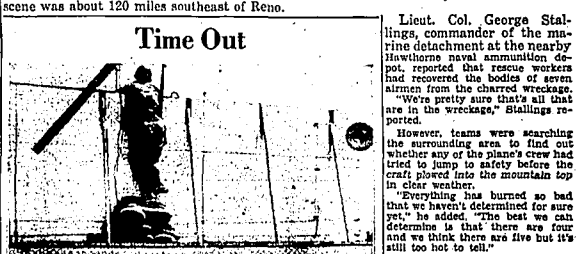

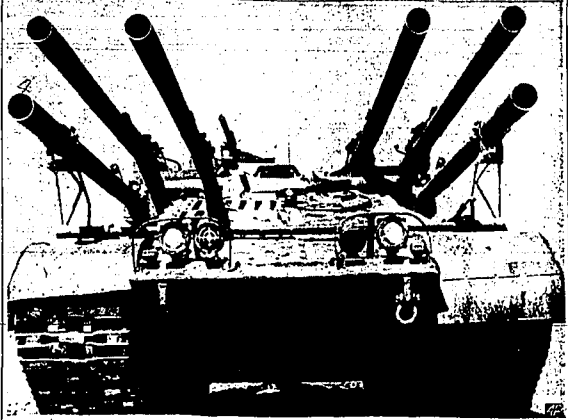

Army Accepts Men to Serve 6-Month Tour

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—The army announced today it will accept immediate enlistment from young men who want to serve six months on active duty and then spend 7 1/2 years in the reserves. Officials said that the enlistees probably will be called for actual training Oct. 1. The six-month tour is a key part of the nation's new reserve program. The announcement disclosed that the army plans to train or start training 90,000 young men under 18 1/2 years old by next June 30. After that, the enlistees will be obligated to serve 7 1/2 years in ready reserves until they complete two-hour drills and 15 days annual camp training.

The army also announced these two other steps to begin what chief of staff Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor called a "speediest possible buildup" of reserves. Enlistees not yet ordered to duty under the draft may enlist directly in the army reserve for six years. They will serve two years of that time on active duty, participate in ready reserves with drills and camp training for three years and serve for one year in the standby reserve where no training is required.

Until July 1, 1957, certain men in the reserve will be called to active duty for 45 days. The army said that six months enlistees, who will be paid \$50 per month, may be deferred from their active duty training until they complete high school or reach age 20, whichever is earlier.

The lower house already had approved the postponement. 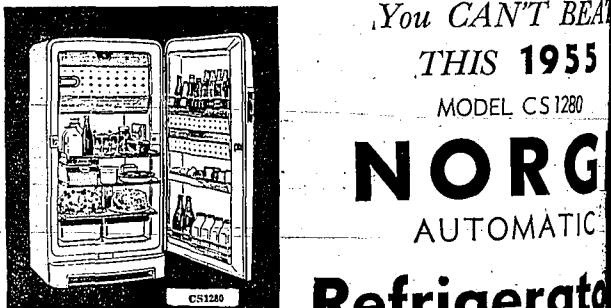

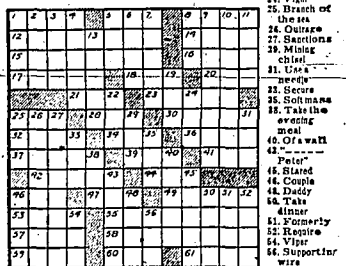

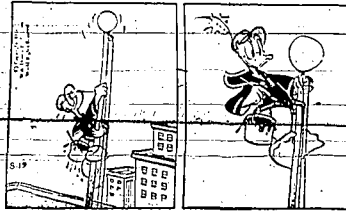
