Decision Delayed Plea to Favor Government Dam

WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—The senate interior reclamation committee today put off action on a bill authorizing federal power and flood control dam on the Hells canyon on the Idaho-Oregon border.

Sen. Anderson, D., N. M., said after a closed meeting that a decision was deferred to give members time to study the controversial legislation.

Approval is assured since three of its five members are sponsors of the bill, introduced by Sen. Morse, D., Ore. The three are Sens. Anderson, Jackson, D., Wash., and O'Mahoney, D., Wyo. Other members are Sens. Watkins, R., Utah, and McNamara, R., Calif. McNamara was not present at today's meeting.

The votes of Watkins and McNamara indicate how the bill will fare in the full interior committee, where the vote is expected to be close. The subcommittee may meet again.

Neither Watkins nor McNamara has indicated his stand on the controversial proposal to build a half-billion-dollar public project in the deepest canyon on the continent, which Idaho Power company seeks as a site for one of the smaller dams. Both senators participated in the subcommittee's recent hearings on the Morse bill.

McMahon's bill is now before a house interior subcommittee. Rep. Engle, D., Calif., house interior committee chairman, said sponsors have drafted the possibility of a hearing on their bills and "he would discuss the matter with them next week."

FPC Examiner William J. Costello recently recommended in an initial decision that the dam be given a license for one dam, instead of three. John C. Mason, of the Idaho Power Co., recommended that the three private power dams be licensed. Public power groups are asking that the FPC reject the application and that congress authorize the federal project.

Also before the FPC are requests for license Idaho Power applications or to defer action on them until after congress has disposed of the Hells canyon legislation.

Idaho Postpones A. Salk Invited to Area

BOISE, May 20 (AP)—Medical advisors to the Idaho polio planning committee recommended today that the state indefinitely postpone all anti-polio vaccinations. L. J. Peterson, state health department director, said this recommendation would be followed. At the same time, he announced that Dr. Jonas E. Salk will be invited to Idaho to study the polio outbreak. In a statement released through the health department, the advisory committee said it believes "any further polio vaccination during this period should be the responsibility of the individual physicians and the families who may desire to complete the immunization program."

The statement followed a meeting last night for the committee to discuss the Idaho polio situation with federal and state health officials and to hear laboratory reports on the first five cases tested.

When the statement was first prepared, Salk was later invited to attend "indefinitely postponed."

Since the first round of Salk shots for 32,000 Idaho children, 17 vaccinated children have been attacked—three fatally—and there have been 12 other cases among persons who were closely associated with vaccinated individuals.

The epidemiological evidence accumulated to date indicates to the committee and to the department of health that the polio situation is a serious problem," the group stated.

In view of this, it was the opinion of the committee that "further information is available, no further steps in the vaccination program should be taken," the statement said.

"As is usual in the poliomyelitis season, it was thought that parents are not willing to take the precautionary steps," the statement said.

The committee said parents should be told that their children:

1. Avoid doctors and chilling.
2. Follow doctor's advice about mouth and throat operations.
3. Keep hands clean at all times.
4. Report any symptoms such as headache, fever, sore throat, stiff neck or back, and so on to the doctor.

5,000 Applicants File For 63 Units of Land

RUPERT, May 20—Drawing day for 63 farm units on the Northside pumping division of the Minidoka project has been set for May 27. More than 5,000 veterans have filed applications for the farm units which each contain from 87 to 151 irrigable acres of land.

The big D-day celebration will feature bands, drill units, color guards and \$500 in free prizes to veterans who have filed applications. The names of the 63 "winners" will be drawn from a revolving drum which will be set up in the city square.

The drawing will be the third in a series of five which will eventually open approximately 700 farms containing 17,500 acres.

In February, when the bureau of reclamation in Washington, D. C., announced the drawing and filing date, more than 1,500 farm units were withdrawn and awarded to existing farmers, whose farms cannot be used for the project because of the high cost of supporting the farmers and their families.

The drawing will be held at 2 p.m. Thursday, Wednesday night the official count on applications was 5,663. Many more were filed immediately prior to the deadline.

In 1953 the bureau opened 72 units and last year 33 more were thrown open to entry.

All applicants were required to have at least \$4,500 cash or unencumbered assets, two years of farming experience and be honorably discharged veterans with at least 90 days of military service.

Speaker Says Army Plans Possible Here

With county and city approval, two excellent national guard armories "could be built in Twin Falls," Sen. J. Howard Pomeroy said today.

Pomeroy said that the federal government will authorize two per cent of the cost of a national guard armory. The balance may be contributed by the city.

This year, Pomeroy said, the 83rd legislature authorized \$92,000 to be devoted to military construction. Only eight communities in the state, he noted, had so far indicated their intention of taking advantage of the offer.

According to Pomeroy, by law the city is authorized to levy a one-mill tax on its residents to raise funds for an armory. He pointed out that, if the county would join in the levy, the one-mill tax would be \$100,000 could be raised in two or three years.

The maximum size armory which the federal government approves is 20,000 square feet, Pomeroy reported. However, he said, it is doubtful that the federal government would approve a large armory for one community. The solution, he indicated, would be two armories.

Soviet Press Still Lashes U.S.; Britain

MOSCOW, May 20 (AP)—Despite a cascade of scolding words about Yugoslavia and the easing of international tensions, there is no sign of any letup in the campaign of anti-American and anti-British propaganda in the Soviet press.

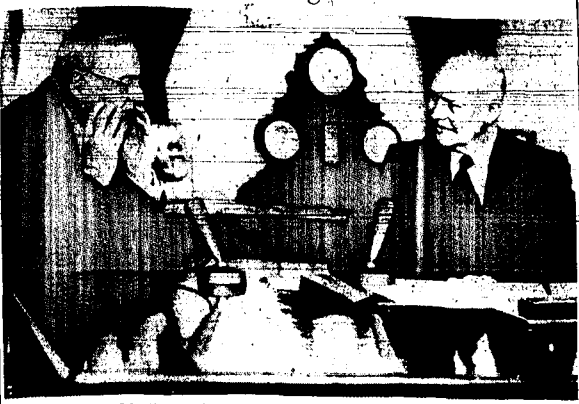

Ex-Checker of U. S. Confesses Gifts Received

WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—A New York feather merchant admitted yesterday he accepted while chief of government inspectors a drop freeze and some items in stock from a man whose firm made garments for the armed services.

Joseph G. Porreca, Clinton, N. J., confessed to the senate investigations subcommittee he lied when he denied at a previous hearing that he took the drop freeze from business hustler Marvin Rubin on Christmas Eve, 1949.

Loan, Not Gift

The balding, husky-voiced witness said the truth is he accepted the home freezer, 25 to 30 pounds of meat and a dozen items of lingerie from Rubin while inspectors under his supervision checked the suspect of Rubin's firm in Puerto Rico.

Rubin himself acknowledged sending the freezer to Porreca. He insisted, however, it was a "loan" and he never paid for the freezer in spite of several "genetic" dunnies.

Recalled Inspector

Rubin and Porreca, the former inspection chief for the army quarters and corps, had agreed on one thing: Porreca treated one of his inspectors from the Puerto Rican plant after his "questioning" about the man. Porreca said there were other reasons for replacing the inspector.

And Porreca, now connected with the New York Feather company, said Rubin reported to him in unimpeachable terms that "questioning" being applied by another government inspector, whom he identified as Louis Alperstein.

Recalled Purchases

The testimony came in the second day of the committee's inquiry into alleged "bribe and corruption" in the purchase of clothing for the army forces during the past three years.

Porreca, the feather man, said he lied to the committee in a previous appearance because he was "scared to death."

Deive to Signal Of Heart Strain

NEW YORK, May 20 (AP)—A radio device that can signal warning of heart trouble is on display here.

The device, developed by the navy, works this way:

The transmitter fitted to a patient broadcasts electrocardiographic signals, measures of the heart beat and other audible heart sounds to a receiver.

This enables a heart specialist to record changes in the heart while the patient is engaged in normal activities. Herebefore such records have been made with the patient in a resting position.

The new process, said Dr. Maximilian Kern, Chicago, should make it possible to determine more accurately how much exercise the heart patient can tolerate, and to warn of an impending attack.

Oregon Attracts Favor Ad Funds

ONTARIO, Ore., May 20 (AP)—Mehar county potato and onion growers have approved a tentative \$10,000 a year advertising budget to offset increasing competition from Idaho.

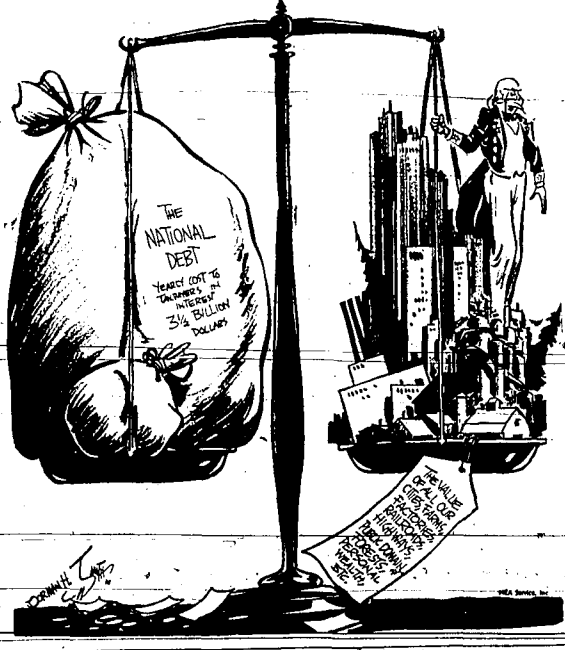
This action followed passage of a bill by the recent Idaho legislature setting up a trademark for Idaho potatoes.

Flood Waters Make Persons Homeless but Break Drought

CHICAGO, May 20 (AP)—Dust-bowl flood crests drove close to 5,000 persons from their homes in a three-state area today, but broke the back of a five-year drought.

The army, the Red Cross, and state officials rushed emergency supplies of blankets, food, water, and anti-typhoid vaccine to stricken areas in Colorado, Oklahoma, and Texas.

Southeast Colorado, where a major dust storm raged just one month ago, was awash.

The rain-swollen Purgatoire river drove hundreds of persons from their homes at Trinidad, Colo., and washed away six homes and a church.

Seventy miles to the northeast, the Arkansas river washed over its banks at La Junta, Colo. It forced 1,800 persons from their homes and they spent the night in an abandoned World War II housing project.

States of emergency were declared in both Trinidad and La Junta and it was estimated that the Purgatoire and Arkansas floods had made 4,000 persons homeless.

More flood waters drove 750 persons from their homes in Oklahoma, and the Red Cross fed more than 100 persons in rain-soaked Eastland, Tex., last night.

The flood waters came rolling down after days of torrential rains in the three states.

The downpours had stopped in Colorado, but mountain runoff from the Sangre de Cristo range of the Rockies threatened to spill five feet more of water into the Purgatoire.

General Given Reprimand for Russ Warning

WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—After drawing a rebuke from his chief, Brig. Gen. Woodbury M. Burgess of air force intelligence, denied yesterday he had said Russian air force is as good or better than America's.

Burgess' denial was relayed to newsmen by Chairman Chaver, D. N. M., and Senator Ballonstall, R., Mass., of a senate appropriations subcommittee.

General Silent

There was no word from Burgess himself and the air force said there would be none.

Earlier yesterday, Gen. Nathan F. Twining, air force chief of staff, had issued a public rebuke to Burgess, who is deputy chief of staff for intelligence in the continental air defense command.

Twining's remarks followed published accounts of a speech quoting Burgess as saying "the Russian air force is currently at least as good as ours, possibly better."

Talks to Senators

Burgess made his speech Wednesday night to a Detroit American Legion post. He was quickly flown here for a closed door appearance before the senate committee, which had called in Twining and secretary of the air force Talbot earlier in the day.

There was no further word from Twining. He and Secretary Talbot talked to reporters after their own testimony.

Both said they were surprised at American fears of Russian airpower. These fears were stirred anew last week by a report put out by the air force itself. The report described a parade over Moscow of powerful new jet bombers and fighters.

Service Halted

ROSE, May 20 (AP)—The state public utilities commission has given the Great Northern railroad permission to discontinue service at its station in Leclde and Leonia.

It ruled yesterday that the railroad had proved its point that revenues no longer justify employment of a caretaker at Leclde and a custodian at Leonia.

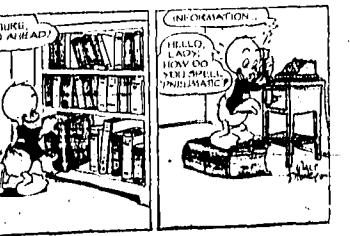

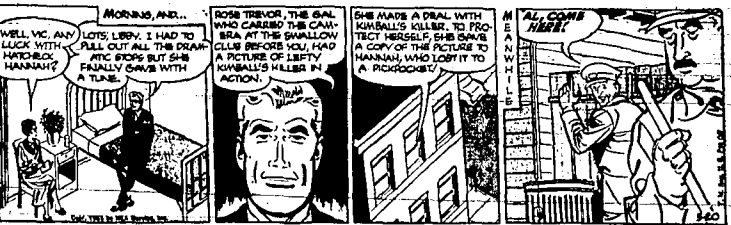

After the services a few hundred Catholic youths started to parade down Avenida de Mayo toward the capitol where congress was in session. Police dispersed the marchers without incident.

Action by the deputies was the first but most important hurdle for the proposal to eliminate the rights and privileges granted Catholics under the constitution. The measure has the strong backing of President Peron's government and is the outgrowth of his running dispute with the church—in this mainly Catholic country.

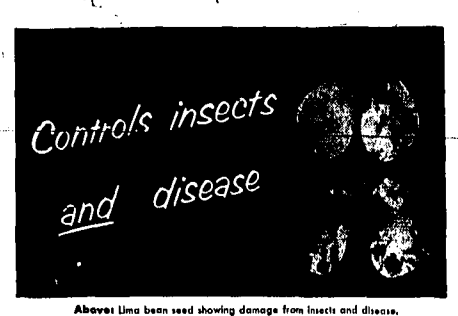
