Reds Lag in H-Bomb Making, Cannot Accept Ike's Big Plan

GENEVA, July 25 (NEA)—It will be a long time before the Russians can even consider President Eisenhower's dramatic disarmament proposal. That is the opinion of Soviet experts who attended the summit meetings in advisory capacities. It is now clear, they say, that Russia trails far behind the United States in the development of atomic energy. Delegates Nikolai Bulganin, Nikita Khrushchev and Marshal Georgi Zhukov could not agree to any proposal which would bear this weakness to the instruments of international security. The President's offer to trade military blueprints and permit mutual inspection of military establishments will likely remain the highlight of the Geneva conference of smiles and smiles. But as the conference fades into history it is likely to be listed as one more international effort to relax east-west tensions. Experts on Russia are convinced the Soviets do not have an H-bomb actually in production. They believe the reds are playing for time while Soviet scientists reorganize their hazy bomb programs to catch up with the U. S. This view was confirmed by a Moscow newsman who said that while there is good reason to doubt the Russians are producing H-bombs, they believe in Russia as to thermo-nuclear theory. The physicist cautioned: "Russia, with her own eminent nuclear physicists and those who came to Russia from Germany after the war, and with the further aid of spies like Klaus Fuchs and Bruno Pontecorvo, might one day develop an effective nuclear weapon." That Russian skill in this line cannot be discounted is indicated by some hundreds of papers submitted by Russians to the "atoms for peace" conference opening at Geneva Aug. 8 under United Nations sponsorship. If the Russians are not bluffing, they show that they are experimenting successfully with peacetime uses for atomic energy which the free world has not even suspected they were researching. Since the foregoing facts were available to Mr. Eisenhower, it is clear that he made his historic proposal out of a profound and sincere hope to prevent an eventual nuclear Armageddon.

Search Opens for Missing Airplane

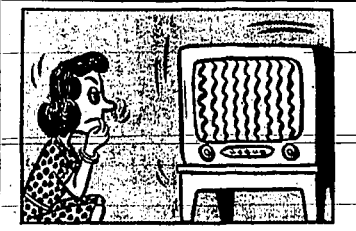

Care of Your Children

By ANGELO PATRI

No child should be left alone in the house and the reasons are obvious. Family emergencies are rare and usually there is a ready will, even happy, to take care of the child or children until the emergency over. Pulling out the telephone is a friend who knows and likes the youngsters. Finally, there is the baby sitter.

"Even for a few hours when one of the children is able to use the telephone?" Even then, in my opinion, based on long experience, an accident, an emergency, is the unexpected happening. Nobody, not even the mother, will be able to care for the child's safety is concerned, it is far better to be safe than sorry.

"But one wants children to become self-reliant?" Surely, how mature is a child before he can be trusted with the telephone? It depends on the age of the child, but on his intelligence, experience, and the weight of the responsibility to be placed upon his shoulders. Usually older children about the ages of 10 to 12, if they have been trained, can be trusted to take care of younger children. Even then, there should be a telephone list at hand for the head of the group to use in case of necessity. That means the parents are always within call.

Mothers sometimes are tempted to leave little children alone for the few minutes it would take to run to the corner for a bottle of milk or the morning rolls. That is not wise. The few minutes might lengthen into a longer space of time, and an emergency may arise during that time. Better wait for the milk and the rolls, or let somebody else take over.

New Attempts Slated to Find Biblical Relic

MEMPHIS, July 25 (AP)—John Libl, a sturdy, 32-year-old adventurer from San Francisco, is going to make a second try to find Noah's Ark.

His expedition is scheduled to start up Mt. Ararat next week. He plans to chop through ice and snow—maybe 10 feet deep—to investigate a promising 500-foot-long mound he sighted last year a thousand feet below Ararat's 16,046-foot peak.

He wasn't able to follow through last year because of illness and other complications.

Has Interests

Libl describes himself as chief elevator operator at a San Francisco hotel. He claims other interests in restaurants, cocktail lounges and candy stores.

Widowed and childless, he dreamed up the idea of the search for Noah's Ark five or six years ago. "I read lots of books, chiefly the Bible of course, and anything else I could lay my hands on," he says. "I figure the petrified remains of the ark must be up there, and I'd like to find it. It would be a great discovery for Christians all over the world."

Other postwar searches for the ark, by American and French expeditions, have been fruitless.

Location Told

Ararat, on the Turkish-Russian frontier, is in the general area north of the Tigris and Euphrates river basins, said by some to be the one-time site of the Garden of Eden.

Libl's expedition will start from a base camp at the village of Dogubazari. "A Turkish army escort will accompany him, the same as last year, and he will have about 10 hired porters. Libl brought with him from the states some climbing gear and photographic equipment.

He pays his own way and figures last year's try cost him several thousand dollars.

Grooms Son

NEW YORK, July 25 (AP)—Bing Crosby delighted today he is grooming his youngest son, Lindsay, for a place in show business.

Lindsay, 17 years old and the last of the four Crosby sons remaining at the family home in west Los Angeles, "has a better quality voice for ballad singing than any of the boys," Crosby said in an article in *Look* magazine.

The bureau said a destroyer had arrived in Havana to refuel, but there was no information about the presence of other foreign ships in Cuban waters.

The U. S. navy announced in Washington last night that it was investigating the identity of the three objects "tentatively identified as submarines" by the civil aeronautics administration in Miami.

Their suit asks that the court order the post office not to bar from the mails or otherwise interfere with letters they want to mail in envelopes which denounce a new series of "In God We Trust" stamps.

The statement on the envelope claims the issuance of such stamps is in contempt of the Constitution.

An investigation is under way, the air force said, to determine if the charges are warranted.
