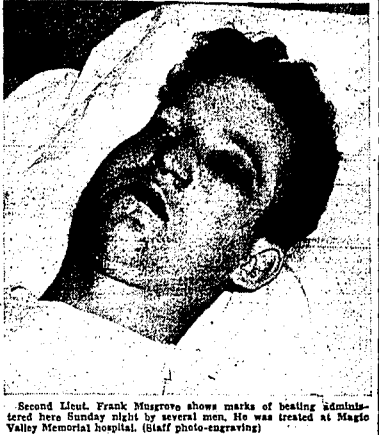

Refinery Fire Roars Into Third Day; Officials Aver Holocaust Under Control

(By Staff Writer) A multi-million dollar oil refinery fire roared into its third day today, keeping 1,500 persons from their homes in a devastated two-square-mile area. Officials said the flames at its giant refinery finally were under control, although three fuel oil tanks containing 750,000 gallons of fuel still were burning. One thousand company employees worked through the night fighting the fire.

The fire, which broke out at 6:15 a. m. Sunday, has burned for 100 miles, covering an area of 1,500 acres. It has destroyed 100 homes and 100 buildings. The fire is the largest in the world. Cabinet Favors Faure's Plan to Stop Rebellions

PARIS, Aug. 29 (AP)—The French cabinet today approved the proposals of Premier Edgar Faure for ending the bloody Moroccan uprising. The decision to support Faure was taken in a stormy, 13-hour cabinet session which at times threatened to topple his government.

East and West Meet Again on Junking Arms

NEW YORK, Aug. 29 (AP)—The disarmament conference opening at the United Nations today brings East and West together after a hiatus of nine years with new ideas for laying down their arms.

The Big Four powers—United States, Russia, Britain and France—each are equipped with disarmament plans. An hour ago the Russian plan was read in the assembly.

It is hoped that out of four possible programs will emerge for the disarmament of the world's arms on both sides of the iron curtain.

And at the same time reduce the chance that civilization will destroy itself in a nuclear war.

The experts are only a fair chance that the disarmament conference will be successful, despite the international fair weather created at the summit conference in Geneva.

There is still a wide gap between Russia's determination to outlaw nuclear weapons and the United States' belief that the A-bomb and H-bomb are its chief protection against the new maneuver of the communist world.

Yet both sides have reached from the conference to the right for nine years.

The Russians no longer ask that atomic weapons be destroyed. They no longer ask that an international ban on nuclear weapons be the starting point of disarmament.

The United States has admitted there can be no such thing as a full-pledged system of inspection of nuclear weapons.

Also, both sides have reached a firm measure of potential agreement in that the atomic energy developed by the communist world is 1,500,000 tons for Russia and the United States of 100,000 tons each for Britain and France.

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Three Killed, Ten Hurt by Shell's Burst

EL PASO, TEX., Aug. 29 (AP)—An artillery shell exploded in the midst of a group of children gathered around a small fire last night, killing three of them and injuring 10 others, some critically.

Zelma Morales, 4, was dead on arrival at El Paso general hospital. Her children, George Valdez, 5, and Ricardo Lujan, 10, died shortly after reaching the hospital.

Doctors would not save the life of another child—Ramon Ramirez, 5, and an adult, Mrs. Tomas Venencia, was believed to have caught a shell fragment in the chest.

Seven other children and 22-year-old Amada Rivera were seriously injured, most of them suffering from burns.

Police said they think the explosive was a 90-millimeter shell which came of the children found on a picnic a few days ago. The 7½-inch army artillery center is located near El Paso and the center has various firing ranges in the area. But it was not known whether the children picked up the shell on one of these ranges.

The group of children and Mrs. Venencia were gathered around a small fire cooking corn outside an apartment building in South El Paso, police said.

One of them apparently rolled the shell into the fire, setting off the blast that knocked out windows and pelted plaster from the walls of the stone apartment building.

Gunman Shot After 4-Hour Police Battle

DETROIT, Aug. 29 (AP)—A berserk gunman who held 200 policemen at bay in a four-hour siege was shot to death last night as he broke through a flaming tear-gas filled house firing a shotgun.

Ten policemen, crouched in the shadows of the next-door house, fired 40 shots at the man, who had dropped from a rear window to make his desperate bid to break through the police line.

Police identified him as Charles Luther Rollins, 44, Leona, Tenn. Papers found on him, including a caption at farmer and exhibit maker.

Two police officers were wounded in the battle watched by a crowd of 5,000 in a northwest Detroit residential district.

Rollins had holed up in the home of Bernard Smith, who was vacationing with his family in Tennessee. Neighbors said he was an uncle of Smith and had lived with him for a time last June.

Schemes Are Offered to Take Salt Content From Salt Water

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Aug. 29 (AP)—The waters of Great Salt Lake could be made fresh by flowing them over the walls of the Grand Canyon, suggests a man in a letter to the state of California.

Another claim said could be removed from sea water by pouring it down a man-made hot spring six miles deep. The earth's heat at that depth, he said, would boil out the salt.

"These are only two of a formidable stack of letters in the files of the state division of water resources. They come from people all over the country who have ideas on how to solve man's dream of making fresh water from salt water.

Theodore Neuman, principal hydraulic engineer, says that although the division itself is not conducting any experiments, it refers all reasonable suggestions to qualified authorities.

However, he said, there is yet no proven method for cheaply producing commercial quantities of fresh water through a de-salting process.

The erroneous impression that California is offering rewards for sea-water-to-fresh-water ideas apparently is widespread.

A Georgia man offered to reveal his secret process if California would pay his fare here.

A San Diego woman asked a "modest compensation" to disclose a system described to her once by a "famous scientist."

From Massachusetts, a man wrote Governor Knight saying he heard there is a million dollars waiting for such an inventor in California.

"I could fill up all the desert of California with fresh water all the year around," he said. "I suggest I be invited to California to discuss it with your engineers."

Some of the writers propose atomic or hydrogen-powered reactors to extract the salt.

One system described is based on osmotic-passing a de-salting liquid through a membrane into a lighter liquid.

Another engineer intimated, using an electric current to move charged minerals in the water through a membrane.

Still others call for freezing or boiling the salt water under extreme pressure or using rapid condensation.

The state makes an attempt to answer most persons who make a suggestion.

Engineers told the man with the Great Salt Lake scheme that it wouldn't work—and that even if it would, the water would have to be pumped over mountains 3,800 feet high.
