# 8 Flood Devastated Regions of Northeast Now Threatened by Disease as Death Total Mounts

NEW YORK, Aug. 22 (AP)—Disease threatened flood-devastated northeastern towns today. Mud, debris and shattered transportation, communication and utility lines were immediate problems in hundreds of communities digging out under a bright August sun. Dead still lay beneath the receding waters, and it was feared the death toll may reach 300. The toll stood at 211 in eight states at mid-morning—110 in Pennsylvania's northeastern corner of industrial towns and vacation camps; 68 in the factory-stilled river valleys of Connecticut; 19 in Massachusetts; six in New Jersey; four in New York; two in Virginia, one each in Delaware and Rhode Island. Health authorities faced with a massive sanitation problem sped disinfectants to towns now suffering. They had run with rivers throughout the streets. Water purification pills were dropped from airplanes to still-landed towns. Typhoid inoculations were ordered for all survivors.

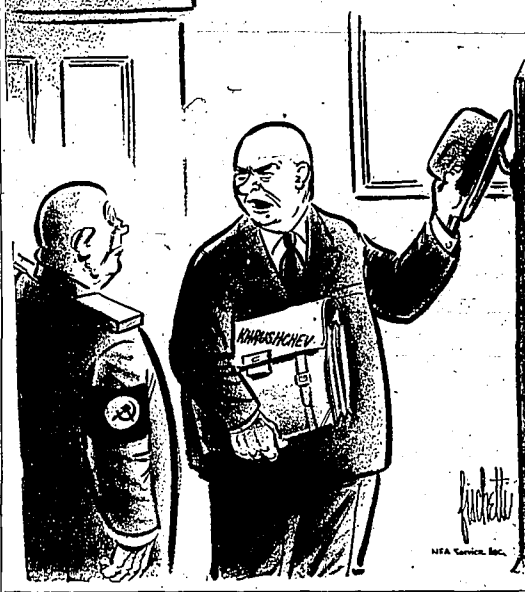

Plans Are Designed to Test True Intention of Russians

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP)—The United States and its major European allies are working out plans for a series of proposals designed to test real Soviet intentions toward permanent East-West settlement and to expose any phony Russian peace propaganda.

These plans, which are still being developed here and in London, Paris and Bonn, will be put into operation in a series of important international conferences during the next several months.

These include the United Nations subcommittee on disarmament meeting in New York Aug. 20; West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's scheduled visit to Moscow Sept. 9; and the four-power foreign ministers meeting to open in Geneva Oct. 27.

When these sessions are concluded, American officials hope to have a much better idea than they do now of the true aims of Russian present policy and the extent of change in Moscow's attitude toward the outside world.

Eyewitness Accounts Given Of Flood Damage to Towns

Two eyewitness accounts of the flood damage in their cities are given by Thomas Whinnel Clifton and Lee Douglas, a radio commentator, in a special feature.

Whinnel's is a complete ruin. The entire main street—about a third of a mile long—is one solid block of water. This giant spill is more than 10 feet deep and extends beyond the sidewalks or what are left of them on both sides.

There isn't a building on main street that wasn't badly damaged. Many were destroyed. It looks as if someone fought a war here.

Clifton had a trouble with his feet and more than six feet high just west of his house. He was unable to get out of his house for several days. He said he never knew when they were so very hot.

There were several tragic scenes. I went with an army captain in a jeep to a house where a young girl had been killed. She had been killed by a car that had been driven into the house.

Right now, no one is going hungry. The army has set up emergency food headquarters and is bringing in food by helicopter.

Aiding Enemy Charge Faces Army Veteran

FT. MEADE, Md., Aug. 22 (AP)—Major Ronald E. Alley, a 34-year army veteran, went on trial today on charges of aiding the communists in "promoting disloyalty" among fellow POWs while a prisoner in Korea during World War II.

As the court martial got underway, defense attorney Ford E. Young, Jr., demanded dismissal of the charges as "ridiculous."

The charges are "ridiculous," said Young. If they must be heard, the Constitution requires that they be heard in a civilian tribunal.

Alley, a 34-year-old career officer, is accused of committing 10 specific acts of disloyalty during nearly two years as a Korean war prisoner.

He is the fourth American officer to be charged in an espionage case during the Korean war. Two others were acquitted and one was discharged from the service by military court.

The most recent case was Sgt. James C. Galt, who was sentenced to life imprisonment in New York Friday for the murder of two fellow prisoners in other circumstances.

Alley is charged with giving the enemy information about the fire control system of an artillery, using fellow POWs to give the communists military information, and helping "promote disloyalty" among his military comrades.

Alley is a native of Waterville, Me. He graduated from Waterville High School in 1936 and lived at Bar Harbor, Me., and his wife, Erna, at Schenectady, N. Y. He is a high school graduate.

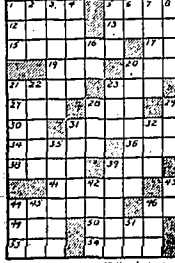

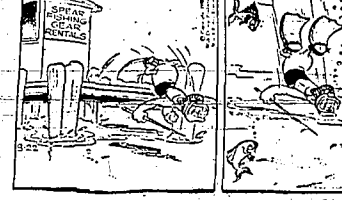

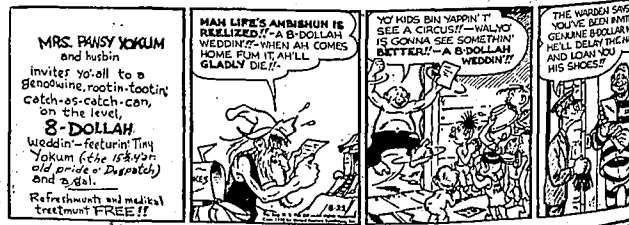

### Captive Issue On Agenda of Brief Meeting

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP)—President Eisenhower and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles are expected to tackle the problem of American prisoners in Red China when they meet here tomorrow to review the world situation.

Mr. Eisenhower is interrupting his Colorado vacation to make a speech in Philadelphia Wednesday. He will confer with Dulles during a brief stopover here.

American officials are hoping that the decision to free three U.S. prisoners will inspire Red China to do the same in the case of the 41 American civilians held there.

But they are not optimistic about any quick action. The negotiations with the Chinese Reds in Geneva are still very much deadlocked over communist demands for control over Chinese students in this country.

Some U.S. diplomats have been discussing the idea of calling a meeting in the Geneva talks to prod the Chinese into some action. This may be one of the issues taken up by Mr. Eisenhower and Dulles.

The state department announced Saturday Russia has agreed to release three Americans long held behind the iron curtain. They are army aviator Wilfred J. Kumia, Amesbury, Mass., and Murray Fields, N. Y., and Frederick C. Smith, a pilot.

But they are not optimistic about any quick action. The negotiations with the Chinese Reds in Geneva are still very much deadlocked over communist demands for control over Chinese students in this country.

The Russians said the men would be freed shortly but did not specify when. They presumably will be set free in Berlin.

Officials here expect Ambassador U. Alexis Johnson will try to talk to the Chinese to get the Reds to lead when the Geneva talks resume tomorrow. But Red China doesn't seem to be in a receptive mood at the moment.

### Study Is Ready On Testimony Of U. S.'s Reds

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP)—The fund for the republic announced today it has given \$25,000 to the school of law, Stanford University, to study and analyze the testimony of leading witnesses on communism.

The study as the California university will be part of the fund's continuing examination of civil liberties in the United States.

Robert M. Hutchins, fund president, announced the gift in a report on the activities of communism, recently financed organization. It received 15 million dollars in December, 1942, from the Ford foundation to study civil liberties.

Hutchins reported that "the atmosphere" for civil liberties is somewhat improved over five years ago. But he said violation of civil liberties "are still such as to give cause for alarm."

Hutchins, former president of the University of Chicago, criticized the extension of government loyalty-security tests to include "guilt by association."

"The evidence offered to show that a man is a danger to American institutions has often been farcically remote," he said.

Hutchins said the Stanford study will collect the testimony of the "most important" witnesses on communism "and make an objective analysis and critical summary of them."

He said the accepted view of communism's activity in this country rests largely on evidence given by a small number of witnesses. This testimony, he said, has never received "sustained and rigorous analysis."

The Stanford study will be under the director of Herbert Packard, a member of the New York and old preme court bars. He will work here.
