Peron's Attacks Against Priests Are Definite Changes From Anti-U.S. Cry

WASHINGTON, July 3 (AP)—The cry "Peron, all Braden, not" is a thing of the past in Argentina.

That change in a way, symbolizes a two-year turn in relations between U. S. and Argentine governments. Unlike the past, those relations are now described as friendly, although not close.

The essential fact is that the United States no longer is the whipping boy for President Juan Domingo Peron of Argentina. He may be finding a more formidable opponent than a U. S. straw man, epitomized by former U. S. Ambassador Spruille Braden.

There has long been, however, an undercurrent of resentment against the United States in Argentina. One of the most hostile and formerly one of the most democratic of the South American republics.

The resentment in part was based on economic and political rivalry. Argentina, an agricultural state, produces principally meat and wheat. It found the United States in competition in certain markets. It also had ambitions to be the leader of the American republics.

Peron, who came to power in 1946, refused to admit fresh Argentine loans. The U. S. pointed out that roof and mouth disease was present in parts of Argentina. It wanted to protect its own herds.

The Argentines, however, construed the ban as a national insult. Ever since, except for relatively brief periods of warmer relations, Argentina has shown distrust and little liking for the "colossus of the north."

Peron, in beginning his climb to power in 1946, found it convenient and useful politically to an anti-American feeling. Occasionally he would drop his attacks on a subject who was a man shutting off a spigot of water, but until two years ago he always returned to them just as abruptly.

Relations tumbled to an all-time low after the closure and expropriation of La Prensa, the great Buenos Aires newspaper which had long been an independent critic of Peron's methods and philosophy—since 1951.

A wave of unprecedented criticism, largely from elements in the United States, broke around the head of the Argentine ruler. He resented it bitterly, and the anti-American attacks stopped.

Throughout 1951 and most of 1952, the almost completely controlled Argentine press blamed the United States and yelled "Yanqui imperialism" on every possible occasion. The state department was accused of sponsoring unrest against Peron, and seeking to obtain Latin American soldiers for Korea.

Peron, as the past year unfolded, was less than friendly to the United States and he has found that honey ad more than salt in vinegar.

Meanwhile, his attacks on "bad" Catholic priests the Genes recite.

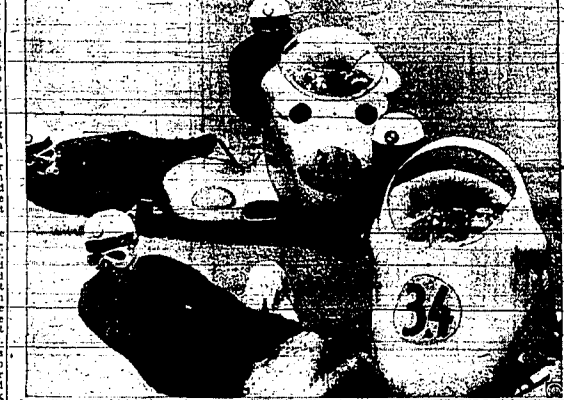

Khrushchev May Attend Big 4 Talks as Major Soviet Envoy

LONDON, July 5 (AP)—Soviet Communist party boss Nikita S. Khrushchev's comments on the Geneva conference stirred speculation today that he may travel to the big four talks as the behind-the-scenes quarterback on Soviet policy.

Khrushchev, Premier Nikolai Bulganin and other top government officials attended the independence day celebrations at the American Embassy in Moscow last night. Not in the 20 years since the U. S. recognized the communist regime of the Soviet Union had such a high ranking delegation set foot inside the embassy.

But it was the burly Khrushchev who took the spotlight with a joint and serious commentary on the Soviet position toward the forthcoming "summit" talks of the big four.

What Khrushchev had to say was immediately cabled to diplomats in London. There was no immediate official reaction to his statements but observers stressed the importance of his remarks.

They said it appeared Khrushchev spoke "straight from the shoulder." His statement was uncoupled in the usual double-talk indicative of Soviet propaganda.

"If you talk with us honestly and sincerely, it is equal to equal, something will come of it," the Geneva talks," Khrushchev told his host, charge d'affaires Walter N. Walmesley. Ambassador Charles E. Bohlen was not at the celebration. He is in Washington to help President Eisenhower prepare for the talks scheduled to open July 12.

Khrushchev did not say who the "us" will be. But western observers said Khrushchev's obvious predilection over the silent Bulganin left little doubt as to the party chief's ascendancy in foreign policy for the "summit" talks.

It was recalled that it was Khrushchev who played the leading role in the recent visit by the Soviet "peace" mission to Marshal Tito in Belgrade.

Khrushchev underlined Soviet strength in his remarks at the party yesterday, but the atmosphere was friendly and even jovial. There were toasts to the United States and to the "success of the Geneva conference."

The British Communist party newspaper, "The Daily Worker," summed up Khrushchev's statement with the headline: "We'll Speak From Strength: Khrushchev." This emphasis highlighted what

was seen as a significant switch in Russian talk. All of Moscow's propaganda organs for months have condemned what they called the United States policy of "negotiating from a position of strength."

"The position of strength" theme has run through soviet opposition to West German rearmament, US defense pacts in Europe, the middle east and far east, and U. S. atomic development.

Khrushchev scuttled the theme with an 11-word sentence.

"The Soviet Union has never been in a more solid position," he said. United Press staff-correspondent

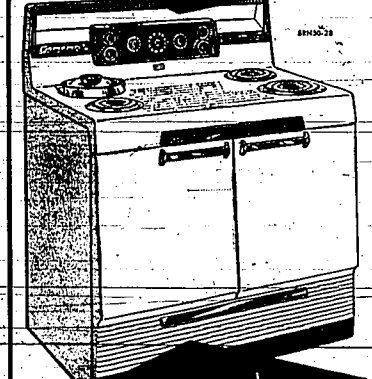
