 His ingenuity is most remarkable. He is not satisfied unless he is busy accomplishing some dreamed-up project. Recently he has removed all the old wiring from his home and replaced it with new wire. He has installed two overhead lights, one over the kitchen sink and one over the dining table.
 All winter he has been working hard remodeling his mother's kitchen. On two sections of the kitchen walls he has built (new cupboards including a unique lazy Susan in the kitchen sink and when plumbers didn't arrive on time for their portion of the job, he simply did the job himself.
 Finishing the sink wasn't enough for Glen. He went a bit farther and put running water out on the porch, making it much easier for his mother on wash days.
 Along with these construction projects, Glen has delivered papers in Jerome for the Times-News for the past 46 months. His customers say he has been most reliable, always on time with his papers in fair or adverse weather. His mother ordered his papers for him if he was ill or had a special job to perform. He ended his carrier days on May 1.
 During the summer months for the past three years, just to keep busy, Glen mows and clips lawns. He started first with a hand-mower-but soon decided there must be a better and quicker way to do the job.
 He invested in a power mower. With this he was able to take so many more jobs that he soon had it paid for. Finding that he'd be delayed with his work if the mower broke down, he invested in a second mower. If they need repairs, he was able to do this himself.
 He also purchased a three-wheeled scooter which he used for school. The scooter had a frame built on it which Glen rebuilt from an old refrigerator. With this new frame he was able to transport his mower which saved time and effort.
 Among other things, Glen also repairs accordions. His father says the intricate parts of the accordions do not stump Glen. He repairs them in an efficient manner. Glen also can play the accordion, though he has no musical talents. His playing is mechanical for he'd rather repair than play the instrument.

WASHINGTON—George Magoffin Humphrey is not the "howling-bowling-kind," but the secretary of the treasury, usually unknown until "Tupper" has his pen point, feels pretty good these days.

Replying to critics who have said Russia's prime objective at any top level big four conference would be to dissipate American military strength in Europe, George said: "I don't think we can give up anything at this time or rest on our oars in any way. We can't let our guard down now. No proposal Russia makes should affect our military efforts which we have had time to see some real change in the world situation."

Senator Knowlton—California—the Republican leader—has contended the Soviets are acting at bringing about withdrawal of American troops from the continent. He has predicted attempts to "neutralize" a belt of countries across Europe from Yugoslavia to Scandinavia.

Foresees Bold Plan
George, first in this country to call for a "summit" conference of President Eisenhower and the heads of Britain, France and Russia, said he has no doubt the Russians will come forward with "a very bold program" at such a meeting.

President Eisenhower said last Wednesday that the idea of neutral bloc appeared to have developed since the Austrian peace treaty was signed. He noted, however, that under the treaty Austria could remain "different from a military vacuum."

George said that while he does not favor a neutralized zone, West Germany could "rearm to the hilt" and far in excess of its NATO quota under the same kind of neutrality now imposed on Austria.

Tycoon Dies

TOKYO, May 23 (AP)—Financier George A. Sloan died in New York Friday only a few hours before he would have become president of the International Chamber of Commerce which concluded its 15th congress here Saturday.

News of Sloan's death, apparently the result of complications from an appendectomy and gall bladder operation, shocked the delegates. A director of several major U. S. corporations, he was president and chairman of the board of the Metropolitan Opera association. He was 61.

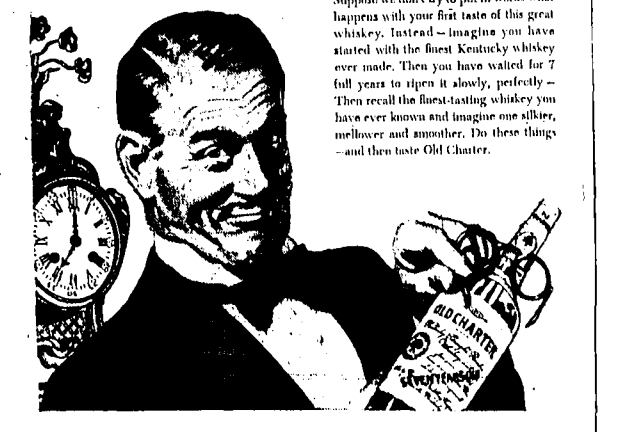
