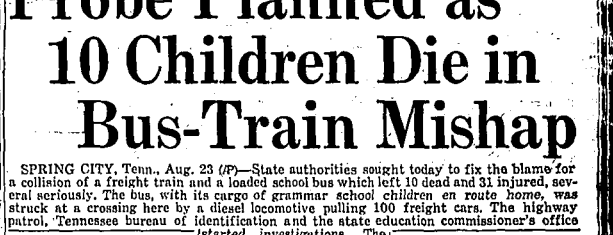

Plan to Benefit Small Nations

Canada Plans For "Saucer" Used by U. S.

TORONTO, Aug. 23 (AP)—The U. S. air force has taken over research and development of a super-secret "flying saucer" fighter plane designed in Canada but abandoned by the Canadian government, the Globe and Mail reported today.

The newspaper said in a copyrighted report by aviation writer James Horowitz that a contract was signed several months ago "making the project the exclusive property of the U. S. air force."

The "saucer" began as a private Avro Canada Ltd. project. It captured the imagination of Canadian government officials and the government spent about \$100,000 to aid in its development.

Defense production minister C. D. Howe said last year, however, he doubted that the craft would be able to operate vertically without runways. He said the chances were five to one against it proving successful.

The Globe and Mail said that despite Howe's pessimism, the project proved extremely interesting to American defense planners. It said that officials of the U. S. air research and development command showed interest in the project from its inception and made several visits to the plant.

According to the newspaper, U. S. military security now shields the three-year-old project so tightly that Canadian military and government representatives and even top officials of the Avro plant had been refused access to it without special permission.

After "whooping" Slater the rustler will be driven off by the dogs who will then receive their master by means of artificial respiration.

Parks noted that East End day will be Sept. 2, with West End day on Sept. 3.

The rodeo will be at 8 p.m. each day of the fair. Mad Lambert, Salem, Ore., will be master of ceremonies. Midway attractions will be supplied by the Grand brothers' circus.
