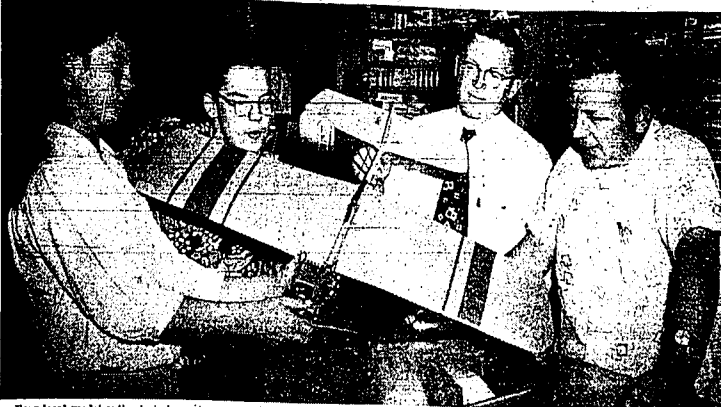

### Groups Draw Battle Line on Rivers Issues

VANCOUVER, B. C. Aug. 3 (AP)—A battle for control of British Columbia's river system is shaping up between power and fish authorities.

"There's going to be a fight about this and it might as well start now," said Sen. Tom Reid, chairman of the International Pacific Salmon Fisheries commission, in an interview here.

The senator said this province's 50-million-dollar-a-year salmon fishing industry is in danger of being "wiped out" if hydroelectric authorities have their way.

It was reported Saturday the federal department of northern affairs, and natural resources has commissioned B. C. Engineering company Ltd. to survey four possible sites for power dams on the Fraser river and six on the Thompson river.

"If the B. C. Electric company which owns B. C. Engineering company is determined to erect three dams on the Fraser, I'm not going to see the salmon wiped out," the senator said.

**Ex-Premier of Nippon Writes Of MacArthur**

**TOKYO, Aug. 3 (U.P.)**—Former Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida says Gen. Douglas MacArthur was right in wanting to attack Manchuria in the Korean war and that this would not have provoked World War II.

"The general was dismissed because of his strong insistence on attacking across the Yalu river into Manchuria," Yoshida writes in his memoirs now running in Asahi Shimbun, Japan's largest newspaper.

"The idea conflicted with that of President Truman—but I do believe that MacArthur had real insight."

Actually, MacArthur did not propose a U. S. march into Manchuria. He wanted to bomb West Chinese air bases there, and proposed that Nationalist Chinese troops be used for a discretionary attack on the red mainland.

The 76-year-old prime minister who was friendly to the United States was driven from office by a Conservative revolt last December. He still is a political power as an elder statesman of his liberal party.

Yoshida's memoirs indicate a deep respect for MacArthur and show an abiding gratitude for the general's generous policy toward Japan.

**TEHRAN, Iran, Aug. 3 (U.P.)**—Government workers Tuesday were ordered to quit opium smoking while at work.

Official sources would not comment on the number of addicts who quit while at work, but one put it at "not more than several thousand."

Iran, which is campaigning against opium smoking, annually produces 150 tons of opium, of which 250 tons is exported.

**Statistics Shown On Price Index**

**BOISE, Aug. 3 (U.P.)**—The U. S. department of agriculture said today the index of prices received by Idaho farmers on July 15 was 235 per cent of the 1910-14 average.

This compares with an index of 239 a month earlier and 248 a year ago.

Sharp drops in potato and hay prices were the greatest factor, the USDA said.

In another report, the USDA said milk cows on Idaho farms were estimated at 230,000 in June, or 4,000 less than the number in June, 1951. The estimates are based primarily on records of farmers who voluntarily report the number of cows in milking herds.

**Bad Bins for Grain Probed By Committee**  
 WASHINGTON, Aug. 3 (AP)—Sen. Henry M. Jackson, D. Wash., sus- tained yesterday that it was gov- ernment knobheads who paid for grain bins full of knobholes.

Jackson said he used to work in a lumber mill, and knew it didn't take an engineer to spot a knobhole. "I wouldn't blame it all on knob- holes," he said. "There were some knobholes in it, too."  
 Accepted the Bin  
 Bearft said he accepted the bin, knobholes and all, because the gov- ernment last year was taking in millions of bushels of Kansas grain under the price support program and he had to put it in the bins or on the ground.  
 "Wasn't the government paying for grade 1 lumber and getting grade 2 or 4?" asked investigator Laverne Duffy.  
 "It looks that way," said Bearft. "Weren't knobholes popping out all over the place?" asked Duffy.  
 "Yes."  
 Looks at Others  
 Then the subcommittee turned its attention to some 8,500 steel bins sold to the government by the Kansas City, Mo., firm of Black, Sivalls and Bryson.  
 Bearft said most of those he saw in Kansas were so poorly made that they were "bulging and squeaking." The agriculture department had to put its grain somewhere else and repair them, he testified. This cost the government money—how much, he didn't know.  
 There are 8,100 BS and B bins in Kansas, Bearft said, and he thinks essentially every one of them will squeak or bulge.

### 200 Teachers Are Eyed for Idaho Schools

McCALL, Aug. 3 (UP)—Staff members of the state department of education reported yesterday that Idaho schools next fall will have more teachers than ever before, and that many of them will need to brush up on their reading instruction.

Rosa Barney, assistant superintendent of public instruction, held the summer meeting of the board of education that some 200 teachers will be added to the public school rolls in September, bringing the total to about 8,500.

Mrs. Gertrude Eastman, elementary school supervisor, said that school administrators should be more concerned with uniform methods of teaching students how to read.

All Idaho teachers should learn the modern concepts of reading instruction, she said, and in that way the entire curriculum could be bolstered since reading is the core of the school program.

She said there is a good deal of "mashed effect" at present as each student learning to read by one method in one grade and by a completely different method in the next grade.

Mrs. Eastman said she also hopes to see an improvement in teacher efforts with public relations, and down the number of times she has been interrupted by phone calls, fund raising drives and the like.

### Three Democrats Emerge as Dominant Figures in Congress

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3 (UP)—Every session of congress produces at least one dominant figure, dominant in the sense of being effective or being in the spotlight. This year's session produced three dominant men who were outstandingly effective.

All three were Democrats: 77-year-old Ben. Walter George of Georgia, 73-year-old Sam Rayburn of Texas, speaker of the house, and Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas, 47-year-old Democratic majority leader of the senate.

Democrat George was Republican President Eisenhower's chief reliance in congress on foreign affairs. George is chairman of the senate's foreign and anti-atomic energy committee.

Johnson and Rayburn, as bosses of their respective houses, ran congress. They got the public attention that George but were highly effective in a far wider field than George's specialty.

They, more than anyone else in congress, steered through to passage the year's bundle of legislation of all kinds with a minimum of fuss and feathers. This was one of the least talkative sessions of congress.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3 (UP)—Congress passed and sent to President Eisenhower yesterday a bill authorizing the government to pay for free polio shots for an estimated one-third of the nation's eligible children and expectant mothers.

The house and senate quickly approved a senate-house conference committee's adjusted version of separate house and senate bills. The final bill allows the government to make 30 million dollars

worth of Salk anti-polio vaccine available to the states between Feb. 15. This was a compromise between a house bill providing an estimated 45 million dollars and an "open-end" senate measure limited only by the amount congress was willing to appropriate.

### Efficiency of Salk Vaccine Revealed By Evidences of 1954's Field Trials

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3 (UP)—According to the 1954 field trials, the Salk polio vaccine is about as effective as that for whooping cough, a public health service doctor said today. It isn't quite as effective against measles and diphtheria toxoid.

But Dr. Joseph Bell, who made comparisons, hastened to add that "this is the first polio vaccine and we can expect that its improved efficiency will eventually be developed."

Bell is chief epidemiologist of the national institutes of health. He made the comparisons on the basis of the report from last summer's field trials saying the Salk vaccine was 80 to 90 per cent effective in preventing paralytic polio.

He said it is still too early to draw any conclusions about the efficacy of the vaccine on the basis of the use during the present summer.

Furthermore, he said, it is not yet known how long whatever degree of protection is afforded by the polio vaccine will last beyond the first year.

Concerning other inoculations commonly given children, Dr. Bell said:

1. Smallpox vaccine: "I don't know of any case where, after a successful attack of smallpox vaccine, the vaccinated person has come down with the disease within the first year after vaccination."

2. Diphtheria toxoid: In general, he said, this material appears to afford protection to "well over 80 per cent of children, at least for the first year following inoculation. Recommended schedule for diphtheria inoculations, he said, is: A course of three shots with a month interval between doses starting at two to six months; another shot at 18 to 24 months; and still another at 4 or 5 years of age just before the child starts school. This is because the immunity "waxes."

3. Whooping cough vaccine: The evidence is, he said, that this vaccine comes about 70 per cent of those inoculated with it, at least for the first year.

4. Measles vaccine: "The shots are given at the same intervals as those for diphtheria."

He told of one study of his own over a period of five years among 600 vaccinated children. Only 11 per

cent of them got whooping cough, while 41 per cent of a comparable number of non-vaccinated children got it. This adds up, he said, to an indication of 75 per cent protective effectiveness for the vaccine.

Dr. Bell said he knew of no instance where smallpox or whooping cough vaccines, or diphtheria toxoid caused any one of those diseases in inoculated persons.

Surgeon General Leonard Scheele

of the U. S. public health service has said there was "strong presumptive evidence that there was a cause and effect relationship" between 50 cases of paralytic polio which followed inoculation with the Salk vaccine made by the Cutter Laboratories, Berkeley, Calif., and the use of two lots of that company's product released prior to April 27. A large number of other children were vaccinated during the period prior to that time without developing polio.

An investigation of what is now referred to as the Cutter incident has been under way since April 27. A full report has been promised.

The public health service has reported a total of 132 paralytic cases and 87 non-paralytic cases among vaccinated children from mid-April through July 26.

Dr. Carl C. Dauer, who compiles statistics on various diseases for the public health service, said exact comparisons of the polio vaccine with the early results of other vaccines could not be made for several reasons:

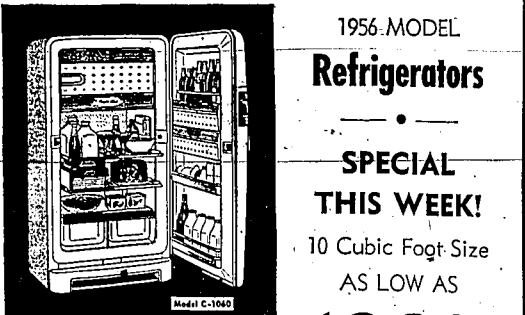

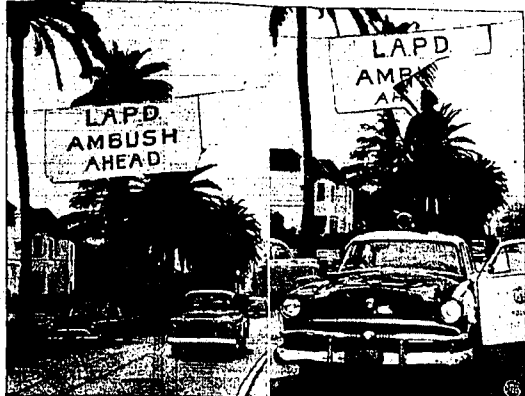

### Heredity Gets Blame for Gall Bladder Stone

NEW YORK, Aug. 3 (AP)—Medical science has its first clear proof that people can blame their ancestors for stones in their gall bladders.

Who or what to blame for those stones has been an unanswered question. Science used to think people who got stones weren't living right, but that plainly wasn't so.

Even the best livers got stones that could stones — or, rather, a tendency to form stones in the gall bladder — be inherited? It didn't seem likely, yet it was possible.

And so the question rested scientifically until Dr. John H. Kennard, senior staff surgeon of the Elliot hospital in Manchester, N. H., came upon identical twins 77 years old.

Keeping in mind that identical twins are nature's own laboratory for demonstrating what is and can be inherited and what can't be inherited, they originate from only one fertilized egg, and their genetic inheritances are identical, which can't be said of any other two persons.

Twin girl "A" required Dr. Kennard's surgical attention for gall bladder stones which she had become a mother for the first time.

Also Gets Symptoms  
Twin girl "B" had her first baby three months after her sister had hers. Both girls had gall bladder stones. "B" had the very distressing gall stones symptoms and Dr. Kennard operated on her, too.

The doctor was impressed, of course. The question of the inheritance of the tendency to form gall stones has been kicked around now for a long time. So he inquired into the twins' ancestry.

He didn't have to look far. Their mother had lost her gall bladder to surgery five years ago. She had had a demonstration which Kennard presented in the New England Journal of Medicine.

### Cobbler Ponders Decision in Show

NEW YORK, Aug. 3 (AP)—Gino Prato, winner of \$32,000 — on a television quiz show, decided himself to begin a week-long ordeal of deciding whether to risk doubling his fortune or losing it in a last-chance gamble.

The 55-year-old cobbler hammered his way through a four-part quiz in his category, opera, in his fourth appearance last night on CBS-TV's "64,000 question."

Next Tuesday night the Tallentire Prato will make his climactic appearance before the TV cameras and announce his decision.

If he decides to continue and answers the questions, he will take home \$64,000. If he loses, he will win a Cadillac worth at least \$1,000 as a consolation prize. If he feels he should not go on, he will be permitted to keep his \$32,000.

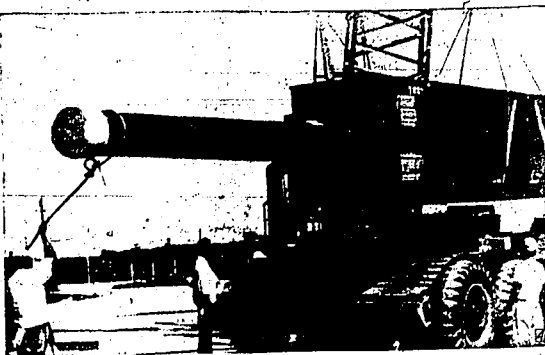

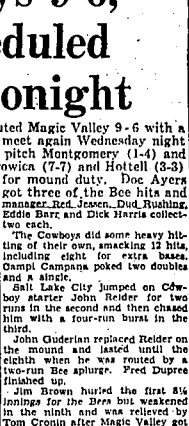
