

Girl, 13, Dies in Car Crash

Valley's only traffic fatality over the Fourth of July weekend was the death of a 13-year-old girl, Mrs. Jess Laughlin, Filer, who died Sunday as a result of injuries received in a crash shortly before noon Sunday. The accident happened two miles west of Filer on the Clever road with the driver, Mrs. Laughlin, 40, a passenger in a 1941 Chevrolet driven by James L. Morgan, 17, Filer.

The girl's death raises the total number of fatalities for Magic Valley this year to 13 and up to the total for the entire state to 107. With Morgan and the Laughlin girl were Wanda Laughlin, 15, a 13-year-old girl, and Charles B. Stratford, Filer. Morgan received a broken collarbone and Wanda Laughlin a broken arm. The girl was treated for minor bruises at Magic Valley Memorial hospital and released. The other girls "will be patients" at the hospital.

Nighty Communist Airpower Revealed in Moscow Display

MOSCOW, July 4 (AP)—More than 400 planes, including a new jet airliner and new types of fighters and long-range bombers finished over Moscow yesterday in the greatest display of airpower in the history of the Soviet Air Force. The annual air show staged by the red air force indicated the Soviet Union may have caught up with and perhaps surpassed the United States in many fields of modern military and civilian aircraft design.

Unveiled for the first time was a flashing jet-propelled jet airplane that placed Russia firmly in the race for supremacy in civilian jet flight. The Soviet Union's first jet, a four-engine transport, it is expected to be named the Ilyushin-20 after an aircraft designer, Sergei Ilyushin.

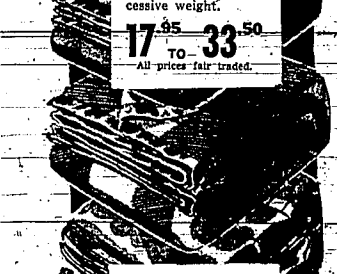

Scientists "Curing" Neurosis By Using Only Physical Means

New York, July 4.—Two scientists have announced that they have developed a new method for curing neurosis by using only physical means. The method, which is based on the use of a special type of pen, is said to be a major breakthrough in the treatment of neurosis.

The scientists, Dr. L. A. Livergood and Dr. J. D. Bywater, of the University of California at Los Angeles, announced their discovery in a paper presented at the annual meeting of the American Psychological Association in New York.

Dr. Livergood said that the method is based on the use of a special type of pen which is designed to produce a specific type of vibration. This vibration, he said, is said to be a major breakthrough in the treatment of neurosis.

Gun on New TV Set Might Satisfy Whims

CHICAGO, July 4 (AP)—Zenith Radio corporation has come to the scene of a television set which would like to shoot some of the people they see on their screens.

Report Shows Surplus Crop "Investments"

WASHINGTON, July 4 (AP)—The agriculture department issues a report each month showing how much money it has invested in surplus farm products.

In a commodity breakdown, along with the big items like cotton, wheat, corn and butter, appears the word "strategic materials." These include minor products and strategic and critical materials.

Strategic Goods Noted
The latest report shows that in addition to about six billion dollars invested in farm surplus, about \$7 million dollars are tied up in strategic and critical materials. National security regulations keep officials from saying what these materials are.

How does the agriculture department control these materials? It enters the ore and strategic materials business in a big way if it wanted to. In fact, the agency was directed to do so.

Large Holdings Expected
As a consequence, the department hopes to acquire moderately large holdings of such materials within the next year or so.

Officials would be pleased if it is a year from now they could report that the department's store of wheat—which now involves an investment of more than 2½ billion—were way down and its holdings of manganese, chrome, mica and other strategic materials way up.
