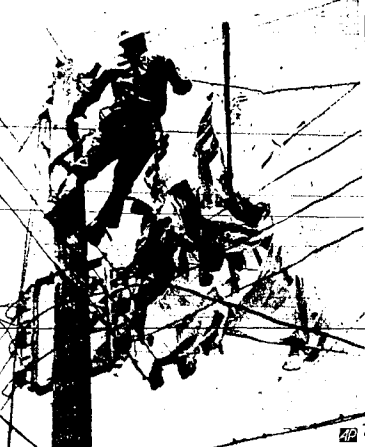

# Cigarette Smoking Gets Rough Time at Big Cancer Seminar

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 6.—The American Cancer Society is holding a big cancer seminar here today and evening, and a new and even rougher going-over of the smoking habit is expected.

NEW YORK, June 6 (AP)—Timothy B. Hartnett, chairman of the tobacco industry research committee, today rebuffed a plea by a doctor for accepting generalities in a doctor's report on the relationship between smoking and cancer.

Hartnett, whose organization is conducting its own survey into lung cancer, charged that the report reported that in Atlantic City, 285 reported cases, out of 8,305 deaths which occurred in a 31-month period among 18,000 men who were 50 to 70 years old at the start of the survey over three years ago, he said.

NEW YORK, June 6 (AP)—"The vaccine really says for my child," fifty American parents will be haunted by doubts over whether to let their children be inoculated in the 1955-56 season.

Although separated by a century and a half, there is a distinct historical parallel between the introduction of the polio and the smallpox vaccines.

The discovery of the polio vaccine has stirred public doubt and medical controversy. But whereas the nation's health agencies today have moved swiftly to establish new health measures.

Colonel's Wife Gives Plea for 4 U. S. Airmen

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—"Please let us not greet them with bands playing, flags waving and cheering throughout the land. Only to captivate and humiliate them when the investigations get underway in Washington."

This was a plea made today by the wife of Col. Frank H. Schwabe for the four airmen freed from Chinese Communist prisons last week.

Schwabe is marine career officer who signed a green warfare "confession" while a prisoner of the communists in Korea. He did so after being subjected to prolonged mental and physical torture.

A special court of inquiry ruled that he should not be court-martialed, but his superiors later decided he should not receive conventional assignments in the future.

Mrs. Beverley F. Schwabe wrote the Washington Post and Times Herald that she is unable to forget the treatment accorded him (her husband) upon his return to this country and subsequent return to Washington.

She said she hoped the four airmen would continue to exercise their "consideration and laudable restraint" as they shared in the "blessings of war who have 'confessed' and made propaganda speeches under duress."

The four airmen disclosed after their release Wednesday that they had pleaded guilty to charges of espionage and hinted they might also have signed some papers for the Chinese prior to their trial.

The air force has been questioning them as to whether their "confession" was a result of "intimidation or wrong-doing attaches to any of the pilots."

Delay Greeted Dam Hearings

WASHINGTON, June 6 (Special)—Senate Irrigation subcommittee hearings on the high Hells canyon dam project were delayed today because of the absence from Washington of member Sen. Arthur W. Watkins, R. Utah.

Subcommittee Chairman Clinton P. Anderson, D. N. M., set a new date Wednesday to consider the controversial measure which carries 29 sponsors on the senate side.

Three of the bills sponsors—Arthur Watkins, Washington—are members of the five-man Irrigation subcommittee.

Opponents of the high Hells canyon dam remarked that the program subcommittee members were scheduling hearings which they knew that Watkins—so far an impartial member—would be out of town.

Anderson dispelled the reports, however, by agreeing to Watkins' request that the hearings be moved to a hearing without Watkins, since the three members of the subcommittee who are not on the record may be able to outvote the opposition in any event.

Middle-Aged Verify Goals Says Expert

CHICAGO, June 6 (AP)—Sociologist James C. Stokin believes that most middle-aged Americans are like the donkey following the carrot hanging in front of his nose.

They never quite reach their life goal, he said, "but they just won't give up, try something else or alter their goals."

Stokin, associate professor of social sciences at the University of Chicago, has analyzed the problems of middle age in a paper on social forces.

Go Through Period The average individual goes through an "evaluation phase" of his life between the ages of 43 and 48, Stokin said.

Some try to escape through alcohol or alcohol. This is the age, Stokin said, when alcohol frequently becomes a problem.

Some, he said, become a sort of stoicism, or play the role of the disinterested guest, embittered and unappreciated.

A few persons, recognizing failure, will seek success in other fields. Stokin said. Others will lower their sights and adjust to what achievements they have made.

But most decide that the results are inconclusive and stick to their chosen courses, hoping that success is just around the corner. These people are characterized as the Mr. Micawber type.

Stokin estimated that 95 per cent of the middle-aged group falls into this category.

Can Bring Relief But most succeed in bringing satisfaction, he said. Some successful persons find that they chose the wrong goals, and they get no satisfaction from their accomplishments.

Stokin, who lived with the Monks in the 1930s for a spell, found they had a few problems in middle age.

The reason is simple. Their life goals are reaching old age and having grandchildren.

Red-Favoring GI Now Asks Visa to Leave

OLYMPIA, Wash., June 6 (AP)—The wife of former Col. Ohio G. Bell, one of 21 American prisoners of war who refused repatriation after the Korean war, said today her husband wants to come home.

Mrs. Jewett Bell said she had received two letters from her husband, dated April 5 and 15, he said, through the Red Cross. In both letters, dated April 5 and 15, he expressed the desire to come home, she said.

Tell of Trouble Bell told his wife in the letters that he was having difficulties obtaining a passport and that it would take him a few months to get out of Red China, Communists captured him Nov. 30, 1950.

Mrs. Bell said her husband wrote there were a lot of things about his case that are "unexplainable."

She said Mrs. Frances Knight, director of the passport office here, said that the United States has no representatives in Red China.

However, Mrs. Knight added that if Bell could get to Hong Kong or any other place where United States representatives maintained an office, something might be accomplished.

Not With Others Mrs. Bell said her husband apparently was not with any of the other 20 Americans who chose to remain behind the iron curtain after the Korean war. She did not know her husband's present whereabouts in Red China, but he told her he would send her a new address to which she could write him in the near future.

The two letters that came by way of the Red Cross sound like him, Mrs. Bell said, "while some of the others I have received didn't sound like him at all."

Bell, 24, is the son of Elbert A. Bell, late U. S. Ambassador, Miss. He and Mrs. Bell were married while he was stationed at Ft. Lewis, near here, before the Korean war.

There was no official pomp and ceremony at the beaches where the greatest invasion in history took place 11 years ago. French children played along the shore, a few American tourists visited the coast.

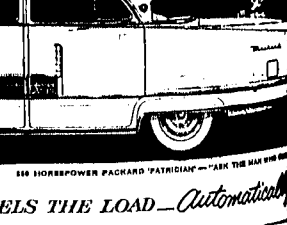
Some of the veterans who were there on June 6, 1944, came here on sentimental journeys.
