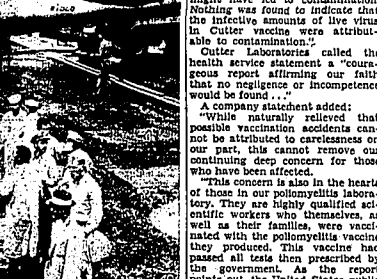

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (AP)—The government today blamed the Cutter polio vaccine incident on "fundamental weaknesses" in its own now-discarded safety testing procedures. It said new standards provide "adequate safeguards" against infective amounts of live virus, again being injected in healthy children.

The public health service report on a four-month investigation said some lots of Cutter vaccine contained live virus and caused polio but that scientists were unable to determine the exact reasons why the live virus was present.

PUZZLE OF SOVIETS

Translation copies of the Soviet scientists' papers delivered at the U. N. conference on peaceful uses of atomic energy, just ended in Geneva, are being scrutinized by Washington atomic experts.

The Russians seem to be putting more emphasis on developing atomic energy than in the U. S. which is regarded in the U. S. as a secondary and as yet untapped source of power.

Russian emphasis on thorium may be due to the fact that USSR is short of uranium, or that it has larger supplies of thorium. It may also explain why the Russians have been working the Indians politically. For India has some of the world's richest thorium deposits.

The Russians released more data than all the other countries on plutonium 241. This is of great interest as an atomic fuel for use in long-run power reactors.

The Russians reported a great deal on the use of isotopes. This was possibly to impress others with the peaceful nature of their research.

### Russ Farmers Need More Incentives, Touring Americans Say Upon Return

NEW YORK, Aug. 25 (AP)—The Soviet farmer must be given more individual incentive before Russian agricultural production can be increased, a group of American farm experts agreed today. The Americans arrived home by plane after a six week tour in Russia. They said also that Russian farming is far behind that in this country. Leader of the touring group was Dean W. V. Lambert of the college of agriculture at the University of Nebraska. He led reporters: "We had a wonderful trip and had a good opportunity to look at important Russian agricultural areas... I think one of the major impressions we got was the large use of manpower on their farms. They use a great number of people to do what we do through mechanization." The dean added that "we think we made some friends and we think we drew some wedges in the barriers that have been between the two countries for the past 15 years."

**Economic Picture of Regions Affected by Capricious Nature**

NEW YORK, Aug. 25 (U.P.)—Floods have been doing more damage to the economy in more than one section of the nation. At the same time it is doing out property to others. To the human misery and great property damage in Dixie's wheat belt, it has added disruption of much industry and a strain on the building materials companies already plagued by shortages. In parts of the Middle West, hot and humid weather favored the corn crop for awhile. But now searing and dry weather is reported, biasing the hopes of many farmers who had looked for a bumper crop. In the Eastern states hurricanes and floods ruined part of the tobacco and corn crops. The heavy rains, however, revived many seceded pastures, bringing cheer to dairymen. West of the Mississippi some areas have another story. There drought is killing pastures and some of the cattle are being slaughtered for market. Butter production, partly because of the ticks' production, has been running never per cent lower this August than last. Durable wheat farmers on the other

hand, have had a good year, nature having dealt lightly with them in the matter of disease. This wheat is highly favored by the makers of macaroni. Dixie's furious torrents dealt heavy blows to some Eastern railroads, which won't be able to move much revenue freight for some time. Not only are their roadbeds gone, but also the output of many of their customers. The storm's destruction of factories, highways, utilities, stores, homes and schools will bring a heavy call for building material. The great building boom already was straining the capacity of some of the building material producers. Spot shortages in cement, gypsum and lumber have been reported, as well as in some copper and other metal products. Copper and brass fabricators in Connecticut are badly hit by the floods. They had been suffering from metal shortages. Now many of their mills are out of operation, probably for some time. New England's textile industry, previously combating the move of the mills to the South, now is hard hit by flood and fire damage. The garment industry elsewhere may be

**Standard IQ Test Criticized By Psychologist as Measure**

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 25 (U.P.)—If you're an adult who didn't do so well on your last IQ test, cheer up. Maybe you were sold short. The standard IQ test comes a long way from being a good yardstick of adult intelligence, says Dr. J. P. Guilford, a psychology professor who has invented many new ways of measuring intelligence, judgment, reasoning power and other elements of mentality. Only a few of the 200 items in the Stanford-Binet test, long used by psychologists, deal with these intricate but extremely important mental factors, he asserts. Dr. Guilford, who is on the faculty of the University of Southern California, was the only American psychologist invited to present a paper at a recent conference in Paris on factor analysis. He told about some of his new tests there. The Stanford-Binet test was designed for children. It was supposed to give investigators an idea of how a given youngster would get along in elementary school. In that respect it was, and still is, a good test. It was applied later to adults mainly because it was the best available instrument for assessing

human intelligence. In its original form it was given to several hundred thousand soldiers of World War I. Later the army's alpha and beta tests for mentality were based on service personnel. Using the same kind of tests for verbal comprehension and reasoning on adults as on children has not only short-changed some of the subjects but also has limited scientific knowledge of what human intelligence really is, Dr. Guilford says. A high IQ doesn't necessarily mean a person is or will be a great creative thinker. Sometimes it has been a parallel to indifferent careers in later life. At least one experimenter has shown that people with slightly substandard IQ ratings, get along pretty well in life and rate highly as automobile drivers. There are at least 40 and perhaps as many as 60 factors concerned with intellect, Dr. Guilford reports, and the standard IQ test does not begin to disclose them. The new tests by Guilford and his associates are designed to show up exactly the powers of deduction or logical evaluation, the ability to discover and become aware of important things, and the faculty for

**Policeman Finds He Is Not Liked**

WYOMING, N. J., Aug. 25 (U.P.)—Policeman Thomas A. Coston has found that all the world does not love a policeman. He set up shop on Mountain avenue with an electronic control speed apparatus. Within minutes he nabbed two motorists for exceeding the speed limit. Thereafter, for two hours, every car traveled at a snail's pace, an hour. Finally a grinning motorist brought a schoolboy-printed sign which had been placed out of Coston's sight. It read: "Slow. Cop." Coston picked up and left for drawing conclusions and issuing problems. Another elusive thing which Coston has undertaken to measure is one's powers to follow divergent lines of thinking—that is, being able to see both sides of the matter without losing the faculty for critical judgment. Speed of judgment is another. These things test a person's flexibility and originality. Gigantic Show Readied; Two More Are Eyed

NEW YORK, Aug. 25 (AP) — Saul Pollack, the P. T. Barnum of the industrial world, is putting on just about the greatest show on earth—a cast of 5,000... a 14-acre stage... helicopter taxi service for visitors... a production that will cost over 20 million dollars. Chances are you'll never get to see this extravaganza. It will run for only two weeks. The people who want to see it made their reservations months ago. Pollack, an impresario of industrial exhibitions for 25 years, is staging the country's first machine tool show since 1947 in Chicago next month. At the same time, he is putting on what is probably the world's first automation show. "It adds up to the biggest thing we've ever done—that anyone has done," said Pollack. "We expect an attendance of 100,000, and we'll have about 420 companies exhibiting at the two shows." From an office suite in midtown Manhattan Pollack and the staff of Glaspoll Pollack have been working for two and a half years on plans for the industrial double-headers that will play Chicago Sept. 5-6. At the same time they're deep in preparations for two other productions—the annual plant maintenance and engineering show in Philadelphia next January and the national packing exposition at Atlantic City, N. J., next April. While the average citizen probably would rather stay home and watch television than visit a Pollack exhibition, the shows are high points of the year for thousands of manufacturers and businessmen. The exhibits inspire millions of dollars worth of equipment sales.

U.S. Nation's Largest Tribe of Indians Is Seeking Self Rule

WINDSOR ROCK, Ark., Aug. 25 (AP)—Independence for America's largest Indian tribe in 10 years? That is the hope of one vigorous young man who fills a key role in tribal affairs. "In 10 years I would like to see the Navaho take over, with every one of the agency jobs filled by Navahos," says Mr. Minner McCabe, secretary-treasurer of the tribe. A many-sided program, or series of programs, aimed at ultimately turning the tribesmen loose to shape their own destiny is gaining momentum. Among major phases are: By the government—Schooning children and moving tribesmen who wish to live in cities. By the tribe—Encouraging industries to move to the reservation and financial aid to Navahos for college educations. The once warlike Navahos, 27 years after signing a peace treaty with the United States, still have a long way to go before they will be running their own affairs. This year there are about 40 tribal employees, compared with 3,000 Indian bureau employees. Supt. O. Warren Spaulding of the Supri. O. Warren Spaulding of the Indian bureau's Navaho agency says he has seen "a growing ability" on the part of the Indians to handle their own affairs. "As fast as we reasonably can, we transfer authority to the tribe," he says. McCabe, rated "highly proficient" by Spaulding, is optimistic. "I would say this will be one of
