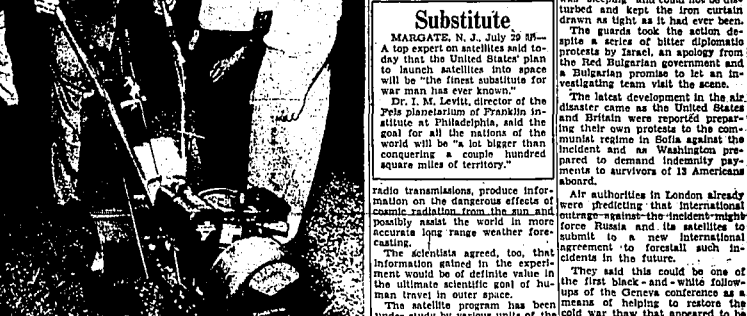

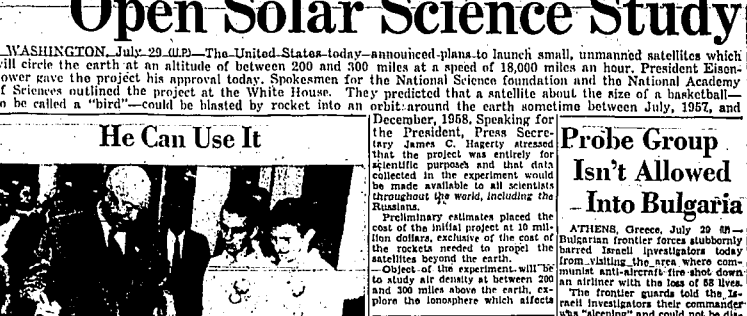

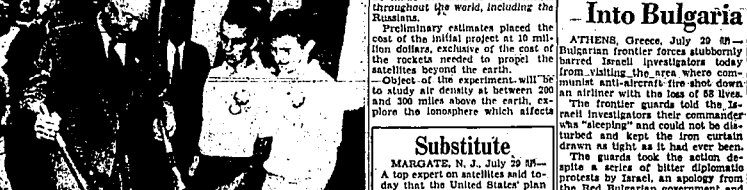

Eisenhower Emerges as Top Politician; Record Reviewed

WASHINGTON, July 29 (AP)—The time may come when President Eisenhower who went into the White House a political novice, is considered one of the best politicians of the 20th century.

That's taking in a lot of territory, and professional politicians—those who believe in fighting an attack-and-charge-issue—may hoot at the thought.

But Eisenhower already has established a remarkable political record in his first 30 months in the White House. Perhaps at this point a definition of a good politician might be in order.

It's a man who manages to stay immensely popular while getting done as much as possible of what he wants while avoiding any personal animosities which might get in the way of what he wants.

It's hard to think of anyone in or out of congress—except perhaps the late Sen. Charles McNary, R., Wis., who was publicly mad at Eisenhower. Public opinion polls show he has retained an extremely high personal popularity.

A number of reasons can be suggested for his popularity: He went into office with great prestige and great public esteem and he has done nothing by his tactics to forfeit it.

A personal attack is one of the best ways to force people to choose sides for or against you—and Eisenhower has made personal attacks no more.

He managed to get an end to the fighting in Korea, as he promised. He has steered clear of threats he couldn't fulfill. It was Secretary of State Dulles, not Eisenhower, who started the world with talk of massive retaliation.

The President has carefully followed a moderate course. As an example: If since 1953 he had been extreme in his criticism of the Russian leadership, it might have been

## Doctor Death In Argentina's Row Reported

Buenos Aires, Argentina, July 28 (AP)—A doctor died after the June 16 revolt did during a questioning in which police used violence, authorities admitted yesterday.

Dr. Juan Ingargiola died of a heart attack the announcement was made by the Argentine government minister said. Officials described the doctor as a communist leader in the province.

Opposition party leaders have charged that he was the victim of police torture.

The announcement came shortly before authorities disclosed the release of former Argentine Congressman Cipriano Reyes from jail where he has been serving a five-year sentence for plotting to kill President Juan Peron and his late wife, Eva.

Another of the alleged plotters, Navy Chaplain Victor Joriba, was also said to have been among several persons arrested on Sept. 23, 1948, on charges of planning to assassinate Peron when they left the state opera theater the next day.

Reyes was a Peron supporter and a founder of the old Argentine Labor party which helped Peron win his second term in the presidency in February, 1946.

Dr. Ingargiola disappeared after he fled for the United States in 1947.
