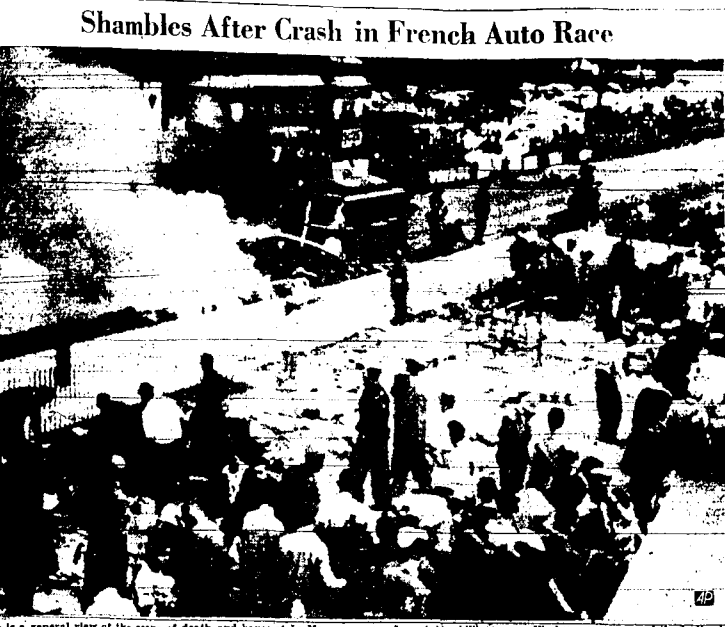

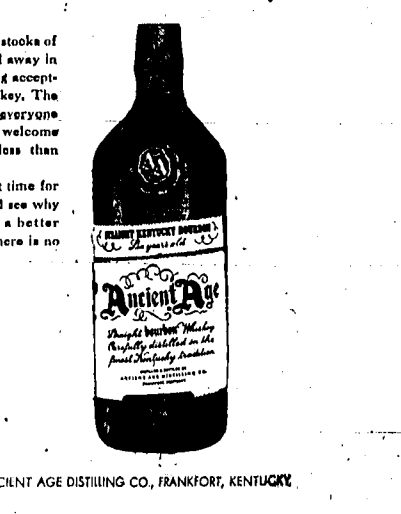

Museum Fund Drive Planned Through U. S.

NEW YORK, June 13 (AP)—Seventy-year-old American school children pooled their pennies to help fund the Statue of Liberty. Next year, their grandchildren will be asked to give pennies, dimes and dollars to build a museum at the statue's base.

A nationwide drive to raise five million dollars has been set for next Feb. 15 to build an "America Museum of Immigration" under the colonial symbol of Liberty in New York harbor that has been growing immemorial since 1886.

Officials of the campaign already have the blessing of President Eisenhower and will begin "winning up" enthusiasm for the drive with a "penny day" in Washington on Wednesday, June 28.

The miscellany of national and regional groups which represent the American people will be represented at this ceremony.

The idea for the museum came from some members of the National Historical and Preservation Society. Everybody in America—except our Indians—contributed to the fund. Every man, woman and child should contribute himself or herself or a descendant of one.

Building Planned
The museum will enclose more than 60,000 square feet of exhibition space around the base of the statue, which rises 305 feet above the waterline in the harbor. It is planned as a one-story, star-shaped building surrounding the present grounds.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower said the statue is a symbol of "liberty enlightening the world." It was of this gift to the world on the 100th anniversary of American independence and the friendship between George Washington and France's revolutionary hero, the Marquis de Lafayette.

Free Europe Lauds Bid to Share Atoms

LONDON, June 13 (AP)—Free Europe today expressed praise and gratitude for President Eisenhower's new offer to share United States atomic know-how.

Reaction ranged from enthusiasm by the major western European powers to cautious hope by Finland that the Soviet Union would let it take part in the atom-for-peace plan.

Mr. Eisenhower made two broad proposals Saturday in a commencement address at Pennsylvania State university. They were that:

1. The U.S. would furnish half the cost of building atomic reactors for research in five countries and supply fuel for them.
2. The U.S. would provide technical know-how "with prudent security considerations" for constructing and operating power reactors for peaceful purposes by friendly nations.

Finland is interested—but the final decision appeared to depend on Moscow, not on Helsinki. A foreign office source said that because of Finland's "delicate" relations with the Soviet Union, the government would need at least Kremlin understanding—if not its approval—to produce atomic energy.

In London, a high government source termed Mr. Eisenhower's offer as "extremely generous." "The Soviet Union," he said, "is always willing to share her atomic information for peaceful purposes," and "the Soviet Union is a welcome partner in the atom-for-peace plan."

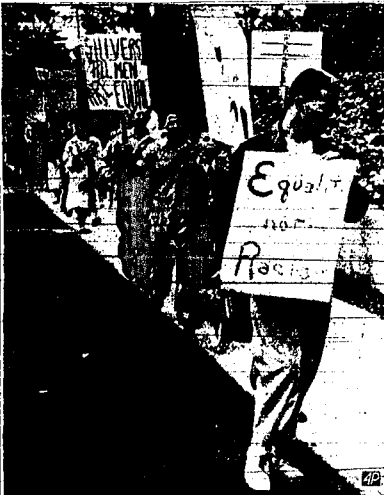
However, atomic energy officials said that Britain does not expect any direct benefit from the proposals because "we are way ahead of the research reactor level, which the proposals specified."

French sources close to Gaston Palewski, minister in charge of nuclear development, said France was "very pleased and encouraged" by President Eisenhower's offer.

In Bonn, a West German government spokesman said his country was in the "embryonic stage" of atomic research but it was "quite possible" Bonn might propose that the European community as a whole, and jointly, make use of the Eisenhower offer. He said the offer would be "favorably studied" by the government but that it was not likely West Germany would consider buying atom reactors immediately.

Italy, which is lagging in its own nuclear development, is eager for American assistance. Authorities are waiting for Mr. Eisenhower to sign an order this summer granting Italy an atomic reactor for industrial purposes.

Church, State Clash Hotly in Buenos Aires

BUEENOS AIRES, Argentina, June 13 (AP)—Federal police announced today the arrest of two groups of Catholic youths on charges of plotting to burn the Catholic cathedral in a move to discredit the government.

One group arrested had sought refuge in the residence of the archbishop of Buenos Aires.

A communique also announced the arrest of "groups" of armed Catholic youths around the cathedral in the downtown area where the rioting erupted last night. It did not say how many were arrested.

Reports Cited—

(Reports reaching Montevideo, Uruguay, said some 250 Catholics took shelter in the palace of Santiago Cardinal Copello after battling a mob of some 500 persons, apparently inflamed by Peronist charges of "treason" against the church.

(According to the reports, the Peronists considered the cathedral and buried insults at the worshippers. A group of Catholics who took up positions on the steps of the church were pelted with stones and routed.

(Police and firemen used tear gas and high pressure hoses to disperse the crowds. One woman was seriously injured by the explosion of a tear gas bomb and at least five other persons were treated for minor injuries.

(The reports said the mob of Peronists also entered the archbishop's residence with gunfire and stones. A number of windows were smashed but there was no report of casualties.

Charges Made—

The police communique charged that the rioters were plotting "elements belonging to Catholic action"—a lay organization. It said these elements planned to set fire to the cathedral and then put the blame on "organizations of the people.

It cites as "evidence" the roundup of "a group of young men observed meeting around the cathedral.

Sign

WASHINGTON, June 13 (AP)—A sign on a highway to be used in the civil defense test evacuation of Washington Wednesday bears this notice:

"On June 15 this highway will be used by the public and others."

It was found that the sign was found to be "armed."

The riots came on the heels of government criticism of the huge Catholic demonstration in Buenos Aires Saturday. Some 30,000 Catholics massed to protest the government ban on a rescheduled Corpus Christi day procession. The church had rescheduled the procession because the government recently declared the holiday, which fell on Thursday, a regular working day.

Demo Chairman Eyes Peace Trip

DALLAS, Tex., June 13 (AP)—Paul Butler, national chairman of the Democratic party, flew here today to begin a week-long tour of Texas designed to patch up the rift in party ranks.

The Democrats split in the 1952 presidential campaign when the liberals supported Adlai Stevenson, while Gov. Allan Shivers led the conservative elements in backing Eisenhower.

Shivers is not expected to attend any of the regional dinners scheduled for Butler. Several other prominent Texas Democrats will also be absent.
