County officials to permit known reckless drivers to continue to drive has prompted some states to issue driving licenses only on the state level," Hartzler stated. "The time not to react local political pressure and licensing will have to be handled by the federal government."
 "As it is," Hartzler continued, "the requirements for driving in some states are so low that issuing a license is only a formality. He does not consider it unreasonable that the federal government should demand some kind of certificate from a driver using interstate highways.
 Local political pressure on police officials indicates the same kind of short-sightedness that prompts parents to try to get a teacher fired for flogging their child," Hartzler said. "Today school principals are compelled to tell their teachers that it is preferable to have students than to educate them. It is not surprising that the students graduate with little consideration for others.
 "Driving is primarily a matter of courtesy and good sportsmanship," Hartzler declared. "In those schools where we have introduced driving instruction, we maintain a recreation school for traffic violators. If a high school student, for instance, is arrested for a traffic violation his license is suspended until he has completed an attitude course conducted by police officials. When his driving attitude has been changed his license is returned."

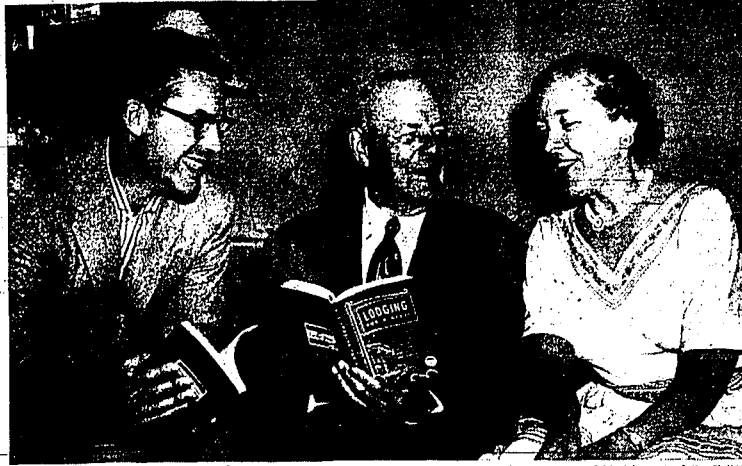

Food Expert Visits T. F.

"By the time I fix my coffee and orange juice I have made so much noise Mrs. Hines is awake. When she comes out for breakfast I have my second breakfast," Hines explained.

The second breakfast is another cup of black coffee and a bowl of corn flakes or similar cereal with a dash of ice cream.

"I get a bit of ice cream on my spoon and roll it around in the corn flakes. It's a wonderful breakfast. No meat or anything like that for me at this time," Hines declared.

For lunch he usually has a green salad—he described it as "rabbit food"—and another dish of ice cream.

Dinner is much the same as that served in the majority of American homes, with of course a dash of ice cream. The fifth and final meal is supper, this varies with the exception of ice cream some where in the course.

Turkey is one of Hines favorite dishes. "I like it because turkey calls for stuffing and stuffing calls for turkey and so on," he explained with a sly glance at Mrs. Hines. He says while eating is fun he is convinced that no one should over do it. He says he prefers simple, well prepared dishes.

"The secret of good food is in the preparation. In Europe more time is spent in the preparation of dishes than in the actual cooking," Hines claims. Mr. and Mrs. Hines spent three months in Europe in 1954 looking for his beloved "wayside inns" and visiting fine restaurants and hotels.

He said the dish he ate the most in Europe was an egg omelette. "They, as a rule, were beautiful creations, thick and fluffy and plain for their customers."

Those dishes, he said, are simple wonderful dishes, and the chefs in some of the larger hotels and restaurants consider them too simple and plain for their customers.

Hines believes that a lot of American divorces are caused because the housewife doesn't spend enough time in the planning and preparation of the family meals.

He said some wives take something out of the ice box, after she has dashed in from her bridge club only minutes ahead of her husband.

Famed Epicure Eats Five Times Daily To Prove "Eating Is Fun, Important"

"Eating is fun and important" at which to eat and spend the night," Hines said.

Hines, the author of four books, is a spry 70 who enjoys telling of his experiences at inns and restaurants along the highways and towns he has visited. He is accompanied on his trips by his wife.

"We just have fun. We travel a lot and we enjoy making friends wherever we stop," Hines said.

His trips, which started in 1935 as a recreational impulse to do something different, has resulted in his four books, "Adventures in Good Eating," "Lodging for a Night," "Adventures in Good Cooking" and "Vacation Guide."

Mrs. Hines says "Adventures in Good Cooking" is her favorite of the four books. Menus in the book are so arranged that movie cooks can prepare delicious dishes by following a set of rules and putting each ingredient in at the proper time, Hines says.

One of Hines favorite foods is ice cream. It comprises a part of most of his meals. In explaining his five meals a day he said he had his first breakfast which consists of a slight venture in "Good Cooking" and "Vacation Guide."

and puts it on the table. Then, Hines said, she sets a bottle of catsup on the table and expects husband to make a meal.

He was critical of some American eating habits. "A lot of Americans don't know how to appreciate their food. Food must have eye appeal, must smell good and of course taste good to be truly appreciated," Hines said.

He said he is fond of Idaho potatoes, and has them sent from a Chicago market to his home at Bowling Green, Ky.

"Idaho potatoes are tops. I wanted to eat the skin on the one I had tonight," Hines declared.

While eating and the preparation of food is a subject Hines likes to discuss, he also enjoys talking about the thousand motels, hotels and inns he has stayed in during his travels.

On the next printing of "Vacation Guide" he plans to devote more space to the resorts and recreational areas in Idaho.

After spending the week-end in Salt Lake City Mr. and Mrs. Hines will travel to other western cities before returning to Kentucky. During the winter he plans to go to the east coast and in 1955 to tour the western states.

He described western cooking and hospitality as good. While he didn't say so he indicated that westerners took more time for good eating and the hospitality was the finest.
