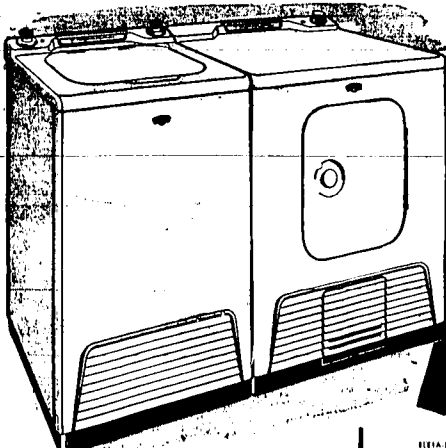

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Sen. Matthew M. Neely's criticism of President Eisenhower's church-going habits on Sundays and national holidays has resulted in a surprisingly favorable manner for the family in the White House. It had been expected to declare officially that the United States is a "religious nation," as the chief executive's religious habits have been attacked by the constitutional experts for many years.

Possibly from shock at the West Virginia senator's dragging of the chief executive's church attendance into politics, churchmen of every denomination have reacted with indignation. Indeed, they have testified that, in their opinion, "the Eisenhower era is an exemplary Christian epoch."

PASTOR'S OPINION—Rev. Dr. Edward L. Olson, of the First Presbyterian Church at Washington, describes the President as "a symbol of the religious awakening in our land." Dr. Olson also adds that to equate Ike's Sunday routine—namely, to go to church before breakfast—with Billy Graham, the Baptist revivalist, has told British audiences that the Eisenhower example had contributed to larger church attendances in "the states."

"A RELIGIOUS NATION"—President Eisenhower placed his seal on the United States as a "religious nation" in the hour that he had the President by the secular press. He spoke at the dedication of a new temple of the Washington Hebrew congregation, and before the House of Representatives.

It is said to be the first time that a President had attended actual Jewish services. In fact, such was the surprise that he discussed the reasons for his presence in solemn tones.

"A few moments ago," he said, "before this service began, I was privileged to meet some of the distinguished members of this congregation."

LIKE PAYS RESPECTS TO JEWISH FAITH—Several of the noted words of the President at the dedication of the United States Faith Temple, a service of a faith not his own, and in spite of other preoccupations, come both to the religious service and to the secular press. In this great occasion, it is thought that this is natural. There is nothing unique or extraordinary about it.

Just before the President left the United States, the official head of the country, is, after all, the official head of a great nation that is religious in its background, and which has a spiritual foundation on which to build.

"A few more concrete examples of this type of understanding and respect for the religious and substantial strength to the nation's brotherhood endeavors."

The editor may have been thinking of Senator Neely.

GIBE WITHHELD—A recent byplay in the house of representatives revealed why Rep. Joseph W. Martin of Massachusetts is so popular on both sides of the aisle.

Martin was tempted to "ting" the remark at McCormack's expense. Such restraint is rare in house political debate.

VIEWPOINTS OF OTHERS

Beware of False Dawn
Secretary of State John Foster Dulles warns that America must be careful not to mistake any "false dawn" for the dawn of peace.

"This is excellent advice, not only for this country but for all as well. True, the Russians appear to have indicated that their policies are now showing more of a desire to get along with the rest of the world, but does this mean any fundamental change in their attitude? We may hope so, but we must not allow hope to deceive us.

Just what has Russia done lately to explain its optimistic outlook on this side of the Iron Curtain? Dulles said that the Russians have: first, agreed on an Austrian peace treaty; second, a decision to send top leaders to Yugoslavia to discuss the Trieste question; and third, a willingness to take part in the Big Four summit meeting.

"That is quite an impressive list, but it is subject to some discount. The Austrian treaty may serve Russia's purposes by making 'neutrality' seem attractive to other war-torn European states. The visit to Yugoslavia is being undertaken for purely Russian interests and might increase rather than decrease world tension. The Trieste question, though new, is far from being a complete answer to a vexing problem. And the summit meeting, if it takes place, could turn into just another unproductive conference or worse, into a veto for communist propaganda.

Russia may well be attempting to promote complacency in Europe and elsewhere by clinging to a song of false hope. ROOF-TOP TAKEOFF

A report from the Congressional Aviation Safety Center at Cape Canaveral, Fla., says that the use of aircraft in the development stage which will be able to climb, vertically or almost so, and which in consequence may make it possible to use roof tops for landing, is being developed.

Some of these machines are prospectively simpler and less costly than helicopters; they would use rotors which, when engaged, put the aircraft in a combination with new wings. This sounds like a very promising idea, says the report, but the landing and takeoff problems which have come with the application of the automobile, it can bring its complications, too.

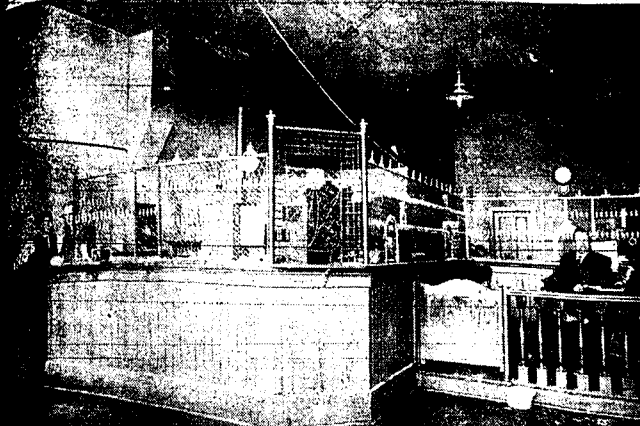

Demo Slates Effort to Cut Big Aid Bill

WASHINGTON, May 30 (AP)—Sen. Allen J. Ellender served notice today that he will introduce a "demonstration fight" to slash the administration's \$3,468,000,000 foreign aid bill.

The Louisiana Democrat, a member of the senate appropriations committee, said "all this aid we have given is misused in many many countries."

Ellender said he will try to cut the \$6 million dollar item in the bill for so-called "development account" aid and also will seek to bring the bill's biggest item—\$1,728,000,000 in military aid.

"The senate foreign relations committee approved the aid measure by a 13 to 2 vote," he said. "The senate is expected to begin debate Thursday."

In its report, filed Saturday, the committee called for a "vigorous continuation" of the program because of "paying dividends" in free world strength.

Chairman Walter P. George, D., Ga., of the senate foreign relations committee told reporters the committee "one definite effort to reduce the amount" but predicted the senate will approve the bill "pretty much as it is."

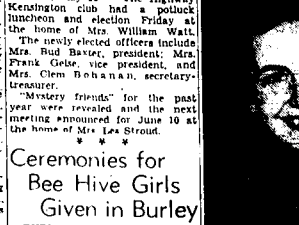
