Gas Mixture Said to Help Brain Work

PEARL HARBOR, Aug. 18 (UP)—Retiring Rear Adm. Charles B. Momsen says the human brain is given a shot of helium and oxygen function faster, better and more efficiently.

Momsen, who invented the Momsen lung, hopes to put his theory into practice when he retires from the navy about Sept. 1. Momsen heads joint atomic task force 2 with advance headquarters at Pearl Harbor. His lifetime work with navy divers and submariners produced the submariner's escape device which bears his name. His latest theory was born of these labors.

"Deep sea divers work longer hours and produce better work while breathing a mixture of helium and oxygen," said a reporter in a recent interview.

"Why not doctors, office workers, government officials or students?" "This helium-oxygen mixture could be piped into hospital operating rooms, schools, office, workshops—anywhere acute mental processes would be advantageous," he said. "Some day you may be sitting in a cool, comfortable office, breathing clean, invigorating gas mixtures and enjoying life in a new way. Or working 12 hours a day without fatigue, or doing six hours' work in four."

He said he wants to work on this theory when he enters civilian life but so far has made no commitments on research or financing. "Any improvement in a brain in 100 per cent a year should be worthwhile," he said. The Momsen lung revolutionized submarine escape devices. It purifies stale air and permits a man escaping from a sunken sub to breathe the same air over and over again until he reaches the surface.

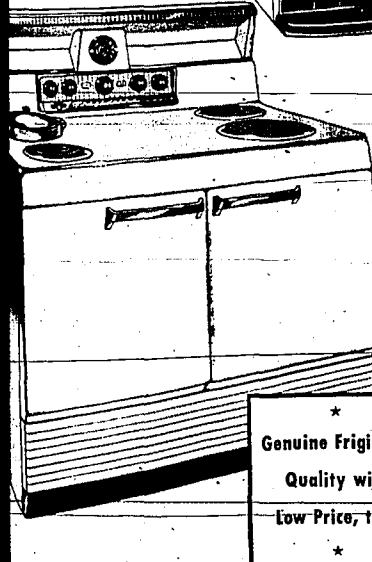

Defense Told on Cheese Payments

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—The agriculture department today defended its payment of two million dollars to cheese dealers last year—payments which U.S. Comptroller General Joseph B. Campbell said were improper. Campbell said he did not question the sincerity of agriculture department officials "or infer any intentional wrongdoing." But he ruled the payments were unauthorized and said they should be recovered. The challenged transaction occurred in the spring of 1954 when the government support price on cheese dropped from 37 to 34 cents a pound under dairy price production orders by Agriculture Secretary Ezra T. Benson. Department of agriculture officials said they feared dealers would dump cheese on the market before the price drop took effect. So the officials said, they bought 86,000,000 pounds in April at 37 cents a pound and resold it to the farmer owners the following month at 34 cents.

Shutterbugs, Newest Craze, Is Especially Evident Now

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—This is the season of the amateur photographer. Innocent bystanders should take to the hills. The shutterbug we have with us always. He goes forth laden with expensive camera. He comes home with the rent money spent on film, filters, exposure meters, tripods. In between, he takes some pictures. You want to see them? Don't worry. You will. He will with us the year 'round. But come this time of year, he is every-where. Just try escaping him. Go to Europe. What do you find? Amateur photographers outnumbering the pigeons at Venice's St. Mark's

Square. Shutterbugs shoulder to shoulder blocking your view at the Folies Bergere.
This is by no means an American peculiarity. It used to be said every German child is born with a camera in his hand. Today it appears every Japanese child is born with a camera in the middle of his forehead.
Why this worldwide preoccupation with taking of pictures of things? One theory is that people expect the world may be blown up any minute now and so they want to keep a record of it. The flaw here is that the pictures would be taken up too long with cameras and photographers. Don't expect shutterbugs to make sense.
A more immediate danger than

the hydrogen bomb is the shutterbug himself.
Picture him—without a camera, please—as he wheels down the highway, photographic gear beside him, wife and kids in the back seat. A plaintive cry arises: "Daddy! Pull-over, I mean it this time. I don't want to sleep at a restaurant."
He doesn't even growl, as kinder daddy would. "Shaddup!"
His eyes are both glazed and roaming. He is looking for pictures. He is looking for that magic combination of color, composition, human interest—
Eccentricities:
His brakes squeal and his wife squeals. Behind him, other drivers brake and comment on his forebears. The shutterbug does not hear. Out the door, across the highway, fingers fumbling at camera controls...
"What a vacation!" his shaken wife moans.

4 Lawmakers Desire Action On Road Plan

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (U.P.)—Senator Neuberger, D. Ore., criticized the nation's governors for taking what he called an ambiguous, "mamby-pamby" stand on highways at their Chicago conference last week.

Representative Clark, D. Pa., joined in, saying the annual highway conference "passed the buck" in a resolution that ducked the question of financing road construction.

Clark and Senator Kuchel, R. Calif., both said they are working on new highway bills in hopes of getting something through a congress which failed to act on the issue in the session recently closed. An Senator Bennett, R. Utah, said he expects President Eisenhower to come up with a "real" highway program for the next session.

None of the four lawmakers, who gave their views in separate interviews, suggested a special session to act on highway legislation—something which the President has said is a possibility in his next message. All but Bennett are members of senate or house public works committees, which handle highway legislation.

Bennett said he has had no direct word from the White House that Eisenhower will propose a revised highway program. But he said that he expects him to come through with a specific, new proposal, perhaps a combination bond and tax plan.

The administration plan in the last session was for a road interstate road system, to be built over a 10-year period out of proceeds of special bond issues. The Democratic-controlled congress returned to session.

At Chicago, the governors endorsed the "objectives" of the Eisenhower program but not the financing part. They called for a "greatly expanded" federal-state interstate highway system and said "far more" of the billion dollars a year in federal gasoline and other taxes on road users should be devoted to highways. At present, some \$15 million a year goes to roads.

Nehru Eyeing West Appeals On Territory

NEW DELHI, India, Aug. 18 (AP)—Prime Minister Nehru may appeal to the western powers to try to persuade Portugal to give up its territories in India, authoritative diplomatic sources said yesterday.

That he will make some new dramatic move in the next few days is regarded as a certainty with Monday's "non-violent march" into Goa and other Portuguese settlements putting him in a tight political spot.

A dispatch from DeLima, less than 50 miles from Goa's northeast frontier, said 500 determined Indians nationalists, mostly Socialists who had missed Monday's "peaceful invasion," were marching toward the Portuguese colony's border. BOISE, Aug. 18 (AP)—Three Idaho mining executives agreed yesterday to see if some other means to approach the President for the relief of the western mining industry.

Back in 1855, Epidemic Top Item in Paper

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—The papers 100 years ago about this time were not concerned with the death of congress. There was a yellow fever epidemic in nearby Virginia. Many had died.

According to accounts, 7,000 persons already had fled the Norfolk and Portsmouth areas and all of the stores in Portsmouth, at least, were boarded up. One of the publications spoke editorially of the "wonderful job done" by the sisters of charity, who "nursed the sick and comforted the afflicted."

The only mention of the president, Franklin Pierce, was to the effect that he had made few appointments. They had to do with small jobs in Illinois, New Hampshire and a couple of other states. No names were mentioned, neither were the nature of the jobs.

An interesting item came up in the most prominent paper of the day in Washington—the Intelli-gencer. It concerned one John A. Washington. He advertised for a housekeeper. He said: "I wish to purchase for my own use a Negro man, not exceeding 30 years of age, with his own family, a dres... the Negroes to be of sound health and alive for life."

The article was about a hot weather and the cold to come.

Visiting Americans View Virgin Farm Lands of Siberia and Ride on Camels

RUBTSOVSK, Russia, Aug. 18 (AP)—A visit to Siberia gave the touring American farmers their first camel ride and one of them a broken rib last night.

"The American farmers were impressed by the work being done in the previously unexplored Siberian area. By pioneering wheat and corn crops here the Soviets hope to keep pace with the food demands of the present 215 million population which is being increased by three million yearly.

"Some of the Americans thought the virgin lands might become Russia's breadbasket. Others, however, predicted it would be a dust bowl. Some of their comments were: 'Fertis Queen—This could be the future breadbasket for Russia and Asia.'"

AUSTIN, Tex., Aug. 18 (AP)—Twelve Thunderbolt jet planes completed a breakfast-to-lunch non-stop flight from England yesterday, landing at Bergstrom air force base.

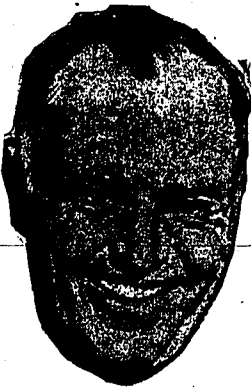
