Training for Idaho Police Opens Today

BOISE, June 1 (AP)—A two-week state police training school opens here today for 16 recruits who will take their place as state patrolmen in the next few months, raising the total to 41.

The curriculum includes classes in law, criminal and courtroom procedure.

Classes Outlined
There will be target practice with pistols, rifles, automatic rifles, machineguns and submachineguns and practice in the use of tear gas and rioting.

The courses will be given in a national guard armory building under the direction of Lieut. Robert McCall of the state police. Instructors have been borrowed from the attorney general's office, the state prosecuting attorney, state tax collector and federal bureau of investigation.

The recruits, admitted to the school through competitive examinations, also will be taught first aid and procedures for stopping traffic on the highway.

Ride With Officers
After graduation they will ride for two weeks with experienced officers before striking out on their own. The recruits will be taken to the police force ports of entry stations.

The expansion of the state force was ordered by the legislature in an effort to cut down Idaho's motor vehicle traffic death rate.

The legislature authorized for 21 new patrolmen, but five already had been added late last year under a special order of former Gov. Len Jordan.

Senator Morse, D. Ore., and I believe this can be done by erecting Heits canyon dam," Nonberg said. "But ex-Gov. McKay of Oregon and the present governor of Oregon would get around the necessity for building Heits canyon by promiscuously pouring concrete across the one river which must be spared if our salmon fisheries are to survive—and that river, of course, is the Salmon river of Idaho."

The senator said McKay and Patterson "evidently do not care one halp cent that these dams will destroy the salmon runs in their own state," and added:

"One wonders if they care more than they do about the Oregon fisheries. Surely, they must realize that the Oregon game commission and the Oregon fish commission have resolutely opposed dam construction on the Salmon river, yet Patterson and McKay blithely suggest these dams as alternatives to the Heits canyon."

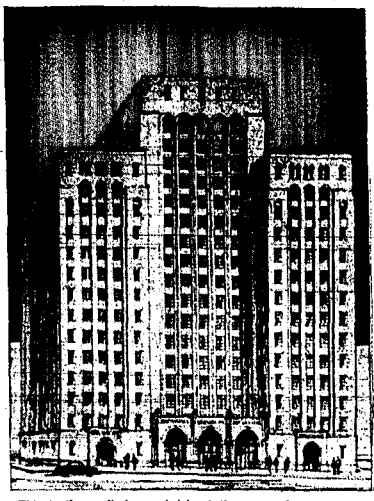

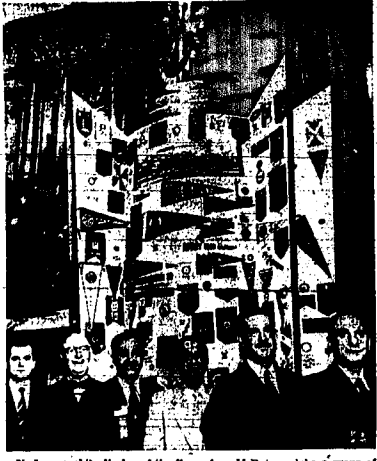

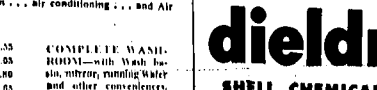

Care of Your Children

By ANGELO PATRI

"What is your opinion of the special classes the schools offer for the education of retarded children? We have just had a note from the school saying they are placing our child in such a class. We admit he is slow in learning academic subjects, but he does learn if one has patience to teach him. Will they have what it takes in this class to help him?"

As all special classes differ in purpose and quality of instruction, this question cannot be answered satisfactorily. If a retarded child is placed in a special class and keeps there day in and day out along with a group whose retardation varies widely, and whose chronological ages are far apart as well, little chance is there for progress.

If, however, this special class is only the home room for its pupils, and the child is placed in the home room where the teacher is in constant touch with the teachers to whom her pupils go for classroom instruction, the child has a chance to make headway.

This implies that the administration of the school accepts these pupils as the normal children are accepted. As subjects for instruction, the child is not an individual instruction, the child has a chance to make headway.

The usual classroom teacher will not do. The teacher of retarded children must understand how children grow, how they develop, how to stimulate the growth through experience suitable to the individual child.

Sound instruction in psychology, in physiology and in methods of teaching sub-normal pupils are essential. Experience gained in actual teaching under the supervision of professionally able leaders is equally important.

All this is expensive in time, class-room space, materials and spiritual dedication. But nothing less will serve to deliver these helpless children from a lifetime of misery. They can, under skilled supervision, become useful and happy members of the community.

Dr. Edward Johnson, of the Woodruff center, knows more about the advantage of such children than I ever will know. Anybody seeking information about their education can get it by addressing him at the school in Lancaster, Penn. He is helping people who have this problem.

Meanwhile, the public schools are terribly handicapped in their efforts to teach such children. They need the rooms, the equipment and the trained teachers. The schools are not set up to receive them. The authorities will give them the money to pay for their work.

You should never treat a harmful child. Do not allow any child to be beaten, hit or otherwise mistreated. It is the duty of every parent to see that his child is not mistreated. (Times-News, June 1, 1954, p. 10, column 1.)

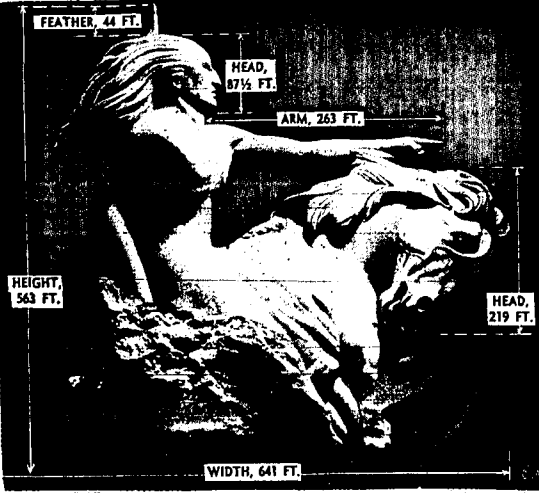

NEW YORK, June 1 (AP)—Has the American working girl become too attractive?
In her eye appeal to irresistible that her male coworkers in office, store or factory have a difficulty keeping their minds on their jobs?
Wouldn't it make for more efficiency in the business world if the girl in a factory or office working girl were turned back again into a "plain girl" perhaps by making her wear a standard uniform?
To many of us thoughtful students of the industrial scene the answer to all these questions is a stern and simple "yes!" In the interest of a greater production output, it is high time we did something to make working girls look unattractive, if not downright repulsive.

The Fresno driver who picked up the winners' check the previous year, died in Monday's race after leading 51 of the first 56 laps before his car crashed and burned. He tried to miss other wrecked cars.
