Rehearsal Set For 'Invasion' Of Indian Site

NEW DELHI, Aug. 1 (AP)—Indian nationalists ordered 1,000 of their followers to rehearse through police barriers into Portuguese Goa today in a dress rehearsal for a mass "invasion" of the tiny European colony.

The rehearsal was held in the attempt to "liberate" Goa by peaceful means. Similar expeditions were held in the past, but they were met with heavy fighting with the Portuguese determined to hold onto the colony they have held for more than 400 years.

Today's invasion by Indians followed a long struggle against the rule of the British and the Portuguese. The Portuguese possession by sheer force of numbers, warning Indians to stay away from the colony until the Portuguese go back to Portugal.

Goa is a small enclave about the size of Rhode Island on the coast, but west coast of India 200 miles south of Bombay. Portugal also holds two smaller areas on the same coast.

CHICAGO—Aug. 1 (AP)—The National Safety Council today said that, statistically, the nation's highways are safer than they ever have been.

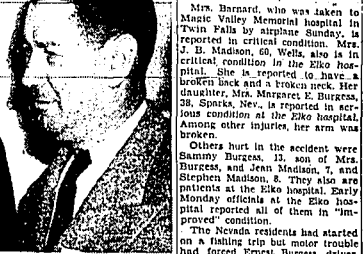
The council made the report even though figures showed a two per cent jump in highway fatalities in the first six months of 1955 over the first half of 1954.

Polio Vaccine Release Given To Physicians

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1 (AP)—Private physicians and public health agencies will start getting polio vaccine this month for inoculation of children 5 years of age.

The public health service announced yesterday it has allocated enough for 846,000 shots. That amount will become available as soon as individual state reports how much is to go to health agencies and how much to physicians.

More vaccine will be apportioned as it is manufactured and cleared for use.

The number of cubic centimeters allocated to the states includes: Idaho 1,342; Utah 2,700; Montana 4,581; Oregon 10,431; Washington 16,110; Wyoming 1,250.

The distribution is the first under the department's voluntary program for placing the vaccine where it is most needed. Except for limited supplies which moved into commercial channels last April, the vaccine is to be given to private physicians.

The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has supplied almost all the vaccine manufactured to date for use in the immunization of children 5 years of age and under. It reported Saturday its current needs have been met.

Private Uses Set for Idaho Polio Vaccine

BOISE, Aug. 1 (AP)—A big batch of Salk anti-polio serum is on its way to Idaho, but none of it will be used for mass vaccination by state health department or any other public agency.

A state health department spokesman said the public health service has set aside the anti-polio serum for the use of private physicians.

The spokesman said Idaho had received the anti-polio serum, having adopted a hands-off policy toward the serum, neither endorsing it nor serving as distributor.

There have been 120 cases of polio in Idaho this year, and the state health department says many of them apparently were caused by the April mass vaccination program, which has been suspended.

11 American Airmen Are Freed by Chinese Reds as Talks Starting at Geneva

TOKYO, Aug. 1 (AP)—Red China today announced the release of 11 U. S. airmen, held in communist jails for two and one-half years, and said they should reach freedom in Hong Kong by next Thursday. Announcement of the "immediate release" of the airmen, who had been convicted and imprisoned on espionage charges, was made by Peiping radio, barely an hour before the opening of direct Chinese-American talks in Geneva in which their fate was the top item of the conference agenda.

Chinese ambassador to Poland Wang Ping-nan, who is Peiping's representative at Geneva, said the freed airmen should reach the British crown colony at Hong Kong by Aug. 4. 11 men were the crew of a U.S. B-29 Superfort, shot down near the end of the Korean war. Red China's refusal to treat them as war prisoners and repatriate them, even before the war, had been the source of major tension between the United States and Red China.

Today's unexpected announcement by Peiping radio said the airmen were released as a result of July 31 decision "to release these 11 criminals before the completion of

Showdown Is Set for South Schools Bans

By The United Press
 With the opening of a new school term only a month away, white advocates of the south's traditional pattern of racial separation are stepping up preparations for the coming showdown on public school segregation in Mississippi and Texas as planning strategy for possible U.S. supreme court decision outlawing separation of students on the basis of race alone.
 The Alabama legislature has sent to Gov. James Folsom an act designed to circumvent the court ruling.
 In Georgia, state legal and education officials are setting up conferences with all local school boards—where segregation lawsuits are threatened.
 Meanwhile, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, also was stepping up its campaign of petitioning local school boards to take immediate steps toward integration.
 The NAACP has promised litigation if local boards have not complied with the court's desegregation order by taking initial steps toward integration by the opening of fall sessions.
 While conflict over the race issue appeared inevitable in some areas, the NAACP member states are taking heed of the court decree and charting varying courses to meet eventual integration.
 Resistance to the segregation ruling was hit a severe blow during the week when U. S. district judge, former Congressman R. Ewing Thomas, voided all laws and statutes on racial segregation in school systems.

U. S.-Chinese Meet Fared By Anti-Reds

TOKYO, Aug. 1 (AP)—Many of the United States anti-communist allies in Asia came to the reluctant conclusion today that Washington is moving closer to recognition of Communist China.
 The Chinese Nationalists and the United States, who have been urged by the United States to treat Communism, cannot understand it. It will have to negotiate with the Chinese Reds.
 The talks opening today in Geneva between U. S. and first Chinese ambassadors were seen as a strong indication of further negotiations.
 Statements given by the Chinese Nationalists and the South Koreans, both of whom have put armies in the field against Communist China, said the United States was moving step by step, toward recognition of the Peiping regime.
 An important Filipino leader raised the question in a private conversation on the matter: "Is the principle of negotiation and compromise—or co-existence by another name—more important than the principle of right and wrong?"
 One of the chief fears concerned the 10 million overseas Chinese living in Asiatic nations other than China and who might happen if the United States finally recognizes Red China.
Situation Told
 A well-informed student of Chinese affairs in Singapore described the situation as follows: "If the United States recognizes Communist China or if Communist China is admitted to the United Nations, you can be sure the Chinese will take over all the small countries which thus far have enjoyed freedom and independence."
 "The large Chinese populations in the various countries of southeast Asia will have increased prestige, and control over the lands of Chinese expansion directed from Peiping and Moscow, will be impossible."
Reasons Cited
 Just the bare fact of sitting down with the Chinese Communists at Geneva was considered a big step by anti-communists in Asia for two reasons:
 1. It tended to give the Peiping government status and importance equal to that of Soviet Russia, with whom the big three recently conferred.
 2. It revived memories of the Indochina conference in Geneva which was a major defeat for the free world.

Coffee Prices Drop Is Seen By Importers

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1 (AP)—Coffee prices are coming down.
 Cost of America's favorite breakfast brew already has dropped considerably from the dizzy peak it reached last year. And agriculture department figures point to still further declines in the future.
 The department estimates that world production of green coffee for the 1953-54 marketing year will total 45 million bags (each bag contains 60 pounds) "This is 11 per cent more than 1951-52 production."
 The increased supply will come from millions of young coffee trees which are coming into production in Asia and Africa during an earlier crop boom, in 1949-50. It takes five years for coffee trees to start bearing, and these trees are now ready to produce.
 "A new wave of housewife has proved, to the surprise of some experts, that her resistance to toothpaste is even stronger than the national coffee-drinking habit."
 Last year, when import prices averaged 65 cents a pound, and retail prices of green coffee has fallen below 55 cents, while best grades of coffee—in the can—at retail stores now sell for about 45 cents.
 How far the price decline will go, agriculture experts are unwilling to predict right now. But their reports indicate that the long-range trend will be toward steadily lower prices. Behind the new trees due to start producing this year are many more which were set out during last year's price boom. They'll be ready about 1959.
