Ike's "Moral Crusade" Hit By Magazine

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15 (AP)—The Democratic Digest yesterday reviewed a series of charges of "unethical" practices by businessmen in government and asked what has happened to President Eisenhower's "moral crusade."

The October issue of the official publication of the Democratic national committee devoted the lead editorial to what is called "Deals and Backers in Washington" and in cases it claimed had "maximized" the Eisenhower administration.

The magazine said the case of Harold E. Talbot, who resigned as secretary of the air force after Senate hearings on his outside business activities, furnished a strong clue to the administration's standards of political conduct.

"At no time during the Talbot affair did the president give any indication that he considered Talbot's action improper. Nor has the president seen anything improper in the deal role of Adolpho Wenzel in the Dixon-Vates deal," the Digest said.

Wenzel, the magazine said, served as "consultant in the budget" at some time during 1954 while at the same time continuing to serve as vice president of the First State Co. bank, which ultimately became the financial agent for Dixon-Vates.

In addition to the Talbot and Dixon-Vates cases, the Digest referred to a \$100,000 deal with the Bussos, a windfall profit deal with a few cheese distributors, at a cost of \$4 million dollars to the American people, and the "mess" in the general services administration as charged by Fortune magazine.

Death on Highway Down 20 Per Cent

BOISE, Sept. 15 (AP)—Idaho's highway fatality record this year is continuing to run at about 20 per cent less than the number of deaths reported between January and September last year, Idaho State Police Lt. J. B. McCall said yesterday.

For this year, McCall reported to Gov. Robert E. Smylie, the Gem state has recorded 120 highway deaths. At the same time last year the state had chalked up 154 fatalities.

Neighboring Utah, which has held Idaho in a traffic safety contest to see which state could show the best improvement, between the two years, appeared to be running a poor second. McCall said the Beehive state so far has recorded 134 deaths, compared to 129 last year.

During all of 1954 there were 209 deaths in Utah and 242 in Idaho.

Change Probe Develops Into Verbal Hassle

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 15 (AP)—A house subcommittee hearing designed to investigate a series of 1954 changes in interior department regulations developed into a verbal free-for-all yesterday as Republicans clashed with Democrats.

The changes in the interior department regulations reportedly were made at the behest of a group of private utility companies in the west.

Almost forgotten yesterday was the Pacific Gas and Electric company, whose lobbying activities in Washington were under official scrutiny.

Subcommittee Chairman R. P. Earl Chudoff, D. Pa., charged that the department was "overly anxious" to secure the views of private power companies in the matter of changing regulations dealing with public utilities.

He said it was shown that most of the changes adopted by the department were used as written by lawyers for several western utilities.

Then the Republican speaker, 80-year-old Rep. Clare Hoffman of Michigan, charged Chudoff with peddling "left wing views." Hoffman said the Democrats were using the hearings for partisan purposes.

Chudoff fired back that earlier sessions in the east and Rocky Mountain area had "demonstrated that the people had been deprived of a power supply by the schemings of the present administration."

The hearings quieted only after much arm-waving, black-crisis, charges and counter-charges.

DETROIT, Sept. 15 (AP)—The 1956 model Ford passenger cars are in production after one of the shortest changeover periods in auto history.

Although numerous styling and engineering changes were made Ford assembly lines were down only a little more than a week after the last 1955 model rolled out. Last week Ford built about 7,500 of the new cars. At full volume it will turn out around 25,000 units weekly.

The change-over shutdown, brief as it was, stopped Ford's production of Chevrolet in the production plant. Through last Saturday Chevrolet had assembled 1,217,983 and Ford 1,186,791 cars this year.

The Chevrolet shutdown for model changeover is yet to come. And all indications are that Ford will put on the biggest production spurt of its history during the final three months of this year.

Huge Battleship Decommissioned

LONDON, Sept. 15 (AP)—The British battleship "Vanguard" which has the heaviest armed vessel will join the mothball fleet, the admiralty announced yesterday.

The announcement said the 43,500-ton vessel "will be maintained at a high state of readiness so that she can be put into active service with a minimum of delay should circumstances so require."

Informed sources said retirement of the huge vessel, with a crew of 1,650, involved a year-long haul during which former Prime Minister Winston Churchill fought to keep the Vanguard at the head of the British fleet.

Average Dips For Butterfat In Herd Tests

With about one out of every six cows dry for about 1,800 cows in 64 herds on test in the Twin Falls County Dairy Improvement Association, the average production is just about 30 pounds of butterfat per cow.

There were only four herds that averaged above 40 pounds, those were in unit No. 2 under the testing group of Frank Thompson, near Falls. The 12 registered Holsteins owned by L. J. Tenckhoff, Twin Falls, averaged 47.4 and B. Wade, near Twin Falls, had an average of 42.8 from nine grade Holsteins. Among the 16 grade cows owned by an even 40 pounds average, were the 20 grade Holsteins, averaged 41.3 and C. L. Johnson and A. M. Smith, with 16 grade cows had an even 40 pounds average.

The high producing cow in this unit for the month was owned by Young's Dairy of Twin Falls. She yielded 94.5 pounds of butterfat from 2,560 pounds of milk which tested 4.2 per cent.

In unit No. 1 under the testing supervision of M. G. Adams, Filer, 47 herds were on test. The average production was 30.4 pounds of milk in this unit, several more than 40 pounds of butterfat but this is the first time in several months that none of the herds averaged over 40 pounds of butterfat. The highest average was 42.8 from nine grade Holsteins owned by Ernest Peterson and Sons, Buhl, with four cows dry and one milking. Charles A.
