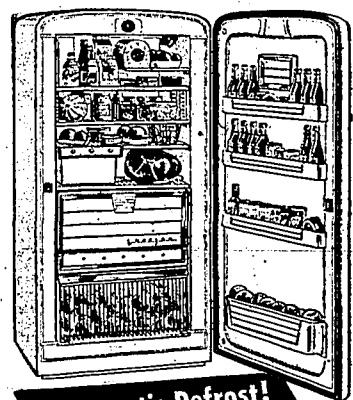

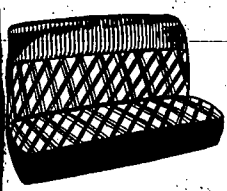

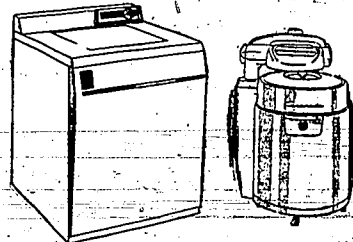

Smylie States GOP's Favor School Laws

BOISE, July 26 (AP)—Republican voted solidly in support of public schools in the last legislature while the Democrats voted against them. Gov. Robert E. Smylie said at an Ada County GOP picnic last night. The governor said the GOP record in support of public schools will be of tremendous benefit in the legislative elections upcoming in 1958. "When the bill to support increased funds for education came up for a vote the Democrats resorted to a party line vote against the measure," Smylie said. "It was the only time they did that in the entire session. Had the bill to raise the money failed of passage, the funds for education would have had to be cut by \$1,500,000."

Key Dam Will Get Closed on Missouri Plan

YANKTON, S. D., July 26 (AP)—Closing of the key dam in a project which will bring the mighty Missouri river under man's "push-button" control moved towards completion today.

The strategic dam, which will be 74 feet high and 35 feet wide at the crest by July 27, is a key element of a contemplated six-dam system which by the 1960s will harness the big river.

Closure work, begun by army engineers yesterday, is expected to be completed by July 27.

Gavins point is the smallest of the four completed dams. But its job at the downstream end of the chain of dams is the key to successful operation of the system.

Gavins point, which regulates the flow of water downstream from Ft. Randall, and on to the north, past Sioux City, Ia., Omaha, Neb., St. Joseph, Mo., and hundreds of towns in between.

It will be the last point on the river at which water to downstream will be passed to the north. It is closed in dry years and held back in years of heavy rain and snow.

Three other dams are completed and in operation: Ft. Peck in Montana, closed in 1952; Garrison in North Dakota, closed last year; and Ft. Randall, near Pickstown, S. D., closed in 1952.

When the Gabs dam near Pierre, S. D., is completed, with closure expected during 1958. And the Big Bend dam, including Gavins and Ft. Randall is in the planning stage.

Pennies Sought

HELSINKI, Germany, July 26 (AP)—The army appealed to servicemen and their families today to break open piggy banks and give back pennies.

A shortage of one-cent pieces has developed despite shipment of "several million" pennies overseas during the past year, officials said. The penny is the only coin used in American installations in West Germany.

A fellow has to think of the wear and tear on his eyes. Patterson, a famous illustrator, has illustrated the cover of the book "Beauty Contests" by H. B. Swann.

Beauty contests have become a part of the American industry. It has been estimated that there are up to 17,000 beauty contests a year and the money output, including advertising, to promote them runs into hundreds of millions of dollars.

At 60, Patterson, a cautious, white-clothed man who admits to a six-stitch head scar inflicted by one losing contestant, is the unchallenged king of beauty contest judges.

His own shy estimate is that he has had to view and judge the charms of maybe half a million lovely American girls, and he still doesn't feel tired. "You hardly can find men like that any more."

Being an artist himself — he figures he has drawn the female type on 150,000 times in his work, not counting idle doodling (the kind of pictures any man draws just for fun) — he feels he is impervious as a judge to any feminine charm pressure.

But over the years he has achieved an idea of what he thinks is an ideal girl.

"She would be about 5 feet 6, have red hair, blue eyes, a full saucy mouth, a 32-inch bust, a 24-inch waist, and a 32-inch hip."

Although this is the type of girl he draws in magazine and newspaper illustrations, he rarely has met her in real life.

U. S., Chinese Meets Hailed By Top Solon

WASHINGTON, July 26 (AP)—Sen. Walter P. George, D. Ga., said today that "most work" of diplomatic talks with Communist China may help "clear the air" to set up a two-nation foreign ministers conference in the far east.

He told reporters he believes any such conference of foreign ministers should start as bilateral discussions between the United States and Red China.

Communist China proposed in an editorial broadcast by Peking radio, that Geneva like negotiations be held on Formosa, Indochina, and Peking's admission to the U. N.

"No one can deny that the tension in Asia and the far east, particularly the Formosan situation, makes the outbreak in the way of the implementation of the Geneva agreements on Indochina, has aroused serious concern and uneasiness among the people," the editorial said.

WASHINGTON, July 26 (AP)—Sen. Herman Welker, R. Ind., said yesterday he was "shocked" to learn that Burgess General Leonard Schette complimented Cutter Laboratories' M-27 for its cooperation in the Salk polio vaccine program.

Welker said "Idaho suffered more than any state in the union, and still is suffering, as a result of Salk vaccine" from "the laboratory in Berkeley, Calif."

"If Cutter Laboratories has cooperated with the public health service and with State Health Director L. J. Peterson and our state health people in Idaho I'd like to know when and where," Welker said.

Welker said Cutter's report on the part it played in "manufacturing" M-27 for its cooperation should be made public and "should have been made available months ago."

Vaccine Withdrawn

All Cutter vaccine was withdrawn by order of the public health service about 10 days after the first mass inoculations of April.

Welker said Schette's report on the Cutter Laboratories May 27: "Please accept my sincere thanks for the wonderful cooperation which you and other members of your staff have given me, members of my staff and our advisers during these past weeks. Such cooperation is unparalleled and is ample evidence of the way the industry and your firm, in particular, works in the public interest."

Sends Doctor Welker said Cutter had "sent one doctor to Boise who spent two hours between plans allegedly cooperating in this tragedy, that has hit my state."

"The shocking disclosure of this letter to Cutter makes my blood boil," Welker said.

Commission On Annual Parley Seasons for Birds

BOISE, July 26 (AP)—The Idaho fish and game commission opens its annual meeting Tuesday and many game birds Idaho sportsmen expect to shoot this fall and how long the seasons shall last will be discussed.

The commission would recommend the same general seasons and bag limits as those set last year for duck and geese, pheasants, quail and doves.

But the department is anxious to work toward one basic statewide season for different species of birds, he said, in order to prevent over-hunting in any given area.

Last year the pheasant season lasted from Oct. 25 to Nov. 15 in southwestern Idaho. It was a week shorter in northeastern Idaho. The bag limit was three cocks per day. These are expected to remain the same.

Leonard said the spring pheasant hatch was about as good as last year, but the department has been advised that there is a diminishing habitat for the birds.

Because of improved farming methods the Box 4-2 section over the parleys—such as clumps here and there—will be included in the hunt.

If the commission makes no changes other season dates for the pheasant, the pheasant season will be in the first 15 days of September and waterfowl from Oct. 16 to Jan. 3.

The commission will look into a number of proposed federal aid projects, including the building of access roads to Sheppard's lake, a north Idaho bass fishing area purchased recently by the department.
