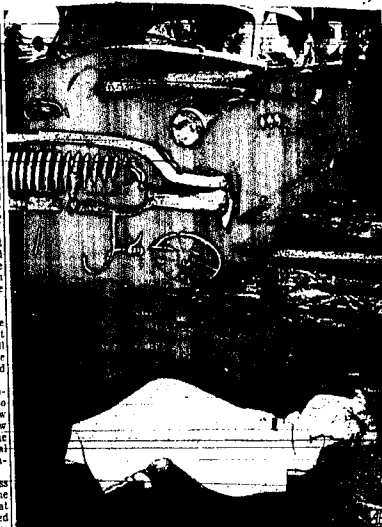

**Singapore Pupils Stage Big Strike**

SINGAPORE, May 18 (UP)—Thousands of communist-inspired Chinese students staged a "stay-in" strike at three Singapore schools today and another reign of terror was feared in this riot-torn city.

"We are prepared to resist any force used to remove us," one of the student leaders said. "We are here to stay until the schools reopen on our terms."

The schools were closed by the Singapore government during anti-government rioting last week-end which claimed four lives.

The schools were opened today under strict precautions, but the students who have been dealing with the government and brawling with police for more than a year refused to enter the classrooms under the government regulations.

### "WASHINGTON CALLING" BY MARQUIS CHILDS

PARIS—At the insistence of Harold Macmillan, the British Foreign Secretary, the conservative government of Anthony Eden, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has agreed tentatively at least, in a meeting of the heads of the big four powers—France, Britain, United States and Russia—for some time late in the summer or early in the fall, whether this tentative agreement will hold beyond the British election date of May 26 is an interesting question.

But Macmillan made plain in the opening discussion of the three powers, Britain, France and the U. S., preceding the meeting of the heads of the Allies, that the conservatives will be able to announce that such a meeting "will take place. Both President Eisenhower and Secretary Dulles have raised a meeting of heads of state that would tend to merely a gesture of good-will—but it would be a meeting of heads of state in the British election is not a foregone conclusion. Therefore, American policy and policy statements become important in terms of British opinion.

The kind of conference now foreseen would take place almost simultaneously with a meeting of the foreign ministers of the four powers. In advance of the meeting of the heads of state there would be an announcement to the effect that they would discuss for a brief time—perhaps two or three days—not the settlement of specific issues in dispute, but the general situation of the world as it stands.

In other words, the conference would be attended by Eisenhower, Marshal Bulganin, Eden and Premier Edgar Faure of France would be largely ceremonial in nature, leaving to the foreign ministers the prolonged effort to come to an agreement if they could on such specific questions as the unification of Germany.

While Macmillan's insistence has had a great deal to do with what is, in effect, a reversal of the American position, this has not been the only factor throughout the mystery. Europe's strongest force today is the desire for peace—and a deep fear of nuclear war.

French Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay has made plain that opinion here in France is such that the Faure government must be able to advertise high-level talks on the outlook for peace. Those who have watched Faure closely since he was premier believe that he would welcome the kind of decision out of a big four conference which would make the rearmament of Germany unnecessary under the western European accords that have just been ratified.

There can be no doubt of the staunch determination of Chancellor Konrad Adenauer to bring West Germany into the NATO defense system. But Adenauer, too, is faced with a strong public opinion determined on peace and perhaps even on a long-term policy of neutrality in the pattern of the Austrian treaty negotiated by Moscow.

At a closed meeting of the NATO powers—admittedly—it is unnecessary to deny newspaper reports that West Germany would withdraw from NATO. So long as its lives-

### HARD UP FOR ISSUES

When a party is out of power, as the Democrats now are at the White House; the leadership naturally grasps at every straw which may turn out to be a stable issue at the polls.

The task can be especially frustrating when the party in power is a very popular President, as is the case right now. The "nuts" inevitably are torn over the question whether or not to attack him personally. And even if they do, they have no assurance they will hurt him materially.

Often they are exasperated to find that a popular President can ride out blunder after blunder without important loss of stature. The Democrats at the moment are busy cataloguing what they believe are the major blunders of the administration. But a few of these go well back in 1953, and the public opinion polls measuring the President's popularity suggest these things didn't upset many people.

Politicians close to events frequently magnify in their own minds the impact these developments will have on the public at large. They get all stirred up in Washington over matters that won't cause a ripple 200 miles away.

Some of them then proceed to bemoan the indifference of voters. No doubt there's plenty of that, but it's certainly not the whole story in Mr. Eisenhower's case.

It's been said before and it can be said again: Most Americans trust him deeply. They believe he is sincerely concerned for their welfare and that they believe he is qualified to keep them out of war. The very "political ineptitude" his critics allege actually helps convince many voters Mr. Eisenhower is above politics.

When this is the case, it isn't going to hurt him much to point out that he doesn't know the name of the head of the bureau of labor statistics. Or to charge him with cruelty to the millions of the little boys in town. A few critics did seriously suggest these "nit-picking" could help do him in.

As a matter of fact, there is evidence that Mr. Eisenhower can even commit blunders in the very field he is considered most able to deal with—foreign and military affairs—and not suffer unduly.

It gives a man going the deep confidence of the people as he has the city ways goes up that Americans again are "worshipping the father image." In other words, that they seek a great protector, and when they think they have one they don't worry much about the details of his performance.

This may be so, and it may have its bad aspects. But the whole blame for this state of mind cannot be laid on the people. It is not in Mr. Eisenhower's case. It seems indisputable one of the prime reasons they picked him in 1952 was their conviction he was not an ordinary politician.

The mood of 1952, and since, has been one of continuing distrust and often disgust toward the standard politicians of the major parties. The votes show it. People have no real faith in either party. They are fed up with short-sighted political maneuvering in a time of great stress.

No man can safely be said to be unbeatable. But the fellow who beats Mr. Eisenhower will first have to earn from the people the kind of trust he has won. And that will not be easy for any man or party.

Eden's support will be invaluable, if the question of hostilities with China arises in the general assembly of the United Nations. It will be the larger body which would be asked to endorse our military defense of Formosa.

Britain can usually command the vote of 10 or 12 nations in the assembly, counting most of the dominions, the low countries and the Scandinavian bloc. The United States has the support of the United States, the British Empire and our Pacific allies. This total adds up to a majority, providing a grave moral condemnation of Russo-Chinese aggression in the far east.

### STRENGTHENING REGIMES

Eisenhower also has been working to strengthen regimes in France and Germany. The communists and socialist extremists in those areas insist that only an aggressive and "militaristic" United States blocks the road to world peace.

Washington realizes that the North Atlantic alliance must be developed in the next few years. It is well on the military level. Should the "appeasers" overthrow existing regimes in Britain, France or Germany, the United States would be virtually friendless.

Despite the ancient platitudes that politics aloft are the ocean's edge, domestic and international politics are now woven together inextricably.

Senators Say Millions Lost By Air Force

WASHINGTON, May 18.—Democratic Senators Charles McNary, N. M., and Robertson, Va., accused the air force yesterday of "wasting" millions of dollars in its construction program outside the United States.

Recalling the wastage uncovered by congress after the building of North African bases during the Korean war, the senators said they "could forgive" the air force one mistake made in a rush program but that they did not expect the errors to be repeated.

Air force officials were confronted with the charges when they appeared before a senate appropriations subcommittee to explain requests for nearly 15 billion dollars in their budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1.

Death came at the famed lawyer and jurist at his beloved farm home, "The Valley Forge," after an illness of four months that had left him bedfast.

Chiang Avers Reds Seeking U. S. Pullout

TOKYO, May 18.—Nationalist China yesterday viewed the latest peace proposals by Premier Chou En-lai of Red China as an attempt to drive U. S. forces from the western Pacific.

In Taipei, Formosa, a spokesman for the nationalist government's information bureau said that "the Chinese communists want a total American surrender in the Formosa area as the price for peace."

Fredrick Dealman, a nationalist foreign ministry spokesman predicted Red China would set a deadline for withdrawing U. S. forces now guarding Formosa under the U. S.-Nationalist Mutual Defense Treaty. This would be followed by threats of large-scale action, he said.

Chou railed out any Formosan cease-fire negotiations with the United States and implied he would talk only about withdrawing U. S. forces from the Formosa area.

There is no war between China and the United States and so the question of the so-called cease-fire does not arise," he told the standing committee of the national people's congress in Peking last Friday.

### FBI "Alumni" Get Top Posts And Good Pay

WASHINGTON, May 18 (AP)—Joseph I. O'Neill, Jr. worked as a special agent for the federal bureau of investigation for four years. In 1946 he resigned, went to Texas and struck it rich in oil.

There is nothing in the FBI's training literature that teaches a man how to do this. But it is the art of success that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has learned to expect from his bureau's "alumni."

**Good Training**  
Former G-men have found that a hitch in the bureau can be a springboard to lucrative positions in business or the legal profession; to political office; or to various other responsible jobs in government and private life.

Some of the ex-FBI agents who have made a big splash in politics are Gov. Frank Clement of Tennessee, former Gov. Edwin McPherson of New Mexico, and Reps. Harold H. Velde, R-Ill., Ed Edmondson, D-Ore., Thomas Dodd, D-Conn., and Omar Burton, D-Tex.

Two appointive officials of the Eisenhower administration—state department security chief Scott McLeod and federal communications commissioner Robert E. Lee—were once FBI agents. So was Vice President Richard M. Nixon's administrative assistant, Robert I. King.

Worth Millions  
O'Neill, financially one of the most successful men in the ranks of ex-FBI agents, now is an independent millionaire. His net worth is an estimated \$0 million dollars.

Tom Webb, another former agent who went to Texas, now occupies a top executive post with Clinton W. Murchison's \$0-million-dollar four-corporation headquarters at Dallas.

### Evidence Shows U. S. Doesn't Know Just What Reds Will Do

WASHINGTON, May 18 (AP)—The American government doesn't know what the Russians are up to. That point stands out clearly in Secretary of State Dulles' talk to the nation.

Lately the communists have been mild and to a degree cooperative. They let Austria have independence. They have agreed to talks among the big four powers—Britain, France, Russia—and the highest level. Why?

Dulles doesn't know. He frankly expressed surprise that their moves in his broadcast last night from President Eisenhower's office.

Although Eisenhower said a "new dawn may be coming," he and Dulles cautioned against expecting too much of the talks.

Dulles and Eisenhower, both of whom had been in the front lines of a top-level meeting with the Russians, will now both meet with them.

Neither man has shown much enthusiasm for the talks.

Neither man initiated it. Senator George D. Owens, chairman of the Senate foreign relations committee, suggested it weeks ago, said Sir Winston Churchill. Britain and France persuaded Dulles to persuade Eisenhower to take part.

Dulles was very cautious about the meeting, because he doesn't know what the Russians have up their sleeve. George, after listening to Dulles, said he thought the secretary was a "bit overcautious" even to the point of "timidity."

Some of Eisenhower's own Red agents—such as Senators Knowland of California and Bridges of New Hampshire—have expressed "misgivings" about the talks "all down with the communists. George takes the opposite view.

He said he doesn't regard the big four corporation as a "pipe dream." He urged more "courage and faith."

Since the Russians have been "gloating," Eisenhower and Dulles will have to do some "house-cleaning" if they don't want to come out second best. Homework doesn't mean just remembering to stand pat on every single difference which has existed between Russia and the west for years.

This whole Russian performance may be phony. There's a chance it isn't, that they really want peace and are willing to pay a price for it in the form of concessions they never would make before.

If they do back up a bit, the United States will have to be prepared to do the same. If by doing so American safety and world peace are benefited, American rigidity might continue a cold war until it is too late.

But Dulles knows any American concessions by him or Eisenhower may bring down the wrath of some Republicans. Both men have vivid memories of Republican outcries for the past 10 years over concessions made by President Roosevelt at Yalta.

That memory will sit on the shoulders of Eisenhower and Dulles at

**Elimination Eyed**

WASHINGTON, May 18 (AP)—Elimination of more than 1,000 federal business enterprises has been recommended by a House committee to a congress which so far has shown little interest in its reorganization plans.

As part of government competition is sapping the vitality of private enterprise, the commission called in a new report last night for shutting down government-owned stores, repair shops and factories, and for liquidation of the postal savings system.

It was the 10th of some 20 reports scheduled from the 12-member commission headed by former President Herbert Hoover. So far few bills have been drawn to translate the many recommendations into law, and President Eisenhower has sent up no reorganization plans based on them.

**VIENNA, May 18 (AP)**—Austrian independence treaty shows that world peace may be achieved by negotiation, Chancellor Julius Raab said.

Freedom for Austria was of the greatest importance and joy for Austria," he told a new conference. "But not only that. It indicates that serious world problems can be solved—or, at least, that the powers can sit at the same table.

"I regard this act as a lessening of the cold war and a step toward world peace."

As he spoke, the flag of the big four powers whose troops had occupied his country for 10 years were lowered and only Austria's red and white banner remained where it flew yesterday.

Raab said the United States, Britain, France and the Soviet Union have made no commitment on when they will withdraw their 70,000 occupation troops. The withdrawal of the troops, including about 10,000 Americans, need not be completed until 90 days after all five governments have ratified the treaty signed yesterday.

But, said Raab, the armies are beginning to leave and some installations may be turned back to Austria sooner.

Austrian police reported that Soviet troops have pulled out of some villages in the Russian zone.

The chancellor clearly was weary after the tense negotiation of the treaty, its signing ceremony and a night of celebration.

But he was out in the early morning to bid farewell to French Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay and British Foreign Secretary Harold Macmillan.

U. S. Secretary of State Dulles left last night. Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov is remaining in Vienna another day.

The big four foreign ministers planned to begin preparations for the meeting this summer of their government chiefs.

Many western Europeans hoped the two major accomplishments of the ministers' week-end reunion in

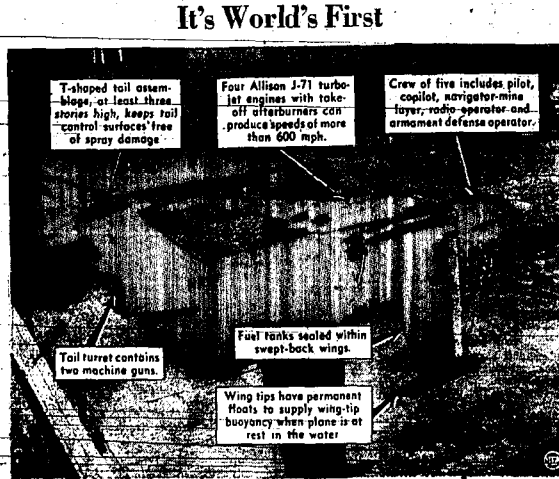

### Main Leaders In Poland Are Facing Issues

By United Press

Polish communist leaders probably are a worried bunch of people right now.

Little mention has been made of Poland in the surge of diplomatic activity that has resulted from the ratification of the West German armistice treaty.

It is true that the Iron curtain governments met in Warsaw last week to conclude their new military set-up. That was merely a formality. But Poland may be much more prominent in the news in months to come.

**Betrayal Seen**

There have long been indications that Soviet Russia would be willing to betray the Polish reds in an attempt to prevent the materialization of the German armistice program.

It would be a most logical move for Russia to hold out hope that if Germany made itself a neutral country, Poland would be forced to give up the rich German territory it now occupies.

It is most unlikely—in fact, it is inconceivable—that Germany will accept neutral status for good. Germany is a world power and it is certainly not a neutralized type. Its men are born soldiers.

**Will Regain Land**

Also, Germans most likely figure privately that they will get back their territory from Poland sooner or later one way or another.

But there is nothing to keep Russia from trying the neutrality dodge. It will be remembered that Nazi Germany invaded Poland from the west on Sept. 1, 1939, to open World war II, and that the Soviet Union invaded it from the east on Sept. 17. Hitler and Stalin then partitioned the whole country between them.

At the Yalta conference in February, 1945, the United States, Great Britain and the Soviet Union agreed that after the war Poland must be given substantial territorial concessions from Germany.

At the Potsdam conference in July-August, 1945, the big three agreed that, subject to a final peace settlement, Poland should receive that part of Germany lying east of a line drawn from the Baltic sea near Schwetinsmunde along the Oder river to the West, and thence along the Western Nisse to Czechoslovakia. This territory totals 40,000 square miles.

There has been no final German "peace settlement." But the Soviet and Polish governments have treated the German territory as if they had been settled irrevocably. Its people have been expelled to Germany proper.

The majority of the area totaled eight million, five million fled to West Germany before the Soviet advance in the possession of their lives, leaving three million to be expelled from their homes, stripped of their possessions and property.

Both Premier Josef Styranski and party leader Boleslaw Bierut of Poland are veteran communists. They know how to use the communist's word is, and they must be worried now.

### Big Bomb Scare Evacuates Hotel

BOZEMAN, May 18 (AP)—A hundred persons were evacuated from the plush downtown Davenport hotel during the dinner and cocktail hour last night when a man called police and said, "I've planted a bomb in the Davenport hotel and it'll go off at 7 o'clock sharp."

No bomb exploded, however, and firemen and police officers who searched the building said they found no evidence of anything resembling a bomb.

Police Captain Harrison Cox said, "we've convinced it's a hoax."

James Bell, fire department arson investigator, said the hotel was evacuated in 7 minutes. No accurate estimate of the number of persons who left was available, but hotel officials said that the rooms were full, two large banquets were just beginning and the dining room, cocktail lounge and lobby were jammed.

### Milk Price Set

OLYMPIA, May 18 (AP)—The price of milk to producers in the Skagit county milk shed area was ordered to be fixed yesterday by state agriculture director Everett Sorenson. The order goes into effect today for a 90-day period.

Minimum prices of milk producers are to receive during the 90 days. Contract milk shall be 35¢ per 100 pounds of fluid milk containing four per cent butter fat.

### Idahoan Dies

BOJIE, May 18 (AP)—Mrs. Autilia Walker, 69, widow of a former Boise mayor, died of a heart attack today after a long illness.

She was awaiting the arrival of a former classmate who was to attend with her the 50th reunion of the 1903 graduating class of Boise high school.

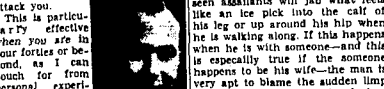
A good way to keep track of your age without reference to the family Bible or a call to the old family physician is to keep a log of the aches, pains, cricks and other minor afflictions which attack you.

### Sen. George Faces Rough Voting Fight

WASHINGTON, May 18.—Walter F. George of Georgia, who came to the senate when the league of nations and prohibition were big issues, has drawn his toughest opposition in next year's election—and that's bad news for the Eisenhower administration.

It was 33 years ago that George began a span of service which finds him now the senior senator, loaded with honors and burdened with great political power. He battled the Roosevelt and Truman administrations on many a domestic issue. For his part, George in 1938 to beat George in the Democratic primary, but failed. But the senator gets along fine with the Eisenhower administration on most things.

**Fireball Issue Challenges**

Dopes home in Georgia a 45-year-old political fireball to blaze with zeal to relieve the senior senator from his chores. And young Herman Eugene Talmadge may do it, too. If the contest actually takes place next year. The heated word around Washington, however, is that the top political element which would be involved in a George-Talmadge contest may have little stomach for—about the withdrawal of one man or the other from the race might come about.

Walter George is 75 years old. Talmadge is the son of old Gene who used to raise the red Georgia flag with his highly political powers. And the son has the old man's talents, refined somewhat, plus a few of his own. Herman was 8 years old when George came to the senate to a seat distinguished by such as Borah, Hiram W. Johnson, the elder LaFollette, the elder Lodge, Albert Bacon Fall, to be shared later in the disclosure of Harding administration oil conspiracies, was in that 67th congress.

Calvin Coolidge in the vice president's chair presided over debates long forgotten on the merits of the muscle shoe, the world court, league of nations, export-debenture farm relief and prohibition, 32 beer and light wine.

**Remains in Office**

Of the senators who were in that 67th congress, George alone has remained continuously in the senate since then. In the current 84th congress, George's colleagues recorded him the highest honor within their power by choosing him to be their president pro tempore.

George is considerably more valuable to Frank B. Rowan than some—more likely, most—Republican members of the senate. He's a conservative, cautious, steady as a rock. He's a man who likes to see a reverse which considerably shook the Democratic left wing.

He is a former finance committee chairman and president of a subcommittee on foreign relations where his influence in and out of the administration and in the major parties is vastly effective. George of Georgia, is judged by many persons as far and away the most influential member of the senate.

**Has Been Governor**

Talmadge, like his father, has been governor of his state. The young man was a good one, too. Like his dad he plows a deep and wide furrow in the back country communities which are more powerful in Georgia than in any other state. Georgians elect their state officials by county unit. A candidate may poll 10,000 or more votes above his opponent and yet lose a Georgia election.

George was elected to the senate seat vacated by the famous Tom Watson, but did not succeed directly. A gallant governor appointed to that vacancy Georgia's great lady, Mrs. Rebecca L. Felton. George was elected Nov. 7, 1922, but, as gallant as the governor, delays presenting his credentials until Mrs. Felton had a chance to present her's and to air for two days as a senator from Georgia, the first woman senator in American history.

If the young challenger, beats, that did happen in 1928, the chairman of the foreign relations committee would be Theodore Francis Green of Rhode Island, James H. Doolittle and richest 67-year-old in town.

### Big Financier Discloses His Hawaiian Bid

HONOLULU, T. H., May 18 (AP)—Industrialist Henry J. Kaiser, who came to Hawaii for a vacation 18 months ago and is still here, wants to spend 110 million dollars on a resort development to lure more tourists to the islands.

The tourists are eager to come, he believes. What Hawaii needs is a place to put them.

The territory also needs more tourist business to take up the slack in her economy, where government activities and the sugar and pineapple industries leave off.

**Tells Answer**

Kaiser's answer is a 20 million dollar project to create an 18-acre enclosure area on Waikiki beach into the biggest single resort ever developed in the islands. There would also be a 50 million dollar resort on a man-made island off Waikiki, and a 40 million dollar development on the Kona coast of the island of Hawaii, 200 miles southeast of Honolulu.

"The vacation business is a new industry in a new era," the 73-year-old former shipbuilder said in an interview. "People are getting twice as much vacation time as they used to. Right there you have a 100 per cent increase in the vacation industry."

Kaiser said Hawaii is the most likely spot to draw tourists because it is the only truly year-round resort area accessible to most Americans.

**Came for Visit**

Kaiser and his wife came to Hawaii in February, 1954, for a visit. They soon succumbed to the lure of the islands and bought a beach home in the luxurious Kahaia district for \$187,000.

Since then Kaiser and a team of experts have been knee-deep in plans for the resort development. One phase is expected to be a fabulous hotel similar to Miami's new Fontainebleau.

The Hawaii development doesn't mean Kaiser is pulling out of any of the other big deals he is involved in, such as a 40 million dollar project to build autos for Argentina and a 60 million dollar contract to bore a 12-mile tunnel through solid rock and then build a dam in Australia.

**Has Special Interest**

But the tourist enterprise has a special interest for the man who is most famous for his shipbuilding exploits in World War II.

"You see, when I was 22 I decided Florida never would develop a tourist business and passed up a chance to be in on the ground floor there. Then I went on to figure that Palm Springs and Las Vegas were desert sand traps and always would be. "I don't want to miss the boat again."

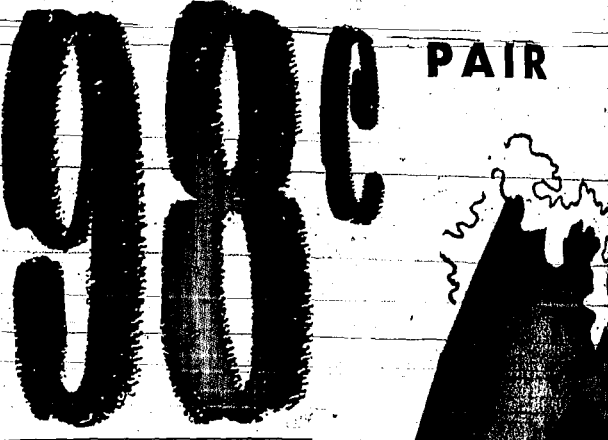

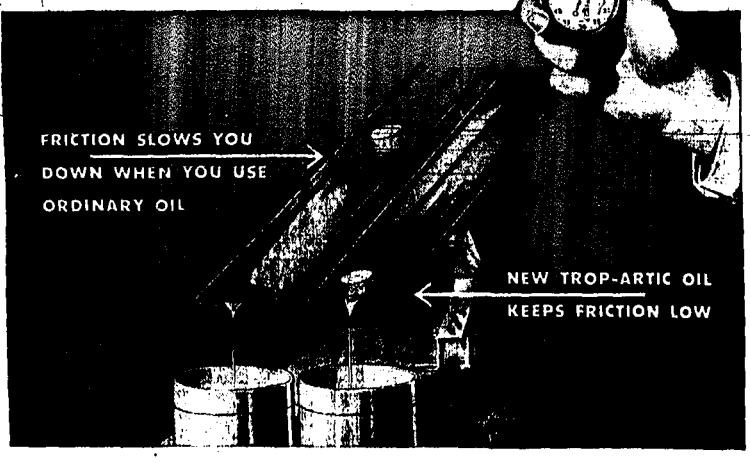

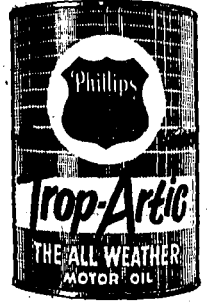
