### Expert Reports Natural Gas Pipeline Through Valley Engineered Carefully

One of the most carefully engineered natural gas pipelines in the United States will bring natural gas to Twin Falls, according to R. C. Appling, Houston, Tex.

Appling, who is a pipeline engineer and operator with Fish Northwest Constructors, Houston, says construction of the pipeline through the Twin Falls area is scheduled to begin at a point near Burley about Oct. 1. Construction is estimated to proceed at the rate of approximately one mile a day.

Here to consult with Twin Falls area landowners on matters pertaining to the design and construction of the pipeline. Appling explains that gas will be brought from wells in the San Juan basin, New Mexico, through a 26-inch line having a designed capacity of 250 million cubic feet a day.

The 26-inch line will end near Green River, Wyo., where 100 million cubic feet of gas will be delivered to the Colorado Interstate Gas company and 90 million cubic feet will be taken into the system from fields in Colorado and Wyoming.

From Green River the gas will be carried in a 24-inch line to Unstall, Ore. Gas for the Twin Falls area will be tapped from this line.

Compressor stations will be situated along the system at locations best suited for the overall operation of the system, according to Appling. The one serving the Twin Falls area will be situated between Rupert and Twin Falls.

Fish Northwest Constructors, acting as agents for the Pacific Northwest Gas Pipeline company, Inc., designed and are in charge of constructing the entire system. In designing the system, Appling states, Fish has exceeded the code requirements.

Appling states that the pipe being used for the line has a wall thickness of 2 1/2 inches. The pipe is made of a special steel and has a minimum yield strength of 5,000 pounds per square inch.

As the rolling mill where the pipe is manufactured, Appling says each 60-foot joint must withstand a mill test of 1,000 pounds per square inch pressure for the line is 800 pounds per square inch.

The cost of laying the pipe is estimated to be about 100 million dollars. The system, when completed, will extend north of Bellingham, Wash., to the Canadian border. Laterals will take gas to Wenatchee, Yakima, Spokane and Walla Walla, Wash., and Portland, Ore. In the Twin Falls area the system will serve Twin Falls, Jerome, Gooding, Wendell and Burley.

Appling says gas lines will be covered with a minimum of 24 inches of top soil. Where the lines pass under highways and railroads or congested areas, the pipe will be laid deeper. The depth of the pipe will be determined by local regulations.

In cases where the line is applied through private property, Appling states compensation to the property owner will be made on an individual basis. For instance, he explains, if the pipeline construction will destroy a two-year alfalfa crop, the grower will be compensated for the crop's full value.

For the right to cross privately owned land, Appling says the company will pay six cents a lineal foot. The standard right-of-way is 15 feet wide.

The land owners whose property the line will cross may feel assured that they will suffer no expense due to the damage. Appling says, "The damage clause contained in the easement granting the construction of the line is intended to cover them to the extent that they will bear no expense due to damage from construction, operation or maintenance of the pipeline."

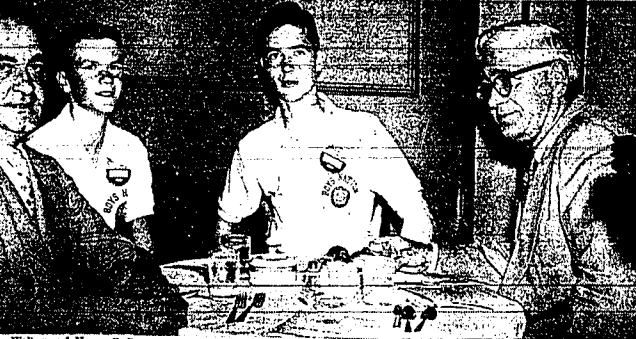

### First Test for Reds' Alleged Goodwill Due

WASHINGTON, July 27 (AP)—First test of the Geneva conference goodwill will come in five weeks when the United Nations picks up the disarmament question again. It has been in deadlock.

The big four jointly recommended that the subcommittee of the U. N. Disarmament Commission resume work in New York on Aug. 29. Beyond that is the summer test of an October meeting of the foreign ministers in Geneva. The foreign ministers will have to meet in the summer of the summit meeting before then.

But disarmament is part of the basic question of security which divides east and west and contributes so much to their mutual doubts. The instructions of the big four to their disarmament subcommittee representatives were significant.

The French, British, Russian and United States subcommittees "take account in their work of the views and proposals advanced by the heads of government at this (Geneva) conference. The language represents an effort to pass on to the subcommittee members the quality and appearance of mutual trust which has been achieved among the big four.

If the Geneva atmosphere is to dispel the foggy suspicion in which the disarmament subcommittee has so far breathed uncomfortably, the Aug. 29 and subsequent meetings should at least give a hint of better times-to-come. On the other hand, the meeting might prove the contrary.

A 10-year-old record of high hopes and disappointments is sufficient evidence that any kind of changed Russian attitude toward the basic problems of international relations in judging the real worth of the big four meeting.

### New U.S. Military Training Program Calls for Reserves After Active Duty

WASHINGTON, July 27 (AP)—The new military reserve program will have a tremendous impact on the lives of America's young men of military age. For the first time in history, they will be compelled to serve in the reserve following active duty.

Here are the major features of the bill and the various options by which youths will be able to fulfill their military obligations:

1. Compulsory reserve duty—all men entering the service after enactment of the bill will be required to serve a total of five years on active duty and in the ready reserve force. A draftee, for example, will have to participate for three years in the ready reserve after a two-year draft term. Men already in the service at the time of enactment will not be compelled to participate in the reserve. But if they volunteer for reserve duty, they will receive special "bonuses-in-time." These bonuses will reduce their term of active duty or the length of their non-participating ready reserve obligation.

2. Ready reserve duty—ready reserve participation will consist of attending 48 weekly drills plus two weeks of field training annually or 30 days of field training.

3. Compulsions—men who fail to participate in the ready reserve will be ordered up for 45 days of duty under penalty of court martial action.

4. Military obligation—the over-all military obligation of youths entering the service after enactment of the bill will be reduced to six years. This means that after completion of the five years in the active and ready reserve, men will be placed in the less vulnerable standby reserve for one year. The obligation of men already in the service will be left at eight years but they will not be required to participate in the reserve.

5. Call-up—up to one million ready reserve men can be called up to active duty by the President in an emergency, standby reservists can only be called up in a national emergency declared by congress, and then only through the selective service system.

6. Six-month training program—pre-draft age youths who volunteer will be given six months of training followed by 7 1/2 years of ready reserve participation. Failure to participate in the reserve will result in the youths being drafted for two years.

7. Up to 250,000 youths will be trained annually under this program.

8. Youths will have these various courses by which they can fulfill their military obligations:

9. Draft—drafted for two years.
