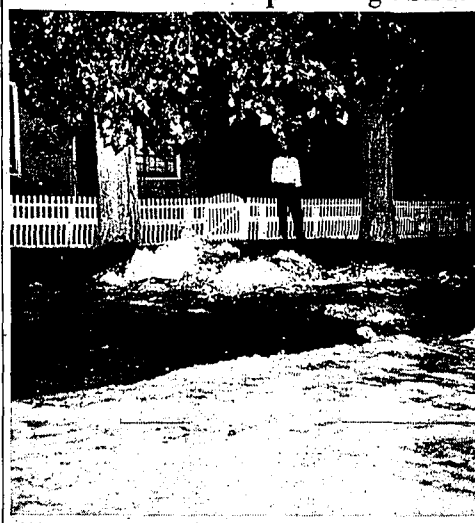

DENVER, Aug. 16—President Eisenhower cleared the decks today for a midday start on the "real trout" for a five-day work-and-play vacation—a five-day trout fishing sojourn at Fraser, Colo., in the Rockies.

But the chief executive, not too satisfied with a reported 89 on his first round of vacation golf yesterday, planned another session on the Cherry Hills Country club links before leaving by automobile for the mountain ranch of Axel Nielsen, Denver banker.

Mr. Eisenhower scheduled a brief early morning session at his desk in the summer White House headquarters at Lowry air force base before turning to golf.

He was expected to leave shortly after noon MST for the two-hour, 70-mile climbing drive to Fraser, just across the continental divide.

The President's grandson, 7-year-old David, will join him at Fraser tomorrow and is headed for immediate instruction from grandfather on how to lure the wary trout of the Colorado Rockies.

The five-day stay at Fraser meant a spell of relative isolation for the President amid the towering blue peaks of the Rockies, warm days and near-freezing nights, and the silencing swift waters of his favorite fishing stream, St. Louis creek. The accompanying White House staff was cut to a bare minimum. The whole emphasis was on taking it easy.

Arctic Troops Build Stations In Great Plan

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16 (AP)—The army announced today that 3,000 troops are pushing toward the Arctic frontier with enough building material to construct more than 50 radar stations and other sites on the continent's air raid warning net.
 The announcement, giving the first indication of the number of locations planned for the distant early warning (Dew) line, said the specially trained troops will unload more than 200,000 tons of construction material and supplies along the largely unexplored high Arctic coast line.
 The Dew line is a joint U. S.-Canadian venture, being financed by this country, designed to provide four to six hour warning of approaching enemy bomber attacks along the polar approaches to North America.
 Seven radar stations already are operating in the American segment of the line along the north coast of Alaska. Others are functioning in Greenland at the opposite end of the net which is approximately 3,000 miles long. Work now is beginning

Russia Claims Rockets Fired High Into Sky

MOSCOW, Aug. 16 (AP)—Russia says she has fired experimental rockets with live animals aboard more than 200 miles into space and plans to follow up soon with artificial earth satellites.
 Space scientist A. G. Karpenko told the local newspaper "Moscow Pravda" the satellites would be launched in the "comparatively near future." They will circle the earth from pole to pole at heights of from 125 to 1,250 miles, he said.
 American researchers have announced experiments in which mice and monkeys were shot into space in rockets, but they have not claimed the rockets went as high as 300 miles. The U. S. altitude record was set in 1949 when the VAC-32 combination soared 250 miles.
 The United States announced last month that it plans to launch high-orbit satellites between July, 1951, and December, 1952, to speed around the earth at altitudes of 200 to 300 miles.
