State of Idaho Faces Polio Outbreak, Must Find Answers to Two Questions

BOISE, May 25 (AP)—The state of Idaho, faced with one of the nation's most extensive outbreaks of polio since the Salk vaccine program was started, is exhausting every resource at its command to find an answer for this fearful mystery.

Two basic questions must be solved:

1. What triggered the polio after inoculations were given?
2. When can the second shots be administered?

Taken from a nationwide viewpoint, the 42 vaccine-connected cases—including four deaths—reported in the United States since April 26 are insignificant when compared to the millions of children who were uninfected after inoculation.

Timetable for Idaho's Polio Outbreak Set

BOISE, May 25 (AP)—Here is the timetable for Idaho's polio outbreak, which became evident April 27:

- March 7—Statewide polio planning meeting in Boise, with 44 counties represented. Planning for inoculations in individual counties completed by April 9.
- April 15—Vaccination started in Boise, where it was packaged for individual counties and distributed to all areas of the state by April 17.
- April 18—Vaccination programs were carried out and completed by April 27.
- April 28—First case among vaccinated group reported. It was thought by the department at this time that the case was probably coincidental and the public was so informed, but within the next three days an additional eight polio cases were reported.
- April 27—A telegram was received from the U. S. public health service ordering temporary withdrawal of the Cutter vaccine. Cutter sent a confirming telegram.
- May 12—An additional nine vaccinated cases were reported. First "household contact" cases reported.
- Health department officials concluded that the vaccine was a possible contributing factor after finding that paralysis appeared in the inoculated progeny and the progression of the paralysis was rapid.
- Department officials also noted that the appearance of polio in Idaho is unusual in Idaho.
- May 20—The health department accepted the polio planning committee's recommendation that all second shots be indefinitely postponed, but the department had ordered such indefinite postponement after vaccine was withdrawn.

Review Would Indicate Reds Are Building Great Air Force

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—A review of the Russian air force in 1955, according to a report by the U. S. Air Force, would indicate that the Russians are building a "defensive" air force. It also was right the United States, which has been building long-range bombers that could be used to attack targets far from Russia. Did this mean the Russians were ahead of this country? At once a dispute began; one word led to another. This is it: May 12—Senator Symington, D. Mo., who is secretary of the air force under President Truman, said the country's military program "is concerned by a deliberate policy on the part of the government" of withholding information. May 13—The Pentagon issued an announcement, with White House approval and based on an analysis of air force intelligence reports made after the Russians flew a group of planes over Moscow recently. The statement said the Russians were cutting into this country's lead in the production of heavy, long-range and medium jet bombers. May 17—Symington said Wilson had underestimated Soviet air force.

Soviets have "resources in manpower and materiel we could not possibly match" and that the Russians have the world's largest air force. May 20—Twining acknowledged the Russians are building a mighty bomber force which "could strike us." May 22—Aviation Week magazine said the Russians had displayed over Moscow this month aircraft so advanced and so numerous it has shocked "even the top level and most knowledgeable military aviation leaders in the Pentagon." May 24—Tuesday Wilson read a formal statement to newsmen. It said this country is maintaining a "military capability superior" to that of Russia. The Wilson statement was a far cry from the optimistic view of a year ago that the Russians were building a "defensive" air force. SPOKANE, May 25 (AP)—A telephone message, which a 16-year-old girl working the switchboard interpreted as a bomb threat, caused evacuation of the swank Desert Caravan Inn on the west city limits last night. Betty Walker, daughter of the inn's manager, received a call at 7:30 p.m. from a man who said simply, "in 15 minutes." Evacuation Held The girl notified the clerk and he called Manager Ward J. Walker at his home. Walker rushed to the inn to supervise evacuation of some 110 "BOBOS" from the dining room and coffee shop and an unknown number from the inn's 66 rented rooms. Guests were allowed back in 20 minutes when sheriff's deputies found no trace of any bomb. The telephone call was similar to one made to the Davenport hotel last week, causing the evacuation of 1,300 guests. Others Told Bomb threats have also been made within the last month at two high schools and a school for retarded children. Police said yesterday that a 16-year-old boy had admitted making the call which caused evacuation of Marcylliff high school. Two youths, 18 and 19, were released yesterday after questioning by police. The pair had been implicated by the 16-year-old.

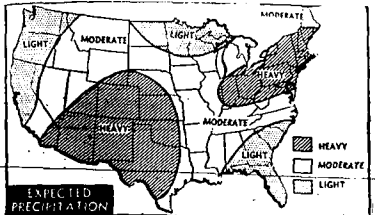

Truman Says GOP's Bungle Vaccine Plan

DENVER, Colo., May 25 (AP)—Former President Truman said last night the Eisenhower administration had bungled badly in its handling of the polio inoculation program.

Mr. Truman made the charge at a 24-plate dinner to raise money for his library at Independence, Mo.

He said Basil O'Connor, chairman of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, and president of the National Harry S. Truman Library association had planned to attend the dinner.

Mr. Truman said O'Connor was unable to be here because of the "mishap" in the St. Louis program.

"It is a shame that he can't be here because he's trying to do something he shouldn't have had to do," Mr. Truman said. "I hope it can be straightened out."

He said O'Connor was conferring with federal officials about the inoculation program "because it has been badly bungled."

Mr. Truman made only passing reference to politics. His speech dealt primarily with the library which will house the official papers of his administration.

Lewd Writing Seen as Helps Of Criminals

NEW YORK, May 25 (AP)—A high school disciplinary committee in Rome, N.Y., yesterday said that lewd and obscene literature—often bootlegged in the nation's schoolyard—can spark juvenile delinquency.

William Deerson, dean of discipline at York's Horan high school, said that there is a definite relation between juvenile delinquency and pornographic material. "I feel that this material, if read, incites the young man to stimulate him and leads to some overt act."

Distribution of pornography is increasing among teen-agers, Deerson added. It takes the form of filthy post cards, indecent cartoon sequences and suggestive playing cards.

In the same vein, the Rev. Daniel Egan, a Franciscan priest who works with teen-agers, told Keefe that the other committee member present, Gen. William Langer, R., N. D.

"No teen-ager, unless he has sex with his girl friend, could be affected by it. A boy gets such a picture, reads it to his girl and off to the movies and something is bound to happen."

Electric Bills and Household Costs Cited for White House

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—The electric bill the White House pays runs about \$2,500 a month. There were 23,654 visitors to the executive mansion in 1954, not including President Eisenhower's daily callers.

The head plumber makes more money than the housekeeper.

These and other minutiae concerning the presidential household were disclosed today with publication of records of the closed hearings held by a house appropriations subcommittee on the 1956 budget for car, maintenance and operation of the White House and its 18 acres of surrounding grounds.

The \$365,000 covers the salaries of 38 mechanical and maintenance employees and 34 men and women on the domestic staff, plus such expenses items as \$10,000 for the annual electricity bill and \$8,000 for palm, fern and cut flowers used to decorate the White House.

Frank T. Gartside, assistant superintendent of the national capital park of the White House, is in charge of the grounds. The remainder is for lighting, cooking, broadcasting and "entertainment" facilities. The monthly bill has run as high as \$3,800 on some occasions in the past.

Salaries and overtime for the 72 mechanical and domestic employees total \$201,000 and the balance of the \$365,000 total is for operating expenses such as \$4,428 for maintenance of the seven elevators and

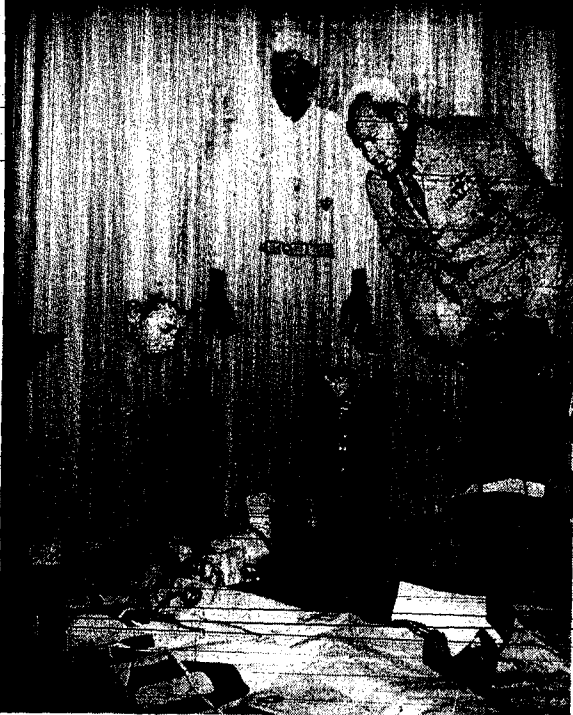
