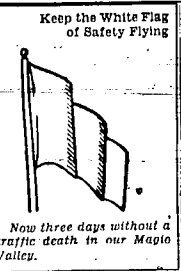

Polio Vaccine Safety Told in U. S. Reports

(From Page One) development of new standards which Scheide said at the time were designed to "make a safe vaccine safer." Much of the new material reviewed the technical data and studies made by scientists behind closed doors.

The report said no decisions will be made by the health department until the report is completed. The report said that cases developed in children inoculated with some vaccine produced by Cutter Laboratories at Berkeley, Calif. that firm withdrew its unused supply April 25 as the health department started its intensive study.

The report said: "This occurrence may have been due to vaccine which, by deficiency in the tests themselves or by error in the performance of the tests, passed the established safety procedures and yet contained sufficient large amounts of live virus to infect small number of recipients. It may also have been due to some break in manufacturing which led to contamination of other stock held on hand."

Relief from the Pacific ocean and Canada started to pour a blazing heat wave in the far west today. The cool air swept in on Pacific northwest cities where the temperature topped 100 yesterday. Temperatures also climbed in parts of the southeast, but it was still 100 shortly before midnight at Needles, Calif.

100 degrees at Seattle, Wash., tied the July's all-time heat record set in July, 1947. There were more than 30 reports in the city of streets buckling from the heat, marking them impossible to traffic.

The heat meanwhile expanded the Lake Washington ship canal bridges to within a quarter inch of the point where it could not have been opened for passing ships. Cold water was sprayed on it in an attempt to make it shrink.

Other Pacific northwest highs yesterday included 100 at Payson, Wash., and 100 at the Dalles, Ore., and Kent, Wash. Needles had a high of 118 and the 100's were common yesterday over the interior valleys of California and southern Arizona and parts of Nevada, New Mexico and Texas.

Temperatures slipped as much as 17 degrees later in Texas, however, while it was downright chilly in other parts of the nation. The mercury dropped into the 30s along the middle Atlantic and New England coasts and Leedville, Colo., had a below-freezing 30.

In the deep-south, meanwhile, a voracious forest fire threatened the small town of Oklawaha, Fla., Wash., and 100 at the Dalles, Ore., and Kent, Wash.
