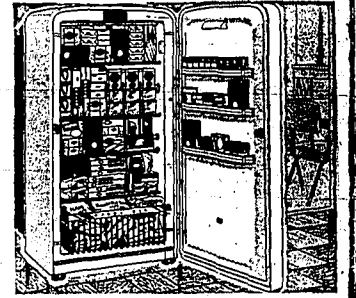

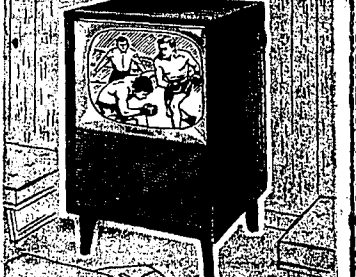

Votes of Negro Not Sought in Hot Balloting

JACKSON, Miss., Aug. 24 (AP)—Crawford Attorney-General J. C. Coleman swept to victory today in a Democratic runoff primary for governor in which party officials systematically discouraged Negro votes.

Coleman, pleading strict enforcement of Mississippi's segregation and anti-liquor laws, soundly defeated young attorney Paul B. Johnson, Jr., after a campaign of bitter name calling.

Johnson, making his third try for the job, conceded defeat just before midnight when Coleman's lead, already announced early returns, mounted toward the 60,000 vote mark.

Returns from 1,743 of the state's 1,828 precincts gave Coleman 217,694 votes to Johnson's 166,363. Both the racial issue, on which their stands were identical, and party officials sought to ignore the Negro voters by turning them away from the polls, or earmarking the few ballots cast for challenge.

Chairman Tom J. Tubb of the state Democratic executive committee announced in advance that the "order went out" to county committees to challenge the Negroes, standing as actual party members. Few tried to vote.

The New York headquarters of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People said it would seek "prompt and immediate action by the justice department."

But in numbers of counties across the state not a Negro showed up to vote, and the few ballots cast would have little effect on the outcome. Coleman's victory is tantamount to election. The forthcoming general election will be a formality.

War Abolishment Noted by Bishop

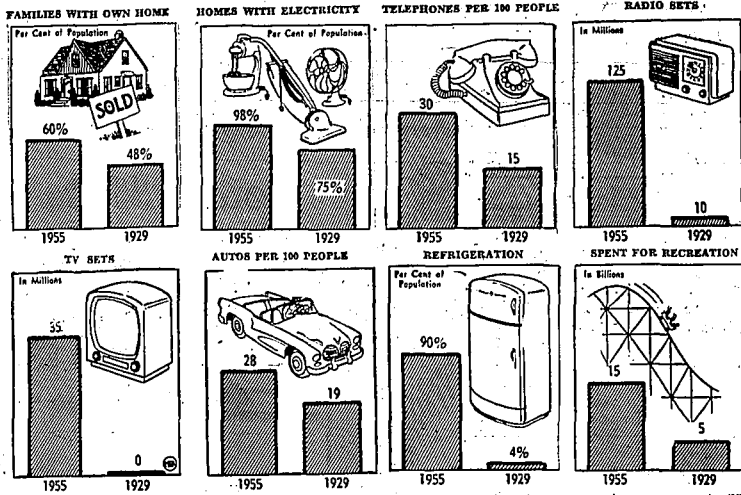
LAVAYETTE, Ind., Aug. 24 (AP)—Methodist Bishop G. Brewster Coleman predicted today civilization will abolish war in this 20th century and not be "cramped in the fire of a hydrogen blast."

"Call me naive, unrealistic, imprudent," he told the five-day national convocation of Methodist youth, "but I dare to affirm the belief this will be called the century in which man abolished war, established economic justice and realized racial brotherhood."

"Anyone who declares war inevitable is repudiating Christian faith," he said.

Tornado-Torn Town Works To Rebuild; Receives Offers

UDALL, Kans., Aug. 24 (AP)—A new Udall is rising from the rubble left by the terrible tornado three months ago.

Volunteer labor—in the spirit of the early settlers who helped their neighbors when there was trouble—has helped make the rebuilding possible.

The money has come mostly from insurance, the federal government and the Red Cross.

Workers from Wichita, 20 miles north of Udall, donated their time to pour concrete for a new city hall. Contractors charged nothing for the material. This brick building will give Udall space for a fire station, the public library and offices for the mayor and city clerk.

The sign of the new city hall going up has helped keep up the spirits of Udall residents.

It took only one minute, on the night of May 25, for a twister to reduce this town to debris, eighty persons were killed, one-sixth of the population. Scores were injured.

E. B. Harvey, the town blacksmith who also ran an automobile agency, lost his wife in the tornado and spent six weeks in a hospital recuperating from injuries.

Harvey's home and some of his new cars were partly covered by insurance. With the insurance money and a government loan, he has started to rebuild.

"What's done is done, and there's nothing I can do about it, so I just go about my business and try to be happy in my work," said Harvey. "There are lots of people worse off than I am."

Most of Udall's citizens will be in debt for several years to the government and to banks and private loan companies. Officials estimate the indebtedness will amount to

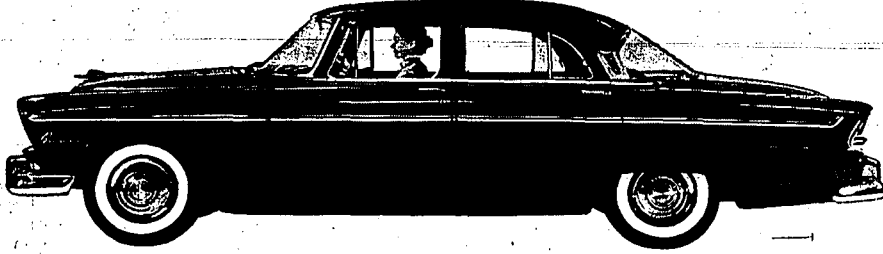

Train Devised In Bid to Cut Railroad Cost
 LAGRANDE, Ill., Aug. 24 (AP)—General Motors' answer to the soaring cost of operating passenger trains is its experimental "Aerotrains."
 Seating 400 persons in 10 40-foot coaches, the low-slung modernized train presents several railroad firms, GM executive N. C. Deszendorf said, in its christening.
 Powered by a 12-cylinder, 1,200-horsepower engine, the "Aerotrains" low center of gravity, 48 inches above the rails—and its lightweight construction make it capable of a top speed of 102 miles an hour.
 Each coach rests on four wheels instead of the usual eight and nylon-reinforced bellows are used instead of steel springs to smooth out the ride.
 A luggage compartment, similar to a bus, opens from outside the coach. Each coach is equipped with airplane-type pantries for preparing and serving light meals.
 The doors between the cars open by a touch of the rubber insulation and stay open as long as the doorway is in use.
 The locomotives cost \$200,000 and the passenger cars can be built for \$1,000 a seat, Deszendorf said, as compared to the \$2,500 a seat for conventional passenger cars.
 The "Aerotrains" was built, Deszendorf said, at the request of several railroad presidents who are concerned with the annual loss in passenger service—estimated at more than 700 million dollars.

U. S. Official To Take Trip To Far Sites

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24 (AP)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon, the administration's unofficial goodwill ambassador, will travel to the Near East and Africa in November to strengthen U. S. relations with the key area on Russia's southern flank.

The White House, in announcing the mission yesterday, said Nixon is making the trip at the request of President Eisenhower and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles. The 42-year-old Californian previously has made highly successful goodwill missions to the Far East and Caribbean areas.

Nixon will be accompanied by his wife and representatives of the state department.

The state department will work out details of the trip with countries involved. It said Nixon's itinerary has not been fixed but that the timetable will depend upon how much time the vice president can devote to the trip and the political situation in the area. Nixon may spend up to a month on the journey.

It was believed certain that he will visit both Egypt and Israel. Nixon probably will touch on problems of the nations he visits.

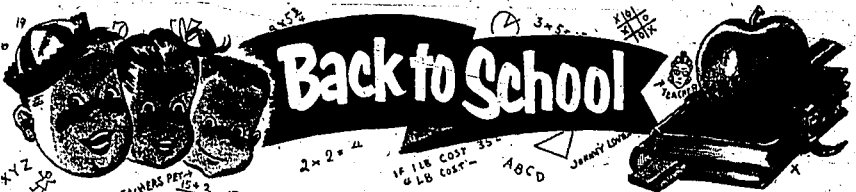

They can't get enough of wild rumor, idle gossip, and pure fabrication. The "palace pieces" job is seldom handed to top reporters. It usually goes to one of those semiregular, on-the-fringe-of-Maifair gentlemen peculiar to British city rooms. I have never seen their counterpart on papers anywhere else in the world. They look like run-down dukes, only they aren't, and they have a wild imagination with a vocabulary to match. With Princess Margaret 25, and now able to marry without her sister's consent, the "palace pieces" boys will have a field day. They'll rehash every love affair they've dreamed up for her, enumerate every heart throb she has ever put on high heels, and speculate all over the place.

Over a pint of biters, or a scotch and splash, they would decide what was doing with nobility that day. If you could drop in the Palace right now you would be almost sure to find two or more of them sighting over the 2,000 or 3,000 words they had to do on Margaret and Townsend and all the rest of her supposed antics. A few plain and simple, in other words, you'd see them leave for their typewriters, all set to interpret the latest goings-on in the palace. Margaret could give the most accurate prediction of the probable attitude of the queen, and provide a thoughtful paragraph or two on the attitude of the men in the street. 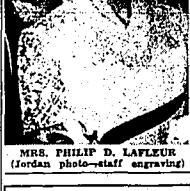

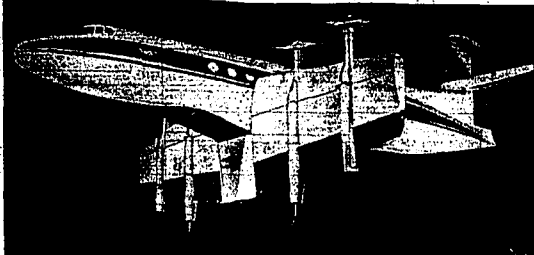
