Reds Viewed As "Sincere" On Arms Cut

It is possible to agree with the Russians as to the necessity of balancing and gradually reducing armaments in Europe.

One way of doing this might be to hold a joint conference of North Atlantic Treaty organization nations and members of the Russian-sponsored Warsaw Alliance to try to work a balance and impose armaments in the European area.

Along with this, it might be possible to consider the problem of Germany, since the future of that country is a vital factor in the over-all question of European security.

Plans by Moscow

Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov has seemed in public comment to be building a possible European reduction of foreign forces in East and West Germany. Western leaders are opposing this as a possible way to restore conditions in Germany to more nearly normal.

Douglas said that if the Soviets refuse to discuss the problem of German rearmament, it is evidence of insincerity in their talk about wanting to reduce tensions in Europe.

But it did not appear that Butler was laying down any stipulations that the Soviets be required to order to get other results, such as disarmament.

On the contrary, Butler hopes to be that the German and European arms balance questions can be handled in parallel negotiations following the Geneva conference.

In this connection, it is understood that if the Soviets show a real interest in German unity but hinder it for the West, they might revert-East Germany into a military zone, the Western powers might undertake assurances that East Germany would be maintained in a demilitarized state. This would be part of a deal to get Germany united on terms acceptable to the West.
