# Hurricane Diane

## Prints Fury for Eastern Regions

15 (UP) — Hurricane Diane, the second in a series of storms to hit the East Coast in less than a week, aimed its 115-m.p.h. winds at the Carolinas today. Coastal states are preparing for a hurricane warning, and Diane, picking up speed as it rumbled southward, is expected to make landfall in the Atlantic seaboard, posing a definite threat to the Carolinas and Virginia.

Forecasters are predicting that Diane will mopping up after Hurricane Connie, the first of the year, and the "weather bureau, in an advisory, also extended the alert to the Georgia coast.

Connie's multiple winds lost some strength when the hurricane hooked almost off the coast for several days. Diane, however, will be accompanied by a storm surge which is expected to continue on its present course for the next 12 to 18 hours with possible "a slightly higher" forward speed.

The numerous winds took their toll from the Bermuda coast Saturday when they struck the island. In the British Isles, 20-year-old French bride, Bernadette resident of the French Riviera, was killed by a high wind gust blowing over her head in the English Channel.

In quick succession, the guards secured one cell block after another. During the confusion, three rioters were shot into one cell. These three, not shot as hostages, were released when rioting stopped.

# Markets and Finance

## Livestock Grain

**CHICAGO, Aug. 15 (AP)—**—Wheat futures advanced on a report that the western bloc must maintain its military power at a high level if the United States, Britain and France are to conduct further effective peace talks with the Russians.

Officials reported today that after the summit conference at Geneva last month there have been several exchanges of views in the North Atlantic Treaty Council in Paris. The 15 member governments are agreed, they said, that there is no evidence yet on the part of the communists that would justify any changes in the scheduled western defense buildup.

The Soviet government announced Friday night that it had decided to reduce Russian border forces by 500,000 men by Dec. 15.

The United States, Britain and France are expected to confer early this week on the Soviet move. Over the weekend they welcomed it as a step in the direction of reducing armaments but they were frankly suspicious of whether the Soviets would make the full cut and just cut Russian inventories.

The Big Four seem certain to go into the foreign ministers' conference in Moscow on Oct. 27 in as strong a position as they held during the top level talks last month.

But diplomatic experts are becoming increasingly uncertain how long this will be true. They expect Russia to make a big play in coming months for public opinion pressure to force cuts in western arms expenditures and troop levels.

Their criteria cost them little and their promises cannot be checked.

The 15 member governments are agreed, they said, that there is no evidence yet on the part of the communists that would justify any changes in the scheduled western defense buildup.

The Soviet government announced Friday night that it had decided to reduce Russian border forces by 500,000 men by Dec. 15.

The United States, Britain and France are expected to confer early this week on the Soviet move. Over the weekend they welcomed it as a step in the direction of reducing armaments but they were frankly suspicious of whether the Soviets would make the full cut and just cut Russian inventories.

The Big Four seem certain to go into the foreign ministers' conference in Moscow on Oct. 27 in as strong a position as they held during the top level talks last month.

But diplomatic experts are becoming increasingly uncertain how long this will be true. They expect Russia to make a big play in coming months for public opinion pressure to force cuts in western arms expenditures and troop levels.

Their criteria cost them little and their promises cannot be checked.

### Sum Is Voted To Aid States Obtain Serum

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—The government Saturday launched a program to distribute 20 million dollars to the states for their Salk polio vaccine program.

The funds will be delivered between now and next Feb. 15 under a bill signed into law by President Eisenhower.

The measure authorizes federal grants to the states of enough funds to provide free vaccine for one-third of their still unvaccinated children and expectant women.

Sum is slated.

This will cost about 60 million dollars. But congress, when it came to putting up the actual cash, voted only 20 million dollars as the government's share.

Each state's share of the 20 million dollars allotment was determined by a formula based on the number of still unvaccinated persons in the state, the cost of the vaccine, and the state's per capita income.

The law is an emergency measure designed to make sure that, while congress is not in session, no child in a state is deprived of the polio shots because he or she cannot afford to pay for them.

Federal action

Both the house and the senate have promised to see what more should be done when they reconvene in January.

Federal grants will be under the supervision of the department of health, education and welfare.

Of the 20 million dollars, 25 million dollars is available for the purchase of vaccine, and five million dollars may be used for the costs of planning and conducting polio immunization programs or for the purchase of vaccine. The funds are to be used by Feb. 15, 1956.

Separate act

The polio vaccine assistance act is separate from the voluntary plan for distributing vaccine during the period of short supply.

Under the voluntary allocation plan, the public health service allocates the supply and the states have the responsibility for distribution through both commercial and public agency channels.

### Red Korea Asks Unification Talk

Communist China's second most powerful leader, Chu Teh, said the North Korean proposals "and give them our wholehearted support."

### German Car Firm Obtains U.S. Plant

WOLFSBURG, Germany, Aug. 15.—West Germany's Volkswagen works has bought a Buickmaker plant in New Jersey to assemble its rear-engined "people's car" for the growing U.S. market, a company spokesman has said.

The spokesman said the plant was bought by Buickmaker at New Brunswick but never put into operation. Volkswagen already has assembly plants in Brazil, Belgium, Ireland and South Africa.

The spokesman said 25,000 Americans are driving Volkswagens and the company currently exports 2,500 of the four-passenger sedans to the United States monthly.

### Satellite Shot Expected for Florida Area

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—Rocket expert Willie Ley predicts the United States will launch its proposed earth satellite from Florida because it would be too dangerous to launch it from other sites in this country.

Ley said he thought the satellite would be set aloft from the Banana River proving ground in Florida, using military rockets already available.

The German-born rocket expert who came to this country in 1928, said he assumed the satellite will be set aloft with rockets already available because of the 100 million dollar cost (10 million dollars) of the project.

Final Result Told

Ley said the chief result of the satellite's voyage in space will be space travel by man. But he added this will come "a number of years" after the satellite is launched.

Ley said this country could have shot a small, unmanned satellite of the type proposed by the government into the earth's orbit six or more years ago had money been available.

The government announced recently it expects to rocket a basketball-sized object into space in 1957 or 1958, where it will circle the earth.
