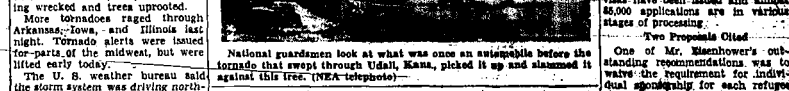

Mystery Seen Over Work of Noted Convict

SAN QUENTIN, Calif., May 27 (AP)—Convict author Garry Chessman's second book is scheduled for publication next month, but a mystery has developed over the manuscript. Chessman's publisher, Prentice-Hall, announced in New York that the book "July by Ordeal" will be published July 11. Chessman is scheduled to die in the San Quentin prison gas chamber four days later.

Confiscated Manuscript Warden Hestley O. Teets confiscated the only known manuscript (last March when Chessman tried to sign it over to his attorney, Russell Asher, for \$1). Miss Asher has filed suit to recover it. Teets said the eight-inch-thick manuscript is still in his safe. Moreover, he said Chessman "assured us that the only manuscript of the second book that has left his cell is the one we had locked up in the prison safe."

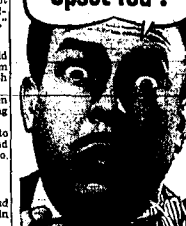

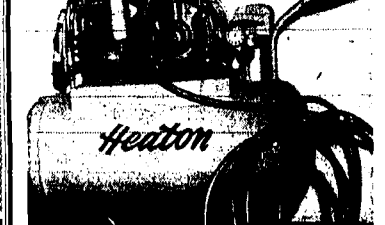

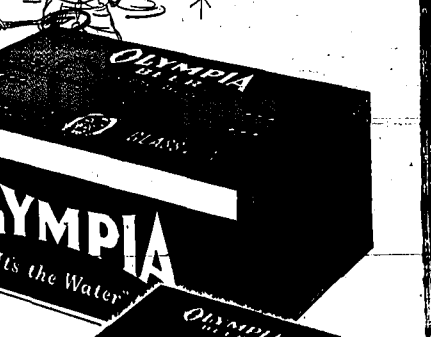

Rhythm Disks Fall to Status Of Youth Cult

NEW YORK, May 27 (AP)—Well, it was fun while it lasted, but rhythm and blues—or call it "Rock 'n' Roll"—has gone from a national mania down to a cult.

The popularity polls in *The Parley* trade papers told the story this week. Up at the top the song titles were in plain English, and as wholesome a collection as you'll ever find—"Dance With Me, Henry," "Cherry Pink and Apple Blossom White," "Davy Crockett."

You had to look way down toward the bottom of the page to find the kind of titles that dominated the list a few weeks ago—"Bo Diddley," "Chop Chop Boom," "Pip Pip and Fly" and "Don't Think a Thing."

Oldtimers in the business business are not hiding their relief, though popper record sales are in a slump. "Nothing in the way of a fad has come along to take the place of rhythm and blues," said one publisher.

Though they no longer dominate the best-seller lists, R and B tunes still have a following among energetic teen-agers and others who haven't found anything better to dance to.

The record-buying is expected to keep many R and B musicians from going hungry in months to come. Most record companies plan to continue bringing out new R and B titles as long as the cult remains faithful.

Sold Well
The rock 'n' roll craze—involving blues music with a heavy beat—has sold millions of records and put some struggling independent companies into the black. But it also gave the industry a black eye, temporarily at least.

Criticism of suggestive lyrics—or "filthy"—hit the R and B songs nights three months ago. As a result, the whole of Tin Pan alley promised to be following a similar double-meeting, and dozens of disc jockeys took public pledges to keep certain records off the air.

Tornado-Torn Community Has School Event, Begins Big Task of Rebuilding

BLACKWELL, Okla., May 27 (AP)—It was graduation night in tornado-shattered Blackwell last night.

This city of 15,000 was in ruins and threatened by flood waters. The twister had killed 17 persons, injured 600 and wrecked 72 blocks.

But that didn't stop the graduation exercises, or Blackwell's determination to come back.

The seniors receiving their diplomas tried to look happy even though many of them had lost a home, or perhaps, a friend or relative in the furious twister one that Wednesday night.

Their determination to keep going was symbolic of the spirit in the devastated towns of Blackwell and Udall, Kans., just across the state line.

The townspeople—those who are in the crowded hospitals—are coming out of their daze. They are talking about rebuilding their towns and their lives.

Scarcely 12 hours after the tornado struck, the work of re-building was getting started in Blackwell.

Residents were moving about their wrecked homes, hauling away debris, trying to make repairs wherever possible.

And in Udall, Mayor Earl Rowe just won't give up hope.

He told United Press correspondent Ward Colwell that most of his fellow townspeople want to rebuild their homes and come back to live in Udall.

His first project is to build a 60-by-80 foot building to house the homeless, who are now living in a gymnasium and armory in nearby Winfield.

Another Udall resident, bank cashier C. F. Hildebrand, 59, reported that the vault of the state bank of commerce had been somewhat spared and the records and deposits were intact.

Hildebrand and his wife are like many of Udall's homeless. Their home was tipped off over their heads and they were left standing in the pounding rain with the only possessions they have left in the world—his trousers, shoes, socks and pajama shirt; her nightgown, robe and slippers.

In short, these courageous Oklahomans and Kansans face a heart-breaking task.

Both towns are under military guard to prevent looting. Large areas of Blackwell and all of Udall are off limits to everyone who can't prove he once lived there or that he is a close relative of a stricken family.

Builders today went back to the grim job of shoving aside the wreckage in Udall, a place where 610 persons once lived but is now a leveled plain of destruction.

Idaho are fearful of finding more bodies under the rubble to add to the 76 already known dead.

It is hard to describe the devastation in these two towns. In Blackwell, about 800 homes have been destroyed, some of them pounded to chunk-size. Udall looks like one of the World War II scenes of atomic bomb destruction.

Help is coming in to both communities.

Winnie Goes Again to Old Political Job

WOODFORD, England, May 27 (AP)—Winston Churchill's blue eyes glittered with something looking like tears as he stood bareheaded in a slight drizzle late last night and thanked Woodford for having sent him back to parliament.

He first went to parliament in 1900, and has been there almost continuously ever since.

"It has been something of a habit of a lifetime," he mumbled to a committee.

Lady Churchill, sharing his triumph, stood beside him on the steps of Hawkey Memorial hall, where the votes were counted, shortly before midnight.

A thousand persons cheered as he moved slowly into the glare of lights after the mayor of Woodford had announced that the veteran of so many political wars had won again. The vote was 25,069 to 9,261 for Arnold K. Milner, his Labor party opponent.

"You have participated in one of the constitutional processes of our democracy," said Churchill, who resigned as prime minister last March.

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—Sen. Mansfield, D., Mont., said today work on Yellowstone dam in Montana should not be delayed "four to five years" by any partnership construction plan.

He urged appropriation of five million dollars during the year beginning July 1 to permit the government to start building the Big Horn river dam, which has been authorized by congress.

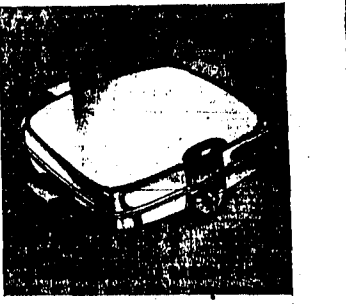
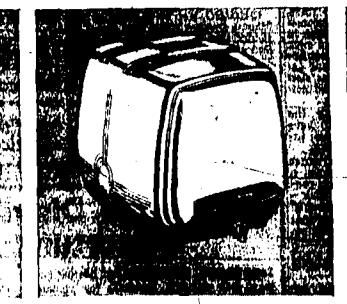

For instance, an engine that starts hard and idles too fast may be traced to a worn water pump drive line.

When there is mistle, a rough engine and hard starting through another year. Probably isn't the engine at all; more likely the contact points of the distributor are pock-marked or aren't spaced properly.

The warmer weather means you're going to be doing a lot more driving for fun, but it won't be fun if the better, longer-lived summer car spoiled because the car, speaking figuratively, is still wearing its long winter underwear.

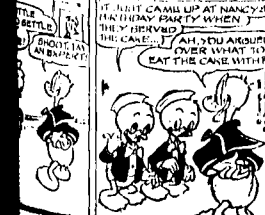

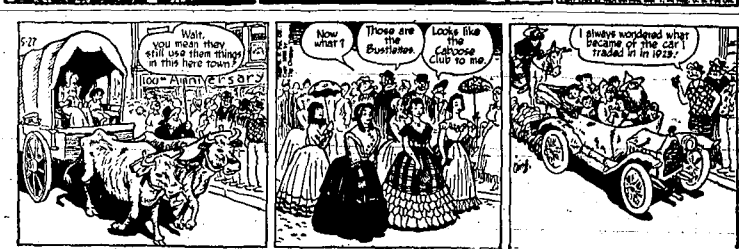

Probe Begins By Committee On Injustices

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—A senate civil service subcommittee yesterday formally opened an investigation into complaints of "injustices under the security system."

It didn't get very far the first day, adjourning until June 2, but it did disclose it had called on several government departments "for entire personnel and security files" of some of their employees.

The request to the departments did not meet an outright refusal, as has been the case in the past, five agencies replying that a review of existing policies and directives is being made and that the subcommittee would be further advised later.

The agencies were the agriculture, state and defense departments, the foreign operations administration and the veterans administration.

Their letters, to subcommittee Chairman Olin Johnson, D. S. C., said the requested material contained information of a security and investigative nature which is received in confidence and kept in confidence.

Johnson said he wanted to make plain that the requested records, if they would also include related correspondence and documents—were sought for analysis and study.
