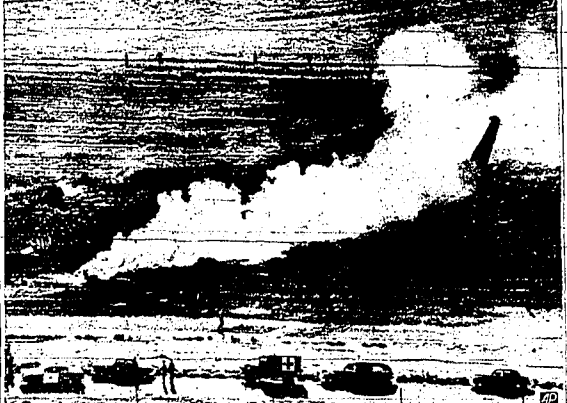

Agreements of Foreign Court Trials Backed

WASHINGTON, July 14.—The White House yesterday defended as fair and workable the international agreements under which U. S. troops abroad are subject to trial by foreign courts for off-duty crimes. Presidential Assistant Bryce N. Harlow, in a letter to Rep. H. J. Gross, R. Ind., said the so-called "status of forces" treaties in effect since 1953 with NATO allies and several other countries, contain safeguards for a fair trial and have been "working well" in practice. The White House letter was made public by Gross as the house foreign affairs committee opened public hearings on a resolution, by Rep. Frank T. Bow, R. O. calling on President Eisenhower to cancel the treaties.

Makes Charge Bow said the treaties allow American GIs to be thrown into foreign "dungeons" in violation of their constitutional rights. He asserted that in addition to the known treaties ratified by the senate in 1953, there are similar international agreements with other nations that have been kept secret. Equipment Is Not Damaged In Atom Test

WASHDCEN, N. J., July 14.—The Radio Corporation of America disclosed today that a radio transmitter and other equipment erected at the atomic test site in Nevada sustained only minor surface damage in a nuclear explosion last May 9. It said an AM broadcasting station housed less than a mile from blast center could have returned in the "minutes after" the atomic test. Theodore A. Smith, an RCA vice president and general manager, said "no tube or component was damaged." He said the information on the effect of the atomic blast on commercial-communications equipment was cleared for release by authorities in Washington. RCA equipment at the atomic test site included a standard commercial 250-watt radio transmitter and other equipment for a fully operative AM broadcast station, a mobile radio base station operating in the 23-30 megacycle range, and two mobile radio units installed in automobiles. All were housed less than a mile from the blast center, with the exception of one two-way radio located 10,000 feet away. The company said the buildings and automobiles housing the equipment sustained "partial to complete destruction." But the transmitter, mobile station and two-way radios remained completely operative, and were damaged only slightly by flying glass and debris, it said. The test was made under auspices of the federal civil defense administration.

West-Will Ask 500,000 Limit For New Army

LONDON, July 14 (U-P)—The West is pushing ready-made army forces to 500,000 men—even after the count is reached.

The east zone of Germany, now controlled by the communists, would be dismantled and its army zone under allied proposals, informed diplomatic circles.

The "wish" is to convince Russia that a unified German army in the North Atlantic Treaty Alliance (NATO), need menace nobody.

French Premier Edgar Faure drafted the plan for submission to next week's Big Four conference at Geneva.

The proposal would top a series of suggestions that the United States and France have in mind to make German uniformed more acceptable to the Soviets and a bolster the peace and security of Europe.

The informants said the plans are dependent on Soviet agreement to the election of a united German government that would have the right to elect a cabinet and a parliament.

The 12-division of 500,000-soldier maximum is the same limit that has been set as Germany's contribution to NATO.

Strict curbs which presently govern West German armament production also would be applied to a reunited Germany under the Western plan.

According to the informants, even such military supplies as also would be controlled if a reunited Germany should accept the terms of NATO in terms of the Western proposal.

The demilitarization of East Germany would mean that a buffer zone would separate the German army units from their communist neighbors in the east. No military bases would be allowed in East Germany.

No armament factories would be allowed in the area. International troops would be set up at strategic points to insure compliance.

The Western-embarked crazily now appear to have taken up directly opposite positions on the role which a reunited Germany should play in Europe.

The United States, Britain and France still seem to favor a reunited Germany which is free to join NATO.

Russia says Germany cannot be united if it is free afterward to join NATO.

Volunteers Used In Reserve Plan

WASHINGTON, July 14 (U-P)—The Senate-armed-services-committee yesterday approved a military reserve plan calling for heavy voluntary participation for the next two years.

The Eisenhower administration had sought compulsory reserve service for all men leaving the active ranks.

Chairman Russell D. On, called the measure "fashioned in his committee as a good sensible compromise" and a "vast improvement" over one already passed by the House.

The bill is designed to expand the present 700,000-man reserve to a trained backlog of some 2,000,000 by 1950. That was the administration's goal, but the House bill differs sharply from methods urged by the Pentagon.

Indicted on Perjury

MEXICO CITY, July 14 (U-P)—Federal grand jury indicted turnabout witness Harvey Matusew on six counts of perjury.

The charges grew out of Matusew's accusation that Roy M. Cohn, former assistant U.S. attorney, had induced Matusew to give false testimony at the 1952 conspiracy trial of 15 second-station Communist leaders.

HANGED FOR MURDER

LONDON, July 14 (U-P)—Beautiful Ruth, Ellis, 28-year-old divorced mother of two children, was hanged yesterday for murdering her unfaithful lover. The execution stirred the public for abolition of the death penalty.

Red Price Dips on Fruits, Vegetables

MOSCOW, July 14 (U-P)—Prices of fresh fruits and vegetables dropped in Moscow yesterday and buying in the markets was heavy.

Onions are down to eight rubles per kilogram (2.2 pounds). Tomatoes, strawberries and cherries, 10 rubles and gooseberries 6 rubles a kilogram.

The official rate is a four-ruble-to-1-U.S. dollar, but the market factors determine the cost of living for Russian. Cost of living items are better related to the average wage because of reliable estimate from 600 to 700 rubles a month.

In Beginning, Prosperity Is Like Inflation

NEW YORK, July 14.—Prosperity and inflation look alike in the start. Prosperity is accepted and welcomed as it comes. But many fancy they see inflation hiding behind prosperity's skirts, tagging along with prosperity's friends, riding labor costs and booming demand.

Wages have been rising rapidly these years—and have been automatically pointed up by "bean-drawers" in the auto and steel industries.

The question is how much of this is the result of the shares in prosperity between employers and employee—and how much of it will just mean higher prices for everyone?

Depend on Rates Many businessmen, doubtless, have bet on a rise in steel wages and prices as a sure thing. They are betting on a rise in steel prices. Steel traders have been bidding up blocks of stocks in industries that would "profit" from inflation.

As a basic raw material for many products, steel will be in higher production costs in many factories. It may take time for that to be reflected in prices, but more likely, in part to the retail cost of goods those factories produce. And management faces the risk that customers may balk at price hikes, and thus make the whole wage-price structure shaky.

Between the end of World War II and this year, the base wage rate in the steel industry has risen seven times for a total of 69% over an hour. Steel prices have risen over 100% for a total of \$28.84 a ton.

Wages Go Up Now wages are going up an average of 15 cents an hour. Price hikes, after they're worked out for various steel products, may average about 10%.

Belief Cited Belief that high demand for steel will make price increases stick is being cited as the reason for many price hikes.

Purchasing of Shoes Makes New Records

NEW YORK, July 14.—Americans are buying shoes at a record clip. Footwear production in 1955 will smash all prior records.

That's the latest word from Boston, St. Louis and other big manufacturing centers. If manufacturers' guesses are correct, you'll stride along in style this year. The nation's total shoe bill in 1955 is expected to add up to \$5 billion dollars—an all-time high.

That's sweet music in the ears of manufacturers who saw sales slide in 1954.

Figures for the first six months of 1955 show which way the wind is blowing now: U. S. factories turned out a record 294 million pairs—up a hefty 12 per cent from the same period last year.

Why the boom? High wages and plenty of consumer purchasing power are one answer—and with population trends on the upbeat, there are more feet to be shod. Shoe merchandisers will give you two additional reasons: Low prices and fast changing styles.

Whether prices are too low, or not low enough, depends on where you sit. Manufacturers confronted with holding production costs say prices will eventually go up; retailers are holding the line. When you stop for a new pair of shoes this fall, you'll probably find prices just about the same as a year ago. That's because it's a buyer's market in shoes today; competition was never keen.

Quick shifts in styles are calculated to bring you into the shoe event when the winter year already over have plenty of wear. And never before have styles been changed so drastically or so often.

Solons Finish Acts on Bills, Approve Sum

WASHINGTON, July 14 (AP)—Congress yesterday completed action on a compromise bill appropriating \$1,565,619,500 to finance the atomic energy commission, the Tennessee valley authority and public works programs in the current fiscal year. The measure now goes to President Eisenhower.

Votes Vets Given
 The senate approved the bill on a voice vote after Senator Hickenlooper, R., Ia., had said that reductions in the AEC action would confront the nation with a "catastrophe." The house voted approval 316-82, earlier.

The compromise was for 424 million dollars less than President Eisenhower requested. This was seven millions less than the house originally had approved and 12 millions below original senate allotments. Major items included 575 millions for operating expenses of the atomic energy commission, \$7,633,000 for the Tennessee valley authority, \$401,175,000 for river and harbor and flood control construction and \$1,045,000,000 in new appropriations for the AEC.

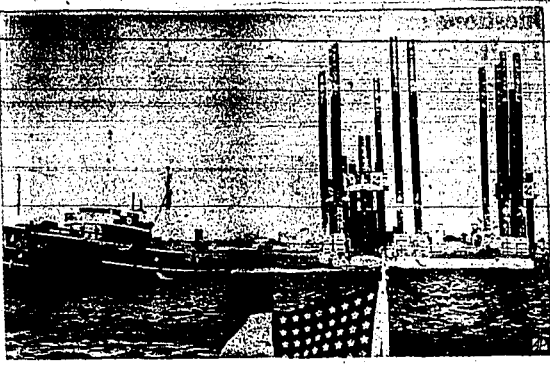
Congress voted 575 million dollars in new funds plus \$740,841,000 in obligated balances for a total national authority of \$1,315,847,000. Including use of carryover funds, the President had requested obligation authority of \$1,525,251,000 for the AEC, or almost 210 million dollars more than congress voted.

Request Noted

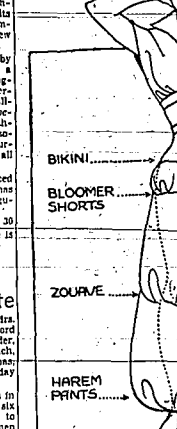
