(From Page One) man can make \$20 a day in October. But there's a catch. It isn't steady work. Right now, Daniel and his crew are retained between beet thinning and bean picking. There's little to do. And there are other drawbacks. The migrants are in many hotels, restaurants and movie houses. But in Nampa and other towns the small colonies of resident Mexican-Americans do what they can to help. There are baseball games in Wilbur, week-end Mexican movies in Nampa and Nyssa, Ore., an an-

nual "fiesta" in Twin Falls and Spanish language radio programs in Nampa, Caldwell and Ontario, Ore. Santo Rodrigues, a Nampa resident, puts on a dance each Saturday night, drawing crowds of up to 150. The laborers provide most of the music. Daniel said his crew seldom leaves the camp, unlike most migrants, who drift from farm to farm in search of work. After the potatoes are in, Daniel and his workers will leave for Texas to catch the cotton harvest. In the winter it will be lettuce and spinach picking near Corpus Christi. They expect to be at home less than three months of the year.

Addison C. Beaman and Frank Taylor of the state employment security agency in Boise say there'll be an increase in the number of migrants in Idaho this fall because of especially heavy fruit harvest and increased potato acreage. But in future years they expect a decline because of mechanization. Machines have taken over almost all of Idaho's beet harvest and long-handled hoe developed in eastern Idaho promises to do away with the unpleasant job of weeding and finger-scrubbing in cultivating beets. The employment security agency has the task of estimating the state's farm-labor needs each spring, then arranging to bring in extra manpower from outside the state, giving preference to American nationals.

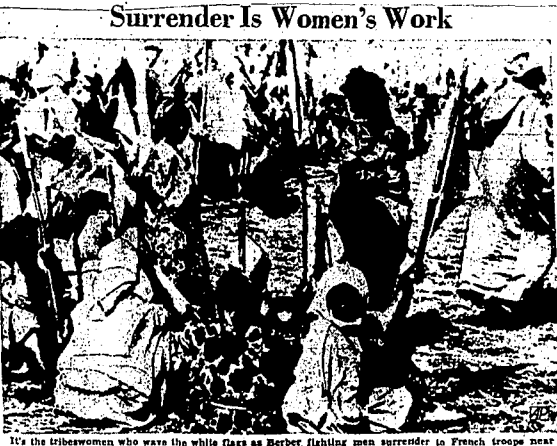

Tightening of Money Loans

Noted in U. S.

NEW YORK, Aug. 11 (AP)—Another round of money tightening is under way. The goal: To slow down the inflation which has proceeded at a rapid rate in the first eight months of the year.

The debt total has been growing in 1954 at an annual rate of almost 30 billion dollars. The federal debt alone has swelled much this year. But state and local government debt, corporate debt, mortgage and consumer debt have been making notable gains.

The money managers have been limiting the supply of money tighter and interest rates rise to discourage the continuance of the rapid rate of debt growth.

Latest moves are:

- Three federal reserve banks—Cleveland, Atlanta and St. Louis—have raised their member banks 2 1/2 per cent on money they lend, the commercial banks for the business and consumer.
- Other nine reserve banks still figure two per cent, but they are expected to be raising this week and next.
- The U. S. treasury is paying more than two per cent on its short-term borrowing for the first time since August, 1953, the previous period of light money that preceded the recent.
