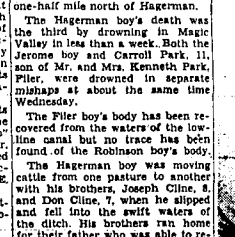

### Dispute Predicted for Views Upon Resources, Power Bids

WASHINGTON, June 27 (AP)—Ben Moreell has opened a bag of tomatoes on the old dispute over public cats. He is a retired admiral and chairman of the Hoover commission's task force on water resources and public power.

His 26-man group did the ground-work investigation for the 12-man commission headed by former President Hoover. The task force set up in November 1953, handed in a 1,000-page report to the commission on March 21, 1955.

Now the commission, free to accept or reject the task force findings, will make a recommendation to the President and Congress on water resources and public power. The task force and commission recommendations are due out in about a week.

But in a speech at St. Louis June 15 Moreell, who is chairman of the board of Jones and Laughlin Steel Corporation, indicated:

1. His group recommended to the commission that the federal government sell its power plants and get out of the business of selling electric power to private utilities or, if that can't be done, states or local communities.
2. The Hoover commission itself will not, in its recommendations to the President and Congress, go along with everything the task force proposed. But Moreell did not hint what exactly the commission will say.
3. He, the admiral, will "do all in my power to mobilize public support" for those parts of the commission's recommendations with which he agrees.

This promise points to perhaps an even more lustrous fight, lasting for years inside and outside Congress, on the old dispute over public versus private power or, to put it briefly: Should the government sell electric power in competition with private enterprises?

Not long after Moreell's task force reported to the commission in March they were "leaks" on the recommendations it made. The up in November 1953, handed in a 1,000-page report to the commission on March 21, 1955.

That storm seems certain to be stirred up promptly when the task force recommendations are issued, particularly if the Hoover commission's suggestions parallel what the task force apparently proposed.

Moreell did not say outright in his St. Louis speech what he expects a recommendation will be. But he did say some of his members dissent from his general findings. Any dissent was on specific points, he said.

Nevertheless, here are some of the conclusions Moreell said he arrived at:

1. No new federal power projects should be built. There is no present rates private utilities should charge since the government plants pay no taxes and have been financed at lower interest rates.
2. Pulling together some pieces in Moreell's speech, this seems to be his philosophy: The nation's taxpayers in general shouldn't have to bear the costs for the benefits received by local consumers in some particular area of the country.

Besides, he said, the government:

has used water resources and power development for social and political instead of strictly economic ends. The government, he said, does not have a responsibility to supply any community, section or region with its power requirements.

### TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—A Canosa-like pilgrimage to the Texas home of two distinguished anti-FDR and anti-new deal rebels by Paul M. Butler, Democratic national chairman, has upped that political figure's reputation as a leader in humiliating submission to Marshal Tito. It has widened the breach between the anti-FDR and anti-new deal forces as they map strategy for next year's presidential election.

In an effort to achieve harmony among Texas Democrats, who gave president Eisenhower a majority of about 100,000 in 1944, Butler visited the Uvalde residence of former Vice President John N. Garner and the Houston office of Jesse H. Jones, who held so many high posts under Hoover and Roosevelt that it is difficult to recall them; the most important, of course, was his nomination as director of the Federal Reserve system which helped so much to whip the depression and to win World War II.

**Key Texter**  
 FEELS OF PAST—As a relative newcomer to national politics, Butler apparently was unaware of the bitter feuds and differences which the two conservative Texans had with the Roosevelt administration. He became known as the "fight or broke" with the "liberals" in the very issues which now divide the Democrats.

Butler, who has been a vocal supporter of the anti-FDR cause since 1932, was one of the few Democrats who were not in the White House when he was elected to the vice-presidential chair by "Hank" Wallace.

If there was a symbol of anti-Roosevelt philosophy within the Democratic party then, and possibly now, it was the sturdy "Jack" Garner.

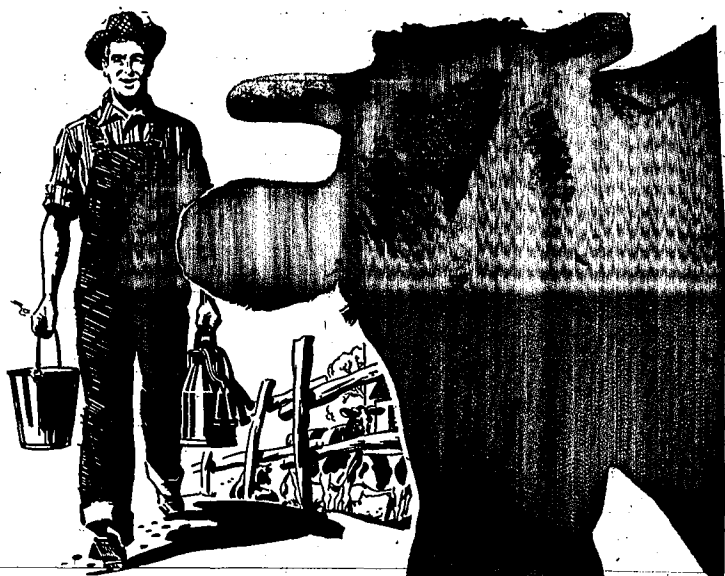

### Jurist Favors Admittance of Reds' Regime

TOKYO, June 27 (AP)—U. S. Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas said today the west should recognize Communist China and that Nationalist China's seat on the United Nations security council be given to some other Asian nation.

Douglas said the nationalist government of President Chiang Kai-shek might be placed under a U. N. trusteeship until its future is decided by a plebiscite. He admitted he did not know if the nationalists would agree.

There are two China today," the globe-trotting jurist said in an interview. "The thing to do is to recognize that fact and work out a compromise with the Chinese people's recognition. At the same time we should protect Nationalist China."

Douglas suggested revision of the U. N. charter to give China's seat on the security council to some Asian nation or perhaps to rotate that seat among the free Asian nations. He specifically suggested Red China and Nationalist China be barred from the security council.

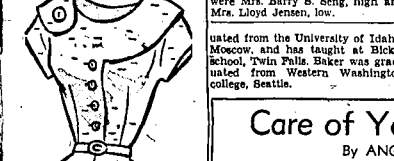

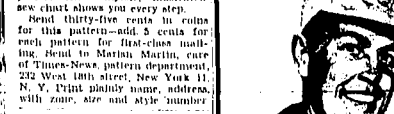

### Charles James, American Dior, Tries Revolution

NEW YORK CITY, June 27—If America has a counterpart of Christian Dior, it probably is a mercantile young man named Charles James, who came to the United States last year. Dior has reshaped the female form at least twice in the last half dozen years, and so, in a modest way, has James.

The slight, dark James looks with cold contempt on most of his competitors in the American garment industry, but considers Dior one of the great geniuses of his time. This distinction he also claims for himself.

During his explosive career as an American couturier, Charles has introduced his concepts into the wholesale dress market, while continuing his exclusive and expensive custom business for private clients.

His sense of temperament is not conducive to harmonious partnerships, and most of his tempers with wholesale manufacturers have ended in explosions.

Now, however, James is entering the wholesale business under his own name.

His announced intention is to present clothes completely different from those of other designers. He says he has created a new look—high, wide armholes, narrow, shouder, flat backs and full fronts.

James says these clothes can be worn by almost anybody and claims they are designed to flatter and camouflage the imperfections of the average female figure. His theory is that women don't get fat all over, but mostly in front, and his new silhouette gives fullness where it is needed.

He says he designed his collection from those of other designers. He says he has created first a dummy of the female figure in the shape he observes women are assuming, and then goes on from there.

He says all fashion starts with posture, and that every year or so there is a subtle change in the way women stand and hold themselves. The present posture he describes as neither a "Paris slouch" nor a ramrod effect.

It is, says James, the shape of things to come.

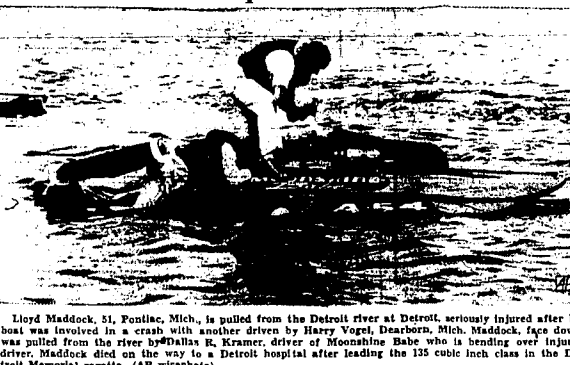

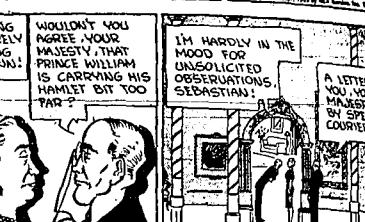

# Bible 'Picture Book' Edition Printed; Big Sales Expected

NEW YORK, June 27 (AP)—A new "picture book" edition of the New Testament is expected to be a world-wide best seller.

The volume, its pages packed with pictures, was published by the American Bible Society under the title, "The Good News." It is the climax of a five-year campaign against the "dead" and "lifeless" Bible. The book is by 112 high pages in color. The complete text of the New Testament, partly in the modernized wording of the revised standard version of the Bible, partly in the old family phrases of the King James version. But the text is arranged in modern paragraphs from without numbered chapters and verses, and the print is large.

More than half the space on most pages is filled with pictures and diagrams appear in slightly more than 250 pages.

More than 100 photographs were taken especially for the book, including many by a team of photographers who toured Palestine on assignment from the society.

Dr. Gilbert Darlington, Ordained Episcopalian minister since 1920, conceived the illustrated New Testament and pushed it to completion. Mainly in the last five years, he spent months abroad hunting for desired pictures and negotiating for their purchase of cost.

Dr. Darlington was unable to estimate the total cost of producing the "Good News" Bible. He said actual publication costs for the first printing of 150,000 copies were about \$200,000. The retail price (\$2.00 a copy) "really at cost," he said, to assure the widest possible distribution.

Reprints and complete sets have been pouring into society headquarters.

# Kremlin Rift Alters Policy; Romulo Says Classified

SAN FRANCISCO, June 27 (AP)—Philippine Ambassador Carlos P. Romulo said today that the United States government has classified the Russian rift in the Kremlin as a "grave" situation.
