will probably get no place, although this country will give them attention.

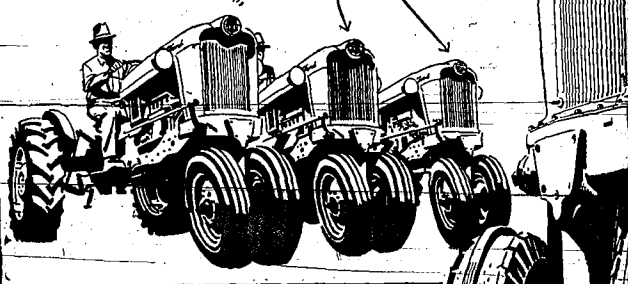

But because of the present time limitations, Salk said it is obvious that conditions for operation of the vaccine cannot possibly be obtained any sooner than the epidemic season of 1958.

Salk emphasized his recommendation that the first two inoculations be spaced not less than two-to-four weeks apart, followed by a third shot in not less than seven months still "could be expected to produce the desired effect if properly constituted vaccine is used."

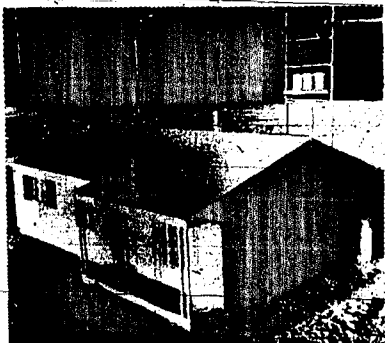

WASHINGTON, May 12 (AP)—Rep. Robert H. Mollohan said today Gen. Joseph M. Swing's personal C-47 plane symbolizes what the country can expect if President Eisenhower continues to name retired generals and admirals to top government jobs.

Swing, a West Point classmate of Mr. Eisenhower's, is commissioner of immigration and naturalization and would lead other retired generals—Maj. Gen. Frank H. Partridge and Brig. Gen. Edwin D. Howard—as assistant commissioners.

The house armed services committee voted 19 to 3 yesterday against Mollohan's motion to reconsider two senate-passed bills to let Partridge and Howard take the immigration posts.

Mollohan, West Virginia Democrat, said he will seek a show-down house vote on the issue. "He said Swing has a C-47 for his personal use on 'so-called inspection trips' at a cost of 48 cents a mile to the taxpayers. All previous commissioners used commercial transportation."

Mollohan said. "Swing's daughter, Mary Ann Mitchell Swing, was put on the immigration service payroll last October as a clerk-stenographer at better than \$4,000 a year. Mollohan said that's about three grades higher than clerk-stenographers are usually recruited at," he said.

By The Associated Press For almost a year there was a glimmer of hope in the little Moscow of eastern Europe. Stalin was dead. Beria, his secret police boss, was dead, too. The apparatus of cold terror seemed to be breaking down.

A new Soviet premier, Georgi Malenkov, was seeking to harness himself by promising the Soviet population shoes as well as guns, iceboxes and television as well as tanks and Saraginas.

Whatever happens in the Soviet Union is reflected at once in the captive countries, and throughout Europe the reversal was on. Farmers—under the much-advertised "new course," were freely leaving the national collective, a concept the governments hoped would spur their production. In the heavy "industrial" factories—there was an indication of lessening pressure on the workers.

The hope is fading today, and the little Malenkovismy who reappear—walk in dread. They seem to be on the short end of a struggle for power that is a reflection of what goes on in the remote areas. At the moment, Soviet communism seems split into two camps. On one side is the left—or Stalinist—wing presenting a hard line. On the other is the so-called "new course" or right wing representing the national collective, a concept the governments hoped would spur their production. In the heavy "industrial" factories—there was an indication of lessening pressure on the workers.

For western observers in Europe, the satellites represent a convenient mirror for what goes on inside the Soviet Union. The mirror seems to show:

1. The "wholly terror" apparatus constructed over the postwar years of Stalinism in the satellites has been disrupted.

2. Political indecision at highest levels has been induced by uncertainty over the outcome in Moscow.

3. Agriculture, the cancer tumor of the communist world, is in a state of near anarchy. The chaos was aggravated by the fact that under Malenkov, brief concessions were made to the farmers. The concessions cannot be backed up suddenly. But gradually and cautiously.

Beef Favored As Special in Food Market

By The Associated Press

Beef returns to a prominent place among the better buys in meats in the nation's food stores this week-end.

Markets will be passing on cuts in wholesale beef prices, and many meat specialists say there may be further reductions next week.

Popular features will include prime ribs, steaks, chuck steaks, roast beef, boneless chuck pot roast. Price reductions will vary from two to around six cents a pound.

Fixers again will be a favorite feature. Generally, prices will be the same as a week ago or a trifle lower.

Specials Mixed

Specials mentioned by scattered stores include legs of lamb, lamb chops, smoked plonies and ground beef.

There'll be few hazards in the pork line. Prices are higher at the wholesale level and you may find pork chop price tags in your store up four to six cents a pound from a week ago.

The U.S. department of agriculture, looking over the food situation for this month, comments that pork supplies, though not as heavy as in previous months, will continue plentiful through the spring. It adds that high-quality beef will be in seasonal abundance since the numbers of fed cattle are marketed this month.

Milk Stressed

The USDA also puts in a word for dairy products.

"Milk production continues to increase, heading toward the season's peak in June," it says. "So remember to reach often for the top thirst-quencher—a tall tumbler of cool milk. Large supplies of all the other dairy products will continue during May. Lots of cheese, butter and dry milk products are available for springtime menus."

You'll find something new in the seafood line in your supermarkets' freezer compartments soon. A big food company is marketing something called fish bites. They're balls about the size of a 50-cent piece and are made of precooked morsels of ocean fish with potatoes and seasonings added. You heat them in the oven for about 10 minutes.

Vegetables Are Vast

There's a good variety in reasonably priced vegetables. Produce specialists favor corn, potatoes, onions, radishes, spinach, escarole, endive, beets, asparagus, celery, beans and peppers.

In some sections of the country sweet potatoes also rate as good buys. Cucumbers are moderately priced.

There have been small increases in the prices of lettuce, carrots, cabbage and tomatoes.

Oranges and grapefruit are good buys in fruit, the produce markets report. Washington delicious apples are cheaper. More watermelons are arriving at the markets, but prices are still on the high side. Cantaloupes also are rather high.

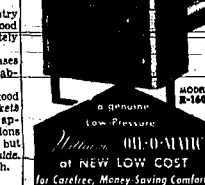
