Japanese Superstitions Beat Friday 13th's "Unluckiness"

TOKYO, May 13 (AP)—So today is Friday the 13th. You think it's unlucky? Come to Japan and you'll feel lucky if Friday the 13th was all you had to worry about. It's unlucky every day is unlucky if you're facing northeast, for instance. The ancient land of Nippon is as full of superstitions as it is of people. Northeast is the direction of the "devil's gate." It's such a bad direction that for 1,200 years a special prayer has been uttered every year by 100 priests in Kyoto to pacify the northeast. A husband told his wife they needed an extra room on their tiny house for their two growing daughters. The mother consulted the "fox god" and was told not to build for six months or risk disaster. So the family went on living like hardfords. Girls born in the year of the "fire horse" are doomed to spinsterhood. Such women, ancient sages say, are as wild as horses and very likely to kill any man who marries them. Fortunately, the "fire horse" year comes up only once every 60 years.

Industrial Region Damaged in Fire

NEW YORK, May 13 (AP)—One of the biggest fires in New York history destroyed two square blocks of a Brooklyn industrial area in a three-hour rampage last night, injuring 15 men and causing damage estimated at 100-million dollars. Rich Company Makes Plan to Lose Business

PARIS, May 13 (AP)—A company that got rich by doing a ditch is doing more business than ever before. But at the height of the boom, directors of the company are meeting in Paris to talk about going out of business.

The ditch is the Suez canal. The company that built it, Compagnie Universelle de Canal Maritime de Suez, is facing the prospect of giving it away.

When the lease expires in 1968 the canal will automatically become the property of the Egyptian government unless some new agreement is negotiated. Company officials are doubtful Egypt is interested in extending the lease.

Directors who met here this week are setting up a plan to give present stockholders shares in a new investment trust to be formed with the more than \$2 billion dollars in securities which the company holds.

Reds' Forces Strike Terror In Haiphong

HAIPHONG, May 13 (AP)—Thousands of Communist Vietnamese troops swept into the northwest section of this big seaport yesterday and immediately imposed an iron rule of fear.

Occupation of Haiphong will be completed today, ending French colonialism in North Indochina. But the Vietnamese did not wait for the final day to strike terror in Northwest Haiphong.

The occupying army of Moscow-trained Ho Chi Minh ordered a roundup of all Vietnamese who had collaborated with the French and Vietnamese forces during the long war.

Almost before the echoes of throned of Vietnamese cheering the Vietnam entry died away, the threat of arrest and imprisonment cast a black shadow over the lives of Haiphong's 230,000 citizens.

Vietnam army sound trucks blared this order: "Every person who collaborated with the French and Vietnamese forces must report immediately to the nearest police station."

The announcement ordered every Vietnamese to denounce himself if he or his wife in any way had aided the Vietnamese during the long war on the side of the French expeditionary corps.

It threatened long imprisonment for thousands of people in the support of men for mountains of U. S. war supplies sent to the French. There were thousands of French citizens who had helped in dozens of ways.

It was black Friday for the French expeditionary force in the north. It could be won a war that often lacked sympathy in Paris high councils and among French interests which had captured the territory's wealth for nearly 90 years.

Thousands of elite troops of Ho Chi Minh, with their rifles slung over their shoulders, marched into this seaport at dawn Friday.

Swiftly they will take military control of the city—their last big prize in the nearly eight years of bitter guerrilla war that ended in a military defeat for the French a year ago at Dien Bien Phu.

French troops will leave in trucks for the Son Peninsula in the south. There they will join 8,000 other fighting men. By plane and troopship they will leave for Saigon in South Viet Nam.

The Communist Vietnamese occupation of Haiphong puts the red flag with the yellow stars in the center over a vast territory from the south border of Red China to the 17th parallel. This covers half of the Indochina state of Vietnam.

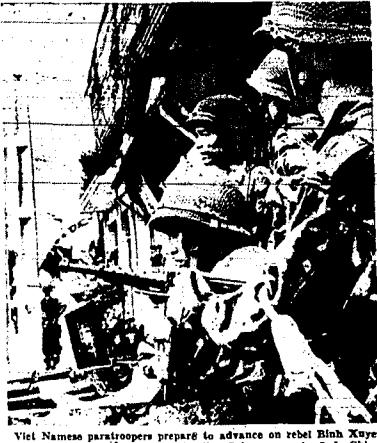

Immunity Time Upon Vaccines Still Unknown

NEW YORK, May 13 (AP)—After more than 40 years of vaccinating millions of Americans against diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis, medical scientists still cannot be sure how long the vaccinated remain immune to the disease. Maybe they'll know the answer in the next few years, but immunization scientists would bet against it.

Edward B. Stafford, of the Johns Hopkins university, Baltimore, a leading authority on tetanus, believes that each of the millions of men and women who got the tetanus shots in the armed forces during World War II should be getting "boosters" now. He suspects that their immunity may be running out.

That goes also for all persons over 40 years old who were vaccinated against tetanus as infants. He called attention to the lack of certainty as to how long tetanus immunity lasts in a recent discussion in "Surgery, Gynecology, and Obstetrics," the scientific organ of the American college of surgeons.

Vaccination Given

Nowadays most infants are given a combined diphtheria-tetanus vaccination. "Eventually nearly all Americans will possess active immunity against tetanus," he said, "but whether this immunity is permanent or not cannot be said yet." However, "this valuable health asset now enjoyed by many millions of Americans can be protected permanently by a booster injection of tetanus toxoid at intervals of five, or even 10, years."

"Booster phenomenon" built up in the body of chemistry is well known to science. Once the chemistry has been set up to manufacture a defense to a disease, the machinery, so to speak, and the machinery can be kept working by just a little more of whatever set it up in the first place.

With the Balk anti-polo vaccine, Dr. Galk believes that at least seven injections should pass between the second and third shots. Any shot given after the third shot would be a booster, too, and there is the big unanswered question of the Balk vaccine—how soon after the first booster is it needed to keep the immunity alive?

Used in War

The tetanus shot came into widespread use during the first world war, which shows that such protection is not an answer for life with the absolute certainty which science demands. Of course, tetanus, the dread "lockjaw" of the hyman, is a different disease than polo, but the "booster phenomenon" is the same.

Polo is caused by a virus, which destroys nerve cells. Lockjaw is caused by a bacterium, corynebacterium tetani, which as it develops and multiplies in the human body gives off a poison, or toxin, which is one of the most potent of all the poisons which can assail the human body. It attacks the ends of motor nerves. An untreated case of lockjaw is almost always fatal.

Some 50 years ago it was discovered that this toxin could be used to manufacture a substance which neutralized it—an antitoxin—but rarely in time to save the victim. So antitoxin was manufactured in the blood of horses, injected into human beings, it set up the machinery for the toxin-production, and when the body was challenged by the toxin.

Roger Lewis, air force assistant secretary for materiel, said in recent testimony before a House appropriations subcommittee:

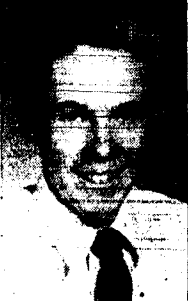
"As we take long strides in the provisioning of weapons for our strategic striking forces, we become ever more conscious of our needs for improved air defenses."

Meat Storage Disclosed for House Probe

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—The army reported to congress yesterday it has a lot of canned hamburger on hand, too—but less than it really needs.

A house government operations subcommittee, which has been making critical questions about military hamburgers, was told the army had 1,780,000 pounds of the canned product on April 1.

But, said Brig. Gen. Alfred D. Dennison, deputy quartermaster general, that is against reserve requirements of 2,225,000 pounds that would be needed in event of mobilization.

The army didn't get nearly so brisk a going-over as the navy on hamburger supplies.

What stirred up the subcommittee was a Hoover commission task force report that the navy had a 50-day supply of canned hamburger as of last August—45,000 pounds of it.

The navy has disputed this interpretation as not taking into account that 537,874 pounds of the total are set aside for combat reserves. The rest, it said, represented only a 44 months supply on hand last August, adding that reductions since then brought the figure down to a five months supply last March.

The measure, sponsored by all 31 Peronist senators, would repeal a law granting exemption from real estate and other taxes of all church property. It would subject all Catholic churches, convents, schools and other holdings to normal taxation.

The senate Wednesday voted to abolish all Catholic religious institutions in Argentina public schools. That bill is expected to be shortly approved by the Peronist-dominated chamber of deputies.

Mine Leader Warns Firms Of Dust Peril

BOISE, May 13 (AP)—State Mine Inspector George McDowell appealed to Idaho mine owners yesterday to halt the indiscriminate use of blow pipes. He said they were kicking up dust that endangers workers.

He advised them in a letter that blow pipes will be permitted for use after July 1 except to clean out drill holes which have been thoroughly wetted.

Blow pipes were originally designed to clean out holes and mine openings by means of compressed air. But McDowell noted that lately they have come to be widely used in such tasks as cleaning tracks, digging ditches and cleaning off bulkheads.

He described this as an "improper use" which is "one of the most hazardous practices in the field of mine safety and health."

It is "one of the worst creators of dust with which we have to contend," McDowell said, raising the dust count above the permissible maximum even when the working area has been dampened.

"This dangerously unhealthy condition is not confined to the area of the lot; but the suspended particles pollute the mine ventilation stream and affect many workers," McDowell said.

"The practice cannot be controlled; therefore, it must be prohibited."

Army Engineers Refuse Program

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—The army's board of engineers for rivers and harbors yesterday refused to approve federal improvements to the Snake river basin in Washington.

The board agreed with a report of its district engineer which found that federal flood control measures would not give enough benefit to warrant the cost.

The board said, however, a study of multiple purpose storage possibilities "would be warranted at some future date."

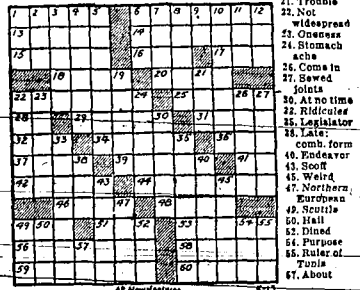

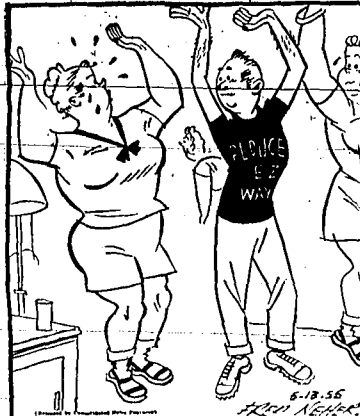

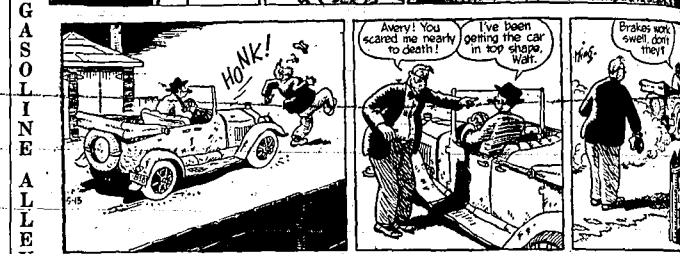

Demos Ready Line for Fight On Corps Cut

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—Democrats on the senate appropriations committee drew up their battle lines today to reverse the administration on manpower cuts in the marine corps.

Both the marine corps and the army are scheduled for cutbacks under President Eisenhower's new defense budget. But the Democrats concede there is little chance congress will restore the army strength.

Concentrate on Corps

Instead, the senate Democrats are concentrating on reversing the 22,000-man cut in the marine corps. But they face an uphill battle in view of the house's overwhelming endorsement of Mr. Eisenhower's plan to cut over-all military strength to 2,850,000 men by mid-1956.

The house yesterday approved the President's plan intact and voted a sweeping 321-206,000 increase in the marine corps to a previously-planned 216,000. Present administration plans a cut in marine strength to 205,000 this July 1 and 193,000 by July 1, 1956.

Should Down Amendments

The house members shouted down amendments offered by Rep. Daniel J. Flood, D. Fla., to restore some of the manpower cuts by adding 2,850,000 to the bill. This would have maintained army and navy strength at 1,100,000 and 665,000 men respectively.

The administration plans to cut the army to 1,025,000 men by July 1, 1956, and the navy to 665,000 men. Flood's amendments would have restored the marine corps to a previously-planned 216,000. Present administration plans a cut in marine strength to 205,000 this July 1 and 193,000 by July 1, 1956.

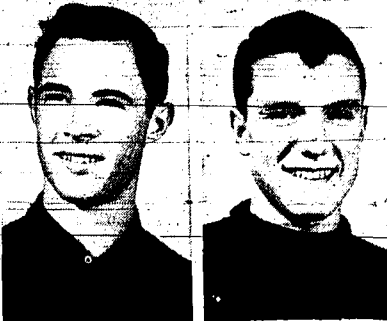
IDAHO FALLS, May 13 (AP)—The Union Pacific Railroad company is filing a request to discontinue daily passenger train service between here and Victor.

Mexican Contract Opposed by CIO

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—The CIO came out today against proposals for more than a one-year extension of the law permitting importation of Mexican farm labor.

In a letter to chairman Harold D. Cooley of the house agriculture committee, the CIO said the law should be extended for no more than one year. It also repeated its request for substantial changes to protect American farm workers if claims have been displaced by Mexican workers.

The labor department has recommended a 4 1/2-year extension of the law, under which more than 300,000 Mexican workers were imported temporarily last year to harvest American crops. Rep. E. C. Cullins, D. Ark., introduced a bill for indefinite extension. But his agriculture subcommittee did "die" 30 months yesterday before it approved the measure.

Ash Resulted in Ore, Says Aide

LOGAN, May 13 (AP)—A Utah State Agricultural college geologist says that evidence now indicates that uranium deposits in Idaho and Wyoming come from volcanic ash.

Dr. J. Stewart Williams, dean of the graduate school, said upon his return from a meeting of the Rocky Mountain section of the Geological Society of America at Laramie, Wyo., that it is now believed that such volcanic ash was blown over the area in the Tertiary period of geological time.

He said that circulating surface and ground waters then separated the uranium from the ash and deposited it at lower levels in porous sandstone.

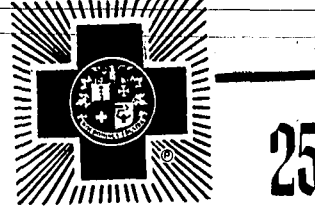
