

Peron Stands Firm; Intends To Keep Post

Buenos Aires, Argentina, June 24 (AP)—President Juan D. Peron declared his firm intention to remain head of the Argentine government.

All 18 ministers in his cabinet resigned yesterday to permit him to reorganize the government as he wishes, the press secretariat announced.

Many other developments of the past two days demonstrated that Peron is still Argentina's boss despite rumors that the naval-air revolt a week ago had shaken his grip.

In a 14-minute radio address to the nation last night, his fourth since the costly revolt, Peron reviewed events leading to the aerial bombing of his office, court and government House and told of his determination to stay on.

"I would wish the government if I were not convinced that I have full public support," he said "I call on all Argentines to put aside all bitterness."

He charged that the plot leading to the revolt was planned as early as November, by the military with the aid of some members of the Roman Catholic clergy and some members of the Democratic Union.

KELOGG, June 24 (AP)—A picket line was thrown up at the Sunshine Mining company yesterday afternoon and night shift workers stayed from their jobs at the world's largest straight silver producer.

The walkout was called "wildcat" and "unauthorized" by a company spokesman. Top officials of the CIO Steelworkers union, which won the big mine away from the International Union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers in a bargaining election, could not be reached for comment.

A company official, who refused use of his name, said, "The strike, which has been termed wildcat by the officers and executive board of local 509 of the United Steelworkers of America, was in protest of the suspension of an employee."

Ruling Favors Child Workers

BOJER, June 24 (AP)—Minor employees in violation of the child labor law are subject to the workmen's compensation law, the Idaho supreme court ruled yesterday.

In an unanimous opinion by Chief Justice C. J. Taylor, the court upheld an award by the industrial accident board to Lloyd Lockard, injured Sept. 6, 1942, while employed by the St. Maries Lumber company. He was 15 at the time.

Following the hearing, the board made the award to Lockard, from which Lockard appealed to the supreme court.

The court held that "the employment of the child labor law, is not sufficient to create the relationship of employer and employee under the workmen's compensation law."

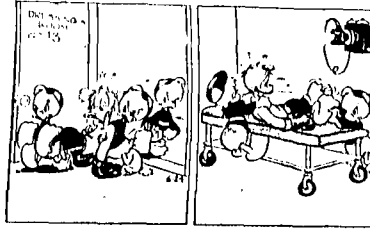

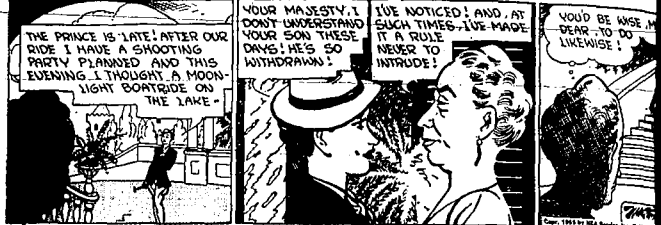
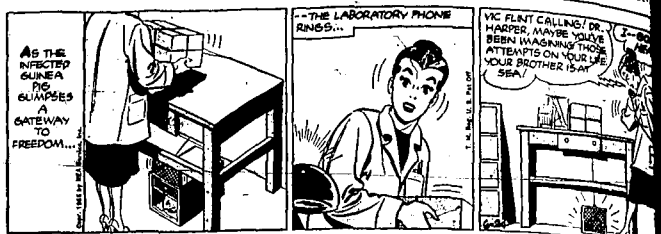

Councilman Is Appointed for Post Vacancy

BURLEY, June 24.—The city council has appointed Robert J. Merritt to replace Councilman Eugene Budge who resigned recently after it was discovered he had a brother also working for the city which is contrary to the nepotism law of the state.

Palmer Saterstrom has handed the council a petition from citizens who are protesting any action on the part of the council to place restrictions on licensed dogs in the city limits. A motion previously had been made by another group of citizens to restrict the dogs at certain parts of year. No action has been taken by the council as yet.

A report from the recently re-elected zoning committee has been submitted to the council on a request submitted by H. E. Canine to change the zoning laws for the city. Canine asked the commission to convert the lots he owns at the southwest corner of Overland and Main streets from a residential to a commercial zone. He said he wants to construct a market on the property to lease to Jay Schofield.

The zoning committee is headed by Jess Parsons. He is assisted by Carl Patrick, Fred McCall and Robert Ramsey. The council instructed the city attorney to prepare ordinance and necessary action on the recommended changes.

Building permits have been approved for \$18,000; Forrest Hintz, a dwelling for \$21,000; and W. H. Weiborn, a storage building at a cost of \$400.

Wheat Growers Cast Ballots Saturday for Market Quotas

WASHINGTON, June 24.—Wheat growers in 36 states are voting Saturday on whether to accept government marketing quotas for their 1956 crop.

The outcome may determine whether there will be unrestricted wheat production in 1956 which would add to an already huge surplus.

If quotas are approved by two-thirds of those voting, producers are to set 25 percent of the acreage allotted for their farms will be eligible for price support loans at \$1.25 a bushel. This would be 76 percent of parity.

Those who exceed their acreage allotment will be subject to marketing penalties of 45 percent of parity price on wheat grown on their excess land.

If quotas are not approved, present law provides for support at 50 percent of parity, or \$1.19 a bushel, for producers who stay within their acreage allotments. If the quotas are voted out, farmers can exceed their allotment without penalty. But if they do exceed acreage allotments, they will get no price support loans. Under law, the wheat crop is restricted to 85 million bushels.

Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson has called the voting proposition a "difficult choice." He has not asked farmers either to vote for or against quotas. Earlier this week he held a meeting of the National Association of Television and Radio Farm Directors where he would suggest a new wheat price support plan to Congress if farmers reject quotas. He did not elaborate.

The department's wheat experts say the voting "will be close." Approximately 80,000 farmers are eligible to vote during 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. local time in the polling booths maintained by county agricultural stabilization and conservation (ASC) committees.

To be eligible, a farmer must grow more than 16 acres of wheat. One department expert made an "educated guess" that "because of the apparent wide interest, 400,000 to 600,000 farmers will vote." Last year, 285,000 farmers voted, 73.3 percent of them in favor of quotas. The highest number ever voting on quotas was 660,000 in 1951, with 81 percent in favor. There were more wheat farmers then than there are now.

The quota system is an attempt to cope with the huge surplus of the nation's most important bread grain. Behind the 76 percent parity price level is a school of thought that such a guarantee return is not enough to cause the individual farmer to keep on growing more and more wheat at his major source
