## Boise Forest Blaze Still Uncontrolled; 1,000 Acres Taken



BOISE, Sept. 6 (AP)—The worst fire of the season in Boise national forest continued to rage unchecked this morning, some 15 miles northeast of Boise. By mid-morning, the blaze which was reported yesterday afternoon, had blackened at least 1,000 acres of timber. Despite efforts of 470 firefighters, including 13 smokejumpers, four of the jumpers had gone into the air, the others on the ground. Fire dispatcher Lynn Knight in Boise said 100 additional firefighters were being sent into the area this morning.

They still don't know how he opened the vault and closed it again.

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., Sept. 6 (U.P.)—Four prisoners—overpowered—two guards and escaped from the Fairfield county jail early yesterday but were recaptured a few hours later.

Police said they attacked and bound the guards, then sawed through a door and two windows and ran to a wall. They fled in a car that apparently had been left nearby by an accomplice. The fourth was recaptured yesterday.

All were caught when police surrounded the area.

### Bus Thieves Get Load of Nickels—From Police Safe

LAKE GENEVA, Wis., Sept. 6 (U.P.)—The police station was robbed yesterday of \$200 in nickels collected from parking meters.

Chief Mel Swands said the crooks made off with \$100 in nickels—\$200 of them—collected from parking meters.

The city hall janitor, George Madison, discovered the theft when he noticed the open safe, which hadn't been locked since Saturday.

Neither Swands nor anyone else volunteered any information why no policeman was on duty.

The police descriptions of the thieves: One was tall, the other dark.
